CHARTER

BE IT KNOWN. That on this Thirtieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty;

BEFORE ME, JOHN L. TOLER, A Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified in and for said Parish and State, therein residing and in presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned:

PERSONALLY CAME AND APPEARED,

The undersigned residents of the State of Louisiana and subscribers hereto, who declare that they do hereby voluntarily associate themselves together for the purposes of organizing and forming a non-trading corporation under the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana and particularly under Act 254 of 1914, as amended, which corporation is not designed to engage in trade or in the exploitation of property rights, or credits for profit or financial gain with all the right powers, privileges, benefits and immunities given or permitted corporations so formed, and for that purpose adopt these Articles of Incorporation.

Article I

The name of this Corporation shall be: Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Incorporated. Its domicile shall be the City of Baton Rouge, Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana. This Corporation shall exist and continue until same is dissolved.

Article II

This Corporation is formed for the following purpose or purposes, to wit: To restore, preserve, develop, and increase the birds, fish, game, forestry, wild flowers and all other wild life resources of the State of Louisiana extending to and including all matters and things which in the judgement of the Board of Directors, or of members of this Corporation, may assist or encourage the advancement of the prosperity and progress of this State or any portion thereof, but not to include for its purpose or purposes the engaging in trade or the exploitation of property, rights, or credits for profit or financial gain.

This Corporation shall be operated exclusively for scientific and educational purposes, and no part of the earnings shall inure to the benefit of any share-holder or individual. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall ever be devoted to influencing legislation, and this Corporation shall never participate in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Upon dissolution, the assets of this Corporation shall belong to and shall be delivered to the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries of the State of Louisiana or to its successor in function, to be used by it to carry on the scientific and educational purposes of this Corporation. It is the intention of the enumeration of purposes herein to qualify this Corporation as a tax-exempt Corporation within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

(Page A)

Article III

The Corporation shall have the following powers: 1.) To accept donations to be used for the purpose or the purposes of its formation; to do each and everything necessary, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated; and, in general to have and exercise all the powers, privileges, and rights now or hereafter authorized or allowed non-trading corporations under the laws of the State of Louisiana; 2.) To sue and be sued; to buy, acquire, hold, own, lease, give as security, sell and otherwise dispose of, and exercise all privileges of ownership over real and personal property of any character, as may be deemed necessary or desirable for the conduct of the business of the corporation or incidental thereto.

Article IV

The officers and managers, who shall contract and manage the affairs of this Corporation, shall be a President, a 1st Vice-President, a 2nd Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer and such other officers (all as provided in the By-Laws) as may be deemed necessary for the proper administration of the affairs of the corporation. The By-Laws of the corporation shall fix the rights, powers, and duties of the respective officers. Citation may be served on the President or on the Secretary.

The first officers of this Corporation shall be as follows:

Fred J. McCormac, whose address is Room 1025 Whitney Building, New Orleans, LA., shall be President.

Henry E. Cabaud, Jr., whose address is 608 Whitney Building, New Orleans, LA., shall be Vice-President.

Paul McIlhenny, whose address is P.O. Box 1100, New Orleans, LA., shall be Secretary-Treasurer.

The Offices of Secretary-Treasurer are combined in one office until changed by the By-Laws.

Article V

The amount of dues and the kind and the class of membership shall be as provided in the By-Laws.

Article VI

The management of the business and conduct of the affairs of the corporation and the election of its Board of Directors shall be as provided in the By-Laws. This Charter or these By-Laws may be amended as follows: Not less than sixty days prior to the Annual Convention, amendments may be proposed by any member of the Board of Directors by filing the same in writing with the executive director or in his absence the secretary. The executive director shall, not less than 40 days prior to the annual convention, transmit copies of the proposed amendment(s) to each member of the Board of Directors, and to the president and secretary of each association. At the annual convention the proposed amendment(s) shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval. The amendment(s) approved by the Board of Directors then shall be submitted to the open forum (Congress). If approved by a majority of the Congress the amendment(s) shall become a part of the Charter and By-Laws. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than fifteen (15) members

and not more than three hundred and twenty (320) members. Their eligibility, manner of election, term of office, and apportionment among the different parishes and congressional districts of Louisiana shall be as provided from time to time in the By-Laws of this Corporation. The First Board of Directors shall consist of twenty-seven (27) members. Directors may vote by written proxy as prescribed in the By-Laws.

