Neonatal intensive care unitMore than 1,000 critically ill and premature infants require specialized care in the NICU at Kosair Children's Hospital each year. These children come from throughout Kentucky and Southern Indiana, many via the "Just For Kids" Transport Team. Studies have shown the benefits of a developmental care model, which combines caregiver training and personalized attention with the family's complete involvement in the baby's care, encouraging frequent touch and contact between the baby, family members and hospital caregivers. This model contributes to decreased infant mortality rates as well as the average length of the infant's hospital stay. Babies experience less stress, spend less time on ventilators and have fewer brain hemorrhages, eyesight problems and chronic lung diseases when cared for with this approach. To increase the number of infants who benefit from this care model, the Children's Hospital Foundation completed Phase II which was the addition of 10 beds in the NICU. Phase III of the NICU renovation was partially completed in 2009 with the completion of the Family Education Center Some of the other larger capital projects in 2009 included. * Support for the new Kosair Children's Medical Center. Brownsboro, which opened in May 2010 to expand specialty pediatric care in Louisville. * A renovated and expanded imaging center and sedation area, which opened in fall 2008 and includes two new child-friendly, state-of-the-art MRI units. The project was completed in 2009. * A new interventional radiology suite for delivery of minimally invasive treatments using catheters aided by CT, X-ray or ultrasound. Inverventional radiology takes the place of surgery for procedures such as biopsies and placing shunts, feeding and draining tubes, and peripherally inserted central catheters (PIC

The consultants reviewed sources of comparability data and market movement comparisons. NHI's variable compensation program was reviewed along with benchmark comparisons. Based on the recommendations of IHS, Employment Contracts for the CEO, COO and CFO were subsequently completed and approved by the Board. The Executive Committee also reviewed and approved all key employee compensation based on the third-party report furnished and discussed with committee members, and subsequently approved by the Board.
