RESPONSIBILITY THAT THE YMCA TAKES VERY SERIOUSLY.

YMCA YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAMS PROMOTE AN APPRECIATION OF ONE'S OWN WORTH.
YOUTH SPORTS FOCUS ON THE FULL AND EQUAL PARTICIPATION OF ALL: EVERY
CHILD PLAYS IN EVERY GAME. YOUNG PEOPLE PARTICIPATING IN SPORTS BUILD
LIFELONG POSITIVE ATTITUDES, ESTABLISH HABITS OF HEALTHY EXERCISE AND
GOOD NUTRITION, AND LEARN WAYS TO HAVE FUN. BOTH ADULT AND YOUTH
SPORTS PROGRAMS VALUE COOPERATION OVER COMPETITION, FAIR PLAY OVER
WINNING AT ANY COST, GOOD FEELING AND GOOD HEALTH OVER POINTS SCORED,
AND BUILDING SELF-ESTEEM OVER BEATING THE OPPONENT. THE YMCA KNOWS
THAT WITH THIS APPROACH EVERYONE WINS-UNDEFEATED IN SPIRIT, MIND AND
BODY.

DURING THE YEAR, THE YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAMS SERVE CHILDREN IN T-BALL,
GYMNASTICS, SOCCER, BASEBALL, FLAG FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TENNIS,
VOLLEYBALL, HOCKEY, AND IN-LINE SKATING. ADULT SPORTS PROGRAMS INCLUDE

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**BASKETBALL, BASEBALL, VOLLEYBALL, TENNIS, SOFTBALL, RACQUETBALL, AND
FLOOR HOCKEY.**

**THE YMCA OF THE SUNCOAST USES THE SEARCH INSTITUTE'S 40 DEVELOPMENTAL
ASSETS MODEL TO MEASURE THE SUCCESS OF OUR YOUTH AND TEEN PROGRAMS.
THROUGH EXTENSIVE RESEARCH, THE SEARCH INSTITUTE HAS IDENTIFIED 40
POSITIVE EXPERIENCES AND QUALITIES THAT ALL YOUTH AND TEENS NEED TO
BECOME HEALTHY, CONTRIBUTING ADULTS. THE YMCA HELPS TO PROVIDE THESE
ASSETS IN THE LIVES OF THE YOUTH AND TEENS WE SERVE. FOR EXAMPLE, ONE
OF THE ASSETS IS HONESTY. WHEN WE SURVEYED THE PARENTS OF YOUTH IN
CHILD CARE, 99% REPORTED THAT THEY FEEL THE YMCA STAFF CREATE AN
ENVIRONMENT WHERE IT'S IMPORTANT FOR THEIR CHILD TO TELL THE TRUTH,
EVEN WHEN IT'S NOT EASY. RESPECT IS ANOTHER OF THE ASSETS; 100% OF
PARENTS FEEL THE YMCA STAFF CREATE AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE IT IS IMPORTANT
TO RESPECT OTHERS.**

**IN 2009, THE YMCA OF THE SUNCOAST SERVED OVER 9,000 TEENS IN A VARIETY
OF PROGRAMS. YMCA YOUTH AND TEEN PROGRAMS GIVE KIDS POSITIVE ROLE
MODELS TO HELP THEM DEVELOP SELF-ESTEEM AND GOOD VALUES, INCLUDING
COOPERATION, RESPECT FOR THE BODY, GOOD CITIZENSHIP, AND A STRONG WORK
ETHIC. TEEN ACTIVITIES ARE AMONG THE MOST RAPIDLY GROWING YMCA
PROGRAMS, REFLECTING THE GROWING AWARENESS THAT ADOLESCENTS NEED
STRUCTURE AND ACTIVITIES, ESPECIALLY IN THE AFTER-SCHOOL HOURS.**

**THE YMCA YOUTH IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAM SERVED 165 STUDENTS FROM THREE
HIGH SCHOOLS IN PINELLAS COUNTY. THESE STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN THE**

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STATE CONFERENCE IN TALLAHASSEE. AT THE STATE CONFERENCE, MEMBERS OF
THE SUNCOAST YMCA DELEGATION WON MANY AWARDS, INCLUDING THOSE FOR BILL
WRITING, JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS, DEBATING AND GOVERNOR.

