Community Outreach and Engagement

The Foundation's programs are designed to provide opportunities to identify and reach out to underserved populations throughout the state of Mississippi by encouraging those closest to the problems and issues to actively assist the Foundation in targeting its resources and programs to achieve the best and most effective result. The Foundation's Director of Programs allocates approximately 25% of his time on the following community outreach and engagement activities:

- 1. Working with regional nonprofits such as the Southeastern Council on Foundations to plan and implement conferences and training programs for charitable organizations.
- 2. Organizing and developing the Mississippi Association of Grantmakers that will work to increase philanthropy and its effectiveness throughout the state of Mississippi.
- 3. Serving as a lead trainer in workshops and seminars offered by the Mississippi Center for Nonprofits to other charitable organizations and government agencies throughout Mississippi.
- 4. Providing technical assistance to Mississippi nonprofit networks and agencies via telephone and electronic inquiries and responses.
- 5. Providing one-on-one training to Mississippi nonprofit personnel in the areas of fundraising, grant writing and board development.
- 6. Serving as a resource contact for nonprofit leaders throughout the region (including Mississippi) that is served by the Foundation.

Page 7, Part IX-B, Summary of Program-Related Investments

1. Origin of Nonprofit Fundraising Program

One of the Maddox Foundation's objectives in acquiring and operating the RiverKings hockey team as a program-related investment was to lessen the burden of government (DeSoto County, MS) by ensuring the retention of the team as an anchor tenant for the DeSoto Civic Center. The study commissioned by DeSoto County that led to the construction of the Civic Center stated that the attraction and retention of a professional sports team, particularly a hockey team, was critical to the economic viability of the Civic Center. The Civic Center remains financially dependent upon the retention of the RiverKings hockey team and on the community's involvement in and support of the teams.

From the outset, however, Maddox Foundation also worked to ensure that its program-related investments would benefit the larger community because Maddox Hockey would be operated as a viable and unique charitable asset for the northwest Mississippi region. The Foundation's vision is that the entire operation of the sports teams, including their management, coaches and players, season ticket holders, sponsors and fans, directly or indirectly will, as a part of facilitating the program-related investment, support the charitable purposes of the Foundation to the maximum extent possible.

Accordingly, the Foundation has used the RiverKings to (1) promote the expansion of programs providing educational and recreational opportunities for young people in the community, by linking the teams to programs supporting local schools and expanding recreational programs that serve the community's young people: and (2) establish an alternative community investment program designed to improve the viability and impact of nonprofit and charitable organizations in the region by engaging the entire organization (both management and team personnel) in charitable activities serving and building the local communities.

New Educational and Recreational Programs: The Foundation uses the operations of the hockey team as an unprecedented opportunity for engaging the entire team operations in developing expanded volunteer efforts and financial resources for the region's nonprofit organizations. Ownership and operation of the sports team as a program related investment gives the Foundation unique opportunities to create and expand programs in its traditional areas of interest, education and services to youth, including the following:

(River) Kings of the Classroom: Through this initiative, Maddox Hockey provides complimentary ticket vouchers for RiverKings games to students, based on student achievement during each grading period, or on state-mandated tests. Schools are free to design their own incentive programs using ticket vouchers to reward student achievement.

<u>Newspapers in Education</u>: The RiverKings sponsor the delivery of newspapers to hundreds of classrooms through the national Newspapers in Education Program. The program includes the distribution of education materials and player appearances in classrooms to promote reading and educational enrichment activities for thousands of students in the region.

<u>Face Off Field Trip</u>: Since 2003, the RiverKings have scheduled one home game for a morning start and brought thousands of mostly elementary school students, sponsored by local charities and corporations, to a regularly scheduled professional hockey game. This event annually draws 6,000 to 8,000 students from the entire region, including parts of Tennessee and Arkansas. Educational activities are interwoven into the game's breaks in action and public address announcements, and a workbook distributed to the students gives teachers the opportunity to reinforce lessons when they return to the classroom.

Youth Sports Programs: The Foundation, through funding of Hernando Youth Sports, has supported the development of an in-line roller hockey arena at the Hernando Civic Center property. RiverKings players serve as coaches for a summer youth roller hockey league (Jr. StreetKings), which instructs young people in sportsmanship as well as the sport itself. The players also serve as coaches for winter youth hockey leagues and/or clinics (Jr. RiverKings) that are operated at the DeSoto Civic Center.

