In order to strengthen clinical initiatives throughout the Methodist Healthcare System, the Methodist Healthcare Foundation awards grants for programs and research projects that fit the mission and goals of Methodist Healthcare The grants provide support for work conducted in areas of most interest, specifically neuroscience, transplant, cancer, patient safety, quality of care and nursing excellence and education. Some of the grants approved by the Methodist Healthcare Foundation Board of Directors in 2009 include -\$2,025 - The effect of Vitagel surgical hemostatic agent on postoperative blood loss and transfusion rates in hip replacement surgery. This project will evaluate the use of a FDA approved hemostatic agent (Vitagel) applied to the surgical site after the hardware has been installed for either a partial or total hip replacement procedure. The investigator wishes to determine if the use of Vitagel will decrease the number of red blood cell transfusions required, thus decreasing hospital costs and reducing patient risk -\$20,093 - Nursing Excellence and Education Evaluation of the Methodist University Hospital Dedicated Education Unit on 9Tower - $\$10,\!400$ -Transoral Robot-Assisted Surgery for Lesions of the Upper Aerodigestive Tract This pilot project will include 40 patients and will assess the feasibility and safety of using the da Vinci Robot to assist in the surgical resection of primary neoplasms in the upper aerodigestive system (head and neck). The Methodist Foundation awards college scholarships to children and dependents of associates who plan to pursue a career in a health-related field of study. In 2009, the Methodist Foundation presented 17 scholarships totaling \$22,500 in scholarships The Methodist Foundation has established the Humanitarian Fund which helps associates in times of an emergency. In 2009, \$480,000 was raised during the Associate Annual Fund Campaign. The majority of those funds assisted associates in times of fire, crime or serious illness of a family member Le Bonheur Foundation The Le Bonheur Foundation EIN 62-1872938 distributed \$60 million in 2009 which was used primarily for the construction of a new Le Bonheur Childrens hospital to open in December 2010 The Le Bonheur Foundation helps families in need by collaborating on many projects including -The Cynthia Milk Fund - This fund helps support more than 400 children who are patients at Le Bonheur Children's Medical Center and almost 250 adults who are seen at the Memphis Health Department This fund provides specialized formulas for needy children as well as therapeutic nutrition and education to elderly citizens throughout our county -The Early Years Institute - This is a community collaborative in Memphis working to improve the health and welfare for children in Shelby County from prenatal to age five The institute identifies and builds initiatives to support systems essential to enable children to be competently nurtured physically, emotionally, and cognitively The Le Bonheur Foundation also funded a number of research projects. The grants funded in 2009 include -\$12,275-Zinc Cluster Transcriptional Pathways Associated with Candida glabrata Azole Tolerance and Resistance-\$10,000-Connecting the dots. The development of an educational program to improve neonatal nurses' knowledge regarding newborn screening in a tertiary level III neonatal intensive care unit -\$12,000-Effect of IgA1-complexes on ACE2 in mesanangial cells (Code) (Expenses \$ including grants of \$) (Revenue \$

Medical Education and ResearchMethodist Le Bonheur Healthcare supports via direct salary and benefit contributions to the University of Tennessee 271 graduate medical training positions (GME) at Methodist University Hospital, Le Bonheur Children's Medical Center, and Germantown Hospital This is an increase of over fifty positions over the past four years due to the growth academic programs at Methodist University Hospital and Le Bonheur Children's Medical Center. In addition, budget constraints at the Regional Medical Center (MED) required moving 13 essential positions from the MED to Methodist University Hospital in July 2009 These GME residents and fellows are employees and trainees at the University of Tennessee, but their financial support for salaries and benefits comes via Methodist. These trainees spend time at a Methodist hospital during the periods of Methodist support and are involved in patient care in addition to educational activities. The total budget of the graduate medical educational programs' support in 2009 via Methodist Healthcare was approximately \$26 5 million In addition to medical training, Methodist also provides support training for our chaplains and training for community clergy and laity to develop their communication skills during their hospital visits Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare is dedicated to advancing health care in the Memphis community. From its beginnings as a project of St. John's United Methodist Church and of Dr. Scott Morris to the comprehensive community resource it is today, the Church Health Center provides affordable health care, dentistry, optometry, pastoral counseling, and health education to those who need these services in Memphis Methodist Healthcare is proud to support this worthy endeavor Methodist helps support the Church Health Center by providing patient care free of charge Methodist gave \$5,000 to the University of Tennessee's Christian Medical and Dental Association, an organization that supports the health needs of the poor Methodist contributed \$25,000 to the Memphis Healthy Common Table, a regional and healthcare improvement collaborative for the Greater Memphis area Le Bonheur Community OutreachLe Bonheur Children's Medical Center's Community Outreach Division EIN 62-1251288 works to extend the work of the hospital beyond its walls.