WE CONTINUE TO HAVE POPULAR TEEN CENTERS AT OUR CLEARWATER, HIGH POINT,
GREATER RIDGECREST, NORTH PINELLAS, HERNANDO COUNTY, JAMES P. GILLS
FAMILY AND GREATER PALM HARBOR BRANCHES. WE CONTINUE TO SERVE TEENS
WELL AND LOOK TO FIND MORE WAYS TO ENGAGE TEENS IN YMCA PROGRAMS.

THE GREATER RIDGECREST BRANCH SERVED TEENS THROUGH "BRENDA'S KIDS," A
GROUP OF YOUNG TEENS GATHERED IN HONOR OF A MOTHER WHO LOST HER SON TO
VIOLENCE. NOW, THIS GROUP OF TEENS MEETS AT THE YMCA TO LEARN LIFE
LESSONS FROM BIBLICAL TEACHINGS ABOUT RESPONSIBILITY, LEADERSHIP,
ACCOUNTABILITY, AND COMMUNITY SERVICE. OVER 150 YOUTH WERE SERVED IN
THIS PROGRAM DURING 2009.

DEVELOPED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH LEADERSHIP PINELLAS, THE YOUTH LEADERSHIP
PINELLAS PROGRAM SEEKS TO PROVIDE INFORMATION ON COMMUNITY RESOURCES
AND ISSUES, DEVELOP AN EXCELLENCE IN LEADERSHIP, BUILD TEAMWORK SKILLS,
AND FOSTER INVOLVEMENT IN COMMUNITY SERVICES FOR A DIVERSE GROUP OF
HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. DIALOGUE IS CREATED BETWEEN ESTABLISHED AND
POTENTIAL LEADERS OF DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS, INCLUDING BUSINESS AND
PROFESSIONAL PERSONS, PLUS LEADERS OF GOVERNMENT, EDUCATION, ETC.

PHYSICALLY ACTIVE LIFESTYLE THROUGH PROGRAMS LIKE CHILD CARE, SUMMER
DAY CAMP, SWIM LESSONS AND YOUTH SPORTS. TO SUPPORT THESE PROGRAMMATIC
EFFORTS, THE YMCA OF THE SUNCOAST CONTINUED ITS EFFORTS AS A PIONEER
FOR OTHER YMCAS IN LEADING THE YMCA OF THE USA ACTIVATE AMERICA
INITIATIVES. USING AN EXPERIMENTAL FEEDBACK COLLECTION EFFORT, THE
YMCA ENGAGED PARENTS OF CHILDREN IN FOUR YMCA AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS IN
A YEAR-LONG EFFORT TO PROVIDE MONTHLY FEEDBACK REVOLVING AROUND YMCA
IMPROVEMENT EFFORTS. THE AREAS MEASURED INCLUDED PHYSICAL ACTIVITY FOR
CHILDREN, HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN STAFF MEMBERS AND CHILDREN,
STRONGER RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN STAFF AND PARENTS, AND GROWING
CONNECTIONS AMONG FAMILIES. ADDITIONALLY, THE YMCA SOUGHT FOR THE
FIRST TIME TO MEASURE THE IMPACT OF ITS PROGRAMS UPON FAMILIES' TIME
TOGETHER, COMMITMENT TO EATING HEALTHY, COMMITMENT TO BEING PHYSICALLY
ACTIVE, AND RELATIONSHIPS WITH OTHER FAMILIES. ALL OF THIS DATA WILL
BE USED AS GROUNDWORK FOR FUTURE EFFORTS TO BUILD HEALTH AND WELLNESS
THROUGH PROGRAMS THAT SERVE FAMILIES. WE HAVE ALSO SPREAD THIS
COLLABORATIVE WORK TO MANY MORE SCHOOL SITES THAT ARE SHOWING SIMILAR
SUCCESS MEASURES.

