This source of contributions is expected to continue to grow in future years, thus, increasing the percentage of support.

- 1. Percentage of financial support factor: The higher the percentage above 10 percent, the lesser is the burden of establishing the publicly supported nature of the organization through other factors. The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation exceeds the 10 percent minimum threshold. The 2009 support is 27.06% and the 2008 support is 23.60%. This is a positive factor.
- Sources of support factor: Receiving support directly or indirectly from a representative number of persons, rather than receiving almost all of its support from the members of a single family is viewed more favorably. The Foundation received support from a large number of independent bottlers in addition to those related through common ownership. In fact, over 90 percent of all Coca-Cola bottling volume participates in the program. In addition, the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation receives contributions from bottlers based upon their sales. In effect, the Foundation derives its support indirectly from purchases by the general public. Therefore, even contributions received from one donor under the related party rules are traceable to purchases by the general public. other words, substantially all of the Foundation's support is derived indirectly from the general public. This is a favorable factor.
- 3. Representative governing body factor: The fact that an organization has a governing body that represents the broad interests of the public rather than the personal or private interest of a limited number of donors will be considered. The Foundation Board consists of nine members. Two are appointed from the Coca-Cola Company, four are elected by the Coca-Cola

Bottlers' Association, and the remaining three have been elected by the bottling community. Additionally, Board members are geographically dispersed, representing 6 different states.

4. Availability of public facilities or services factor: The fact that an organization generally provides services directly for the benefit of the general public on a continuing basis is evidence that the organization is publicly supported. The Foundation clearly provides such services by offering scholarship programs available to all high school seniors attending school in participating bottlers' territories. Beginning in 2000, the Foundation also began offering scholarship programs to persons attending two-year degree granting institutions. In addition to providing one of the nation's largest corporate sponsored scholarship programs, the Foundation eliminates any semblance of private benefit by declaring all children and grandchildren of employees, officers or owners of Coca-Cola Bottling Companies, The Coca-Cola Company, or any bottler or Company divisions or subsidiaries ineligible for consideration.

Each year, 200 Scholars are selected to receive four-year renewable scholarships valued at \$2,500 per year. Also, 51 Scholars receive four-year renewable scholarships valued at \$5,000 per year. Therefore, the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation is allowing over 1000 adolescents the opportunity to attend college each year.
