Blanchard Clinic Operations in Haiti: The Family Health Ministries clinic
opened in December of 2006 with a Haitian staff of nine. The clinic has a physician,
nurse, and pharmacist, two public health workers, receptionist, office administrator,
and cleaning staff. They provide care to about 500 patients each month not
counting patients seen by visiting American medical teams. This year
construction was completed on the second floor. This space was used
to expand the cervical cancer prevention program to Blanchard. The
clinic staff was increased by three including 2 nurses and 1 ob/gyn doctor.

Women's Health and Research Activities in Leogane, Haiti: The Leogane Satellite
clinic opened in January, 2009. The new facility supports

cancer screening and treatment. The clinic screened over 5000 women in 2009. FHM's long-term plan is to build the
Leogane Family Health and Research Center which will eventually provide
comprehensive in-patient and out-patient services for women and children.

Fondwa School Education and Nutrition Services: FHM supports and funds the
Sainte Antoine School in Fondwa, Haiti. This school provides education

of 50 orphan children who attend Sainte Antoine School and live in the Fatima House orphanage
FHM does yearly nutritional assessments and provides deworming medication.
They also run an infant/toddler clinic-based nutrition program.

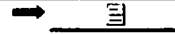