FOR ADULTS THE YMCA HAS CONTINUED TO FOCUS ON THE NEEDS OF THE PERSONS

THE YMCA CONTINUES TO OFFER A HOST OF PROGRAMS FOR ADULTS INCLUDING
SWIMMING GROUPS, WALKING CLUBS, RUNNING CLUBS, YOGA, PILATES, STRESS
MANAGEMENT, PERSONAL TRAINING, GROUP EXERCISE, OLDER ADULT PROGRAMMING,
STRENGTH TRAINING, AND MUCH MORE. WITH ITS COMMITMENT TO NEVER TURNING
A PERSON OR FAMILY AWAY BECAUSE OF AN INABILITY TO PAY FOR SERVICES,

LEADERSHIP. THESE PROGRAMS ARE OFFERED AT FEES AFFORDABLE TO THE
COMMUNITY AT LARGE, WITH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THOSE WHO CAN'T

THE YMCA TAUGHT OVER 2,700 PEOPLE TO SWIM IN POOLS LOCATED IN CITRUS,
HERNANDO, PASCO AND PINELLAS COUNTIES IN 2009. DROWNING IS THE
SECOND-LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH IN CHILDREN IN THIS COMMUNITY. WE FEEL
LEARNING TO SWIM IS A NECESSITY, NOT A LUXURY. LEARN-TO-SWIM LESSONS
ARE CONDUCTED DAILY THROUGHOUT THE YEAR FOR INFANTS FROM 6 MONTHS OLD
TO ADULTS.

IN YMCA AQUATICS PROGRAMS, CHILDREN LEARN TO BE SAFE AROUND WATER AND
THEY FEEL THE SENSE OF ACCOMPLISHMENT THAT COMES WITH LEARNING
SOMETHING NEW. YOUTH PROGRESSIVE SWIMMING IS THE YMCA'S THIRD MOST
WIDELY OFFERED PROGRAM NATIONWIDE. IT USES A PROBLEM-SOLVING,
GUIDED-DISCOVERY TEACHING APPROACH IN A POSITIVE, CARING ENVIRONMENT.
KIDS CAN DEVELOP LIFELONG SKILLS THAT CAN HELP THEM STAY SAFE AND
HEALTHY.

CLASSES AND PROGRAMS ARE PROVIDED TO HELP ELDERLY PEOPLE MAINTAIN THEIR
SELF-SUFFICIENCY AND INDEPENDENCE BY MAINTAINING A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE.
THE ARTHRITIS AND WATER EXERCISE CLASSES ARE DESIGNED ESPECIALLY FOR
SENIORS TO MAINTAIN MUSCLE TONE AND FLEXIBILITY USING THE WATER TO

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CUSHION THE JOINTS. IN ADDITION TO ENHANCING MOTOR FUNCTION, THESE

AVAILABLE. STAFF IS TRAINED TO ACCOMMODATE INDIVIDUAL NEEDS. SPECIAL
POPULATION CLIENTS ARE INTERVIEWED INDIVIDUALLY AND MATCHED WITH A
COMPATIBLE STAFF PERSON. AS CLIENTS PROGRESS WITH THEIR PHYSICAL
STRENGTHENING, THEIR PROGRAMS ARE CHANGED TO SUIT THEIR NEEDS. THIS
MAY INCLUDE ACTUAL SWIMMING INSTRUCTION, SURVIVAL TECHNIQUES IN WATER,
WALKING, NAUTILUS, ETC. THIS PROGRAM IS ONGOING AND YEAR-ROUND. NOT
ONLY DOES IT GIVE THEM POSITIVE EXPERIENCES, IT STRENGTHENS THEM
PHYSICALLY AND ALLOWS THEM TO SOCIALIZE WITH OTHERS IN A CARING
ATMOSPHERE.

