In additional to charity and uninsured discounts, CAMC provides assistance with payment plans, government programs, and Employee Assistance Program.

This random telephone survey of Kanawha County residents provides information from our community on community health issues and is used in a county-wide open Community Forum to establish the top three health issues the community will address over the next three-year time frame. The last survey was completed in January 2007 and the Community Forum was held in March 2007 during which obesity, lack of physical activity and tobacco use were identified as the priorites for the next three years. The next survey will take place in 2010. CAMC participates on the Coalition's Steering Committee and oversees the Community Work Groups as they address these priority issues. Additionally, since 2006 the Kanawha Coalition for Community Health Improvement has been the coordinating body for addressing youth risks and interventions in Kanawha County.