<u>Community Investment Program</u>: The community investment program began immediately following the acquisition of the RiverKings, beginning with the 2002-2003 season in mid-October of 2002 and has continued in subsequent seasons, and includes the following programs and activities:

<u>Ticket Fundraising Program</u>: Nonprofits can receive tickets on consignment, sell them for face value, and retain a percentage of the ticket price for their organization.

Nonprofit Spotlight Program: Nonprofit organizations can raise awareness and funds for their programs by being "spotlighted" during RiverKings games, which includes pre-game and post-game press releases prepared by the RiverKings staff, recognition on public address announcements, the opportunity to place an informational booth in the arena concourse, the opportunity to be featured on the live radio broadcast of the game and the ability to conduct a silent auction or raffle that may include donated RiverKings merchandise. Multiple organizations can participate at each game, limited only by space available in the concourse. "Featured" nonprofits also have a representative make the ceremonial puck drop before the game.

The RiverKings can also focus community attention on and support the work of nonprofit organizations through on-ice and game-related events. For instance, the team has awarded a wish to terminally-ill children through the Make-a-Wish Foundation on at least three occasions. The team periodically conducts post-game open skates where all the revenue raised goes to local nonprofit organizations. Representatives from local nonprofit organizations have sung the National Anthem prior to RiverKings games for additional exposure for those groups. The team regularly conducts locker room tours for children from area hospitals. The Mississippi National Guard swore in a group of recruits at center ice at one game; the team also organizes recognition for veterans' groups on Veterans Day.

<u>Player Appearances</u>: RiverKings personnel and players, including the team mascots, make personal appearances at charitable functions and fundraising events such as golf tournaments, and conduct visits to schools, nursing homes and other nonprofit organizations. The range of activities attended includes school assemblies, hockey clinics, distributing hockey equipment to school physical education classes ("Sticks for Kids" program), reading in classrooms and libraries, and corporate sponsored events. RiverKings players regularly make trips to hospitals to visit sick children; some players have developed long-term relationships with such children and their families.

2. Charitable Purposes of this Program

Traditionally, private foundations simply make grants to other organizations or individuals for charitable purposes. Most of these grants are to help pay the costs of operating programs or purchasing equipment or other capital assets. Relatively few private foundations make grants that are designed to increase the abilities of the grantees to expand their base of financial or volunteer support. And even fewer still have done what the Foundation has done with the hockey team—use the hockey team as a means for the community's charitable organizations to expand their financial and volunteer support through an activity that is fun for the participants. Better results for charities are obtained from activities that are fun than those that are depressing or disheartening, such as disseminating information about the incidence of cancer or stroke. The Foundation has employed this truth about fund-raising to benefit dozens of local charities in multiple ways.

The Foundation believes strongly in increasing the ability of nonprofit organizations to serve people and communities through the programs that they operate. Charities have similar needs. One of the most critical, especially in a state such as Mississippi that is lacking in organized philanthropic resources, is the need to generate funds necessary to sustain program operations. Too many nonprofits, regardless of their size or sophistication, waste time and money on fund raising events or schemes that require immense investments of volunteer time and often up-front expenses to generate small or moderate returns for the nonprofit. The RiverKings' <u>Ticket Fundraising Program</u> allows nonprofit organizations to raise substantial sums with no risk and with relatively little investment of time or resources. Although the Ticket Fundraising Program and the other elements of the Community Involvement Program

may be unconventional, they have a proven track record of generating substantial financial and developmental benefits for the community generally and for the community's charitable organizations in particular.

The <u>Ticket Fundraising Program</u> also allows nonprofits to build their capacity in two other essential areas, volunteer development and public awareness. The best way for a nonprofit organization to generate a large number of ticket sales in the program is to mobilize its constituents in volunteer efforts to promote the fundraising event. By reaching out into the larger community, the nonprofit organization can increase awareness about its programs and work. Nonprofits participating in the Ticket Fundraising Program can also take advantage of other aspects of the RiverKings community investment program, for instance, by scheduling player appearances to help promote ticket sales and focusing community awareness on the work of the nonprofit.

Since 2002, hundreds of nonprofit organizations have raised hundreds of thousands of dollars in funds, increased their volunteer base, and improved community awareness of their work through the <u>Ticket Fundraising Program</u> and other aspects of the RiverKings Community Investment Program. It also serves as a point of entry for many nonprofits to become involved in other aspects of Maddox Hockey's Community Investment Program, such as Face Off Field Trip and Player Appearances.