YMCA POOLS ARE ALSO USED FOR SCUBA PROGRAMS, PRIVATE SWIM LESSONS, SWIM
TEAMS, AND LIFEGUARD TRAINING CLASSES. THE YMCA CONTINUES TO PROVIDE
POOLS FOR AREA HIGH SCHOOL SWIM TEAMS.

THE YMCA OF THE SUNCOAST HAS ESTABLISHED FAMILY AQUATIC CENTERS AT OUR
HIGH POINT, JAMES P. GILLS FAMILY, GREATER RIDGECREST, AND GREATER PALM
HARBOR FACILITIES. THESE CENTERS FEATURE SLIDES, A ZERO-DEPTH ENTRY,
AND INTERACTIVE DESIGN WITH FOUNTAINS, SPRAYS AND ACTIVITIES. POOLS
ARE ALSO LOCATED AT OUR CLEARWATER, NORTH PINELLAS AND HERNANDO COUNTY
YMCA BRANCHES.

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SUBSIDIES VALUED AT NEARLY \$9,300 WERE PROVIDED TO OVER 330 CHILDREN
AND ADULTS IN SWIMMING CLASSES DURING THE YEAR.

THE YMCA WORKS HARD TO CONTINUOUSLY MEET COMMUNITY NEEDS AND MAKE OUR
PROGRAMS AND SERVICES AVAILABLE TO EVERYONE. THROUGH OUR MISSION OF
DEVELOPING HEALTHY SPIRIT, MIND AND BODY FOR ALL, WE SERVE PEOPLE OF

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HEALTHIER LIVES. THIS NATIONWIDE PROGRAM WAS HIGHLIGHTED DURING YMCA
HEALTHY KIDS' DAY ON SATURDAY, APRIL 18, 2009 IN CITRUS, HERNANDO,
PASCO, AND PINELLAS COUNTIES. YMCA HEALTHY KIDS DAY INVITES CHILDREN
AND FAMILIES TO ENGAGE IN A DAY OF FUN AND GAMES TO PROMOTE HEALTHY
INTERACTION AND FUN. WE PRESENTED THE YMCA HEALTHY FAMILY HOME KITS TO
THOUSANDS OF COMMUNITY MEMBERS, ENCOURAGING SMALL STEPS TOWARD
HEALTHIER LIFESTYLES.

HEALTHY FAMILY HOME PROVIDES FAMILIES WITH PRACTICAL, FLEXIBLE TOOLS
AND SUPPORT FOR MAKING LASTING CHANGES FOR A HEALTHIER, HAPPIER LIFE.
ACTIONS AIMED AT THE WHOLE FAMILY THAT LEAD TO SMALL, SUSTAINED
CHANGES-LIKE EATING BETTER, GETTING EXERCISE AND CONNECTING AS A
FAMILY-ARE PROVEN TO HAVE A LONG-TERM IMPACT.

KIDS WHO EAT WITH THEIR FAMILY END UP MAKING HEALTHIER SNACK CHOICES.

2) SNEAK IN MORE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY. PLAN A WEEKLY FAMILY BREAKFAST
WHERE YOU ARE THE TRANSPORTATION. SKIP THE CAR, BUS OR TRAIN AND RIDE

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BIKES, WALK OR JOG/RUN.

3) GET MORE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES IN YOUR DIET. HAVE ALL FAMILY
MEMBERS IDENTIFY THEIR FAVORITE FRUIT AND WRITE EACH ONE DOWN ON A
LIST. THEN FILL A FAMILY FRUIT BOWL WITH THOSE FRUITS AND KEEP IT ON
THE COUNTER. THIS WAY EVERYONE IN THE FAMILY WILL HAVE EASY ACCESS TO
THEIR FAVORITE FRUIT WHEN THEY'RE LOOKING FOR A SNACK.

4) MAKE GETTING EXERCISE FUN. TURN UP THE MUSIC AND DO CHORES TOGETHER
(CLEAN THE HOUSE, WASH WINDOWS, DO LAUNDRY, ETC.).

