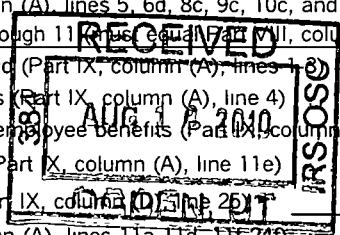

FREEDOM ALLIANCE SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AWARDED TO HELP THE SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF AMERICAN HEROES ACHIEVE A COLLEGE EDUCATION, AND TO HONOR SERVICE MEMBERS WHO HAVE SACRIFICED LIFE OR LIMB FOR OUR NATION. DURING 2009, FREEDOM ALLIANCE AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS TO 201 STUDENTS, ISSUING A TOTAL OF \$912,020 IN SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS. THROUGH 2009, FREEDOM ALLIANCE HAS AWARDED \$3 MILLION IN SCHOLARSHIP ASSISTANCE. EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH ADMINISTERING THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND ARE PAID FROM UNRESTRICTED DONATIONS. IN ADDITION TO THE SCHOLARSHIPS THAT HAVE ALREADY BEEN AWARDED, FREEDOM ALLIANCE HOLDS \$15 MILLION IN A PERMANENT TRUST FUND FOR FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS WHO ARE NOT YET OF COLLEGE AGE.