Article VII

LOUISIANA WILDLIFE FEDERATION, INC. - BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

DEFINITIONS

SECTION 1. As used in this part:

(1) Federation shall mean the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Incorporated;

(2) Association shall mean local units, clubs or chapters of sportsmen's leagues, conservation clubs, wildlife protective leagues, and other groups, incorporated or unincorporated, that are affiliated with the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc.;

(3) Affiliate means any affiliated association that annually applies for affiliation on forms provided by the Federation and remits the required amount of annual dues;

(4) State Director means a director of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc.;

(5) Contributing Member means any person, business, or corporation who subscribes to the goals and objectives of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc. and contributes the sum of Fifteen (15) Dollars or more annually to the Federation in exchange for an annual membership;

(6) Federation Member is any person who is a member of an association that is an affiliate with the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc. or any contributing member or any past president or honorary member of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc.;

(7) Congress shall mean the open forum (General Assembly of Delegates) at the Federation's annual convention where final action is taken on conservation policy resolutions, proposed amendments to the by-laws and other business of the organization.

ARTICLE II

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. Each Federation Past President shall be a Life Member of the Board of Directors who may vote when personally present at any board meeting.

SECTION 2a. One State Director shall be elected by a majority of the members voting from each Affiliate having a minimum of fifteen (15) members. Each Affiliate has the option of electing one additional State Director for each additional one hundred (100) members in excess of fifteen (15) members, but no Affiliate shall have more than five (5) State Directors. Affiliates designating more than one State Director must submit a list of its membership with names and addresses to the Federation office.

State Directors elected by Affiliates may be any member in good standing of their associations. The number of State Directors each Affiliate is eligible to elect shall be based on membership as of December 31st of the year prior for which they serve, or on the current membership, whichever is greater.

SECTION 2b. In addition to the State Directors designated pursuant to the provisions of Section 2a. and 2c., eighteen (18) State Directors shall be elected to serve on the Federation Board of Directors, two (2) from each Federation district. These directors shall be known as district at-large directors and shall be elected by a majority vote of contributing members residing and voting in their district. A candidate for a district at-large position must have paid contributing member dues for at least two (2) consecutive years prior to commencement of his/her term on January 1st, and must reside or work in the district that he/she will represent. The term of an at-large district director shall run for two (2) years, or until his/her successor is elected.

The Federation Office shall notify contributing members of any forthcoming election of district at-large directors from their district and shall conduct these elections by mailed ballot in November/December of each year, unless postponed by the LWF Executive Committee due to natural disaster or other serious extenuating circumstance affecting the ability of the membership to participate in said elections.

Should there be a district at-large director vacancy, the Board of Directors may appoint a member from the district with the vacancy to fill that vacancy until the next election. Such appointed district at-large director shall serve at the pleasure of the board until the next scheduled election of district at-large directors from that district, and must be current in membership dues payment for the duration of service on the Board.

Section 2c. In addition to the State Directors designated pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2a. and 2b., up to nine (9) At-large State Directors may be appointed by the Board of Directors. The term of an At-large State Director shall be three (3) years. An At-large State Director may serve for up to three (3) terms, but only two (2) terms may be served consecutively. To be eligible to serve as an At-large State Director, said State Director must make a reasonable financial commitment to the Louisiana Wildlife Federation for the duration of the term(s) of service. Additional eligibility requirements may be established by the Board of Directors. Notice of nomination of an At-large State Director must be provided, along with a resume of the nominee, to the members of the Board of Directors 30 days prior to the meeting at which a vote to approve the nominee for At-large State Director status will be held. A simple majority of a quorum of directors present and voting at a regularly scheduled meeting is sufficient to approve an At-large State Director. An At-large State Director may designate any competent person as his/her proxy to vote on questions before the Board when s/he is unable to attend a board meeting.