WITH THESE SMALL DAILY CHANGES, WE CAN HELP FAMILIES CREATE HEALTHIER
HOME ENVIRONMENTS, HEALTHIER HABITS, AND HEALTHIER BONDS IN SPIRIT,



**AMENDED AND RESTATED
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION**

OF

YMCA OF THE SUNCOAST, INC.

Pursuant to Section 617.1006 and 617.1007, Florida Statutes, the undersigned as the Secretary of YMCA of the Suncoast, Inc., hereby certifies that the Articles of Incorporation shall be amended by these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation provided for herein, which were adopted by the Board of Directors on the 30 day of April, 2009, and the number of votes cast for these amendments was sufficient for approval. The Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation does not contain any amendments requiring member approval.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the Corporation shall be YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION OF THE SUNCOAST, INC.

ARTICLE II

Duration

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE III

Purposes

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are activities exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") as follows:

3.1 To develop, establish and administer a Young Men's Christian Association for Pinellas, Pasco, Hernando and Citrus Counties, Florida.

3.2 Solely for the above purposes, the Corporation is empowered to exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida upon corporations not for profit, including but without limitation thereon, the power to contract for the management of housing; to sell, lease, mortgage and otherwise deal in real and personal property; to borrow money and to issue evidence of indebtedness therefore; to receive gifts, bequests and contributions in any form, to use, apply, invest and reinvest the principal and/or income therefrom or distribute the same for the above purposes.

ARTICLE IV

Members

The Corporation may have members, but members shall be non-voting only. The Bylaws of the Corporation shall govern all aspects of membership, including but not limited to

admission and termination of members, qualification of members, and the rights and duties of members

ARTICLE V

Influencing Legislation

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be devoted to attempting to influence legislation by propaganda or otherwise, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements with respect to) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE VI

ARTICLE VII

Directors

The management of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number of directors constituting the Board of Directors shall be as prescribed by the Bylaws of the Corporation, but shall not be less than fifteen (15). The qualifications, term of office, and manner of election and termination of directors shall be as prescribed by the Bylaws of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

Limitations

The Corporation shall have no capital stock and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure in whole or in part to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any officer, director, or other individual having a personal or private interest in the activities of the Corporation, or to any person or organization other than an organization which is exempt from federal income taxation under Sections 501(a) and 501(c) of the Code, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, to make reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred on its behalf, and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes stated in Article III.

ARTICLE IX
Distributions Upon Dissolution

In the event of dissolution, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation, and returning, transferring or conveying all assets held by the Corporation upon condition requiring return, transfer or conveyance, the remaining assets of the Corporation shall be distributed at the discretion of the directors to any nonprofit organization of this state, provided that the purposes of such organization are not inconsistent with those stated in Article III of these Articles of Incorporation. And further provided that said organization qualifies as a charitable, religious or educational organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and has been recognized as exempt from federal income taxes by the Internal Revenue Service.

ARTICLE X
Indemnification

Each director or former director of the Corporation may be indemnified and may be advanced reasonable expenses by the Corporation against any liabilities imposed upon him or her and reasonable expenses incurred him or her in connection with any claim against him or her, or, any action, suit or proceeding to which he or she may be a party by reason of his or her being, or having been such director and against such sum as independent counsel selected by the directors shall deem reasonable payment made in settlement of any such claim, action, suit or proceeding primarily with the view of avoiding expenses of litigation; provided, however, that no director or officer shall be indemnified: a) with respect to matters as to which he or she shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law by such director; or b) with respect to matters as to which he or she shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be transactions that such director personally received a benefit in money, property or services to which the director was not legally entitled. Such rights of indemnification shall be in addition to any other rights to which directors may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, corporate resolutions, vote of directors or otherwise. The Corporation shall have the power to purchase or maintain, at its cost and expense, insurance on behalf of such persons to the fullest extent permitted by this Article and applicable state law


ARTICLE XI