SECTION 2d. Any Executive Director of the Federation who has served for ten (10) years or more automatically becomes a Board member.

SECTION 3. The term of office of the State Directors shall be concurrent with the fiscal year of the Federation or until their successors are selected.

SECTION 4. The Board of Directors so elected shall, from their members, elect at the annual convention a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers, with the exception of the Treasurer, shall not be allowed to succeed themselves more than once. The members of the Board of Directors from each Federation District shall also elect annually from their members, one District Vice-President. Said election of District Vice-Presidents will be held at the annual convention. Their term of office shall be for one year or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 5. The Board of Directors shall supervise all the affairs, properties, effects and business of the Federation; shall have full and complete power by a majority vote to acquire and/or dispose of property, both real and personal in the name of the Federation. If any member of the Board of Directors should die, resign, or be removed from office before the expiration of his/her term, or should a vacancy occur for any other reason, his/her position shall be filled with a qualified person from the Association or District which he/she represented, to serve the unexpired term. Neither the Board of Directors, nor any officer or member of the Board shall have the right or power to approve expenditures in the name of the federation beyond the sum which is then currently available in the treasury; except the Board of Directors has the authority, through its Executive Committee, to borrow whatever funds necessary, mortgaging real property as collateral, for the purpose of acquiring or expanding a Federation office facility.

SECTION 6. The Board of Directors shall hold regular meetings as follows: at the annual convention; between 15 April and 30 May (Spring meeting); and during the month of September or October (Fall meeting). State Directors, and the president and secretary of each club must be notified at least thirty (30) days prior to regular meetings. Special meetings shall be held whenever called by the president or by a majority of the members of the Board on written notice mailed to the members of the Board at least ten (10) days prior to the proposed meeting stating the place, time and purpose of said meeting. Twenty-five (25) members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. In the event of the inability of a State Director to attend a meeting of the Board of directors he/she may, by written authorization designate a qualified alternate from his/her association (or district in the case of an at-large director) to represent him/her at such meeting. Each State Director in attendance at a Federation State Director's meeting can vote his vote and one proxy of a state director who is not in attendance. Any person that has been elected to represent more than one association on the board of directors may cast as many as but no more than two (2) votes per question.

SECTION 7. The Executive Committee shall consist of 9 members: the current President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, immediate past president, National Wildlife Federation Representative and two additional members elected by and from the Board of Directors. In the event that the immediate past president is also the current president or otherwise continues to serve as an officer and/or the NWF delegate is also serving as an officer, up to 4 additional members shall be elected by and from the Board of Directors to fill out the 9-member committee. The term of office of the members of the Executive Committee shall coincide with the term of office of the officers of the Federation. The members at-large shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the board meeting the day following the election of officers. The powers of the Executive Committee shall be the same as the powers of the Board of Directors but shall be limited to action on emergency matters on which decision cannot be deferred until the time of the next meeting of the Board of Directors. All action taken by this committee will be reported at the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 8. The State Board shall have the power, by a two-thirds majority vote, FIRST, to suspend or remove from office any State Director for violation of the By-Laws or of the rules adopted by the State Board; SECOND, to suspend for any cause deemed by the State Board sufficient, any member (whether an Association or an individual) of the Federation; THIRD, to employ or authorize employment of an executive director, fix compensation and prescribe duties, provided there is sufficient money in the Federation's treasury to defray the cost of same for a

period of time to be prescribed by the State Board when, as and if the time arrives that this position is to be filled. The Board may appoint a committee of not more than nine (9) nor less than seven (7) to carry out this third part of Section 8 Article II of these By-Laws, and the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and the Treasurer, shall be members of this committee; FOURTH, to authorize the establishment and discontinuance of membership branches in the various parishes and other subdivisions of the State and to prescribe the conditions under which said branches shall be established and conducted.

SECTION 9. The executive director shall be under the direct control, orders, and direction of the President of the Federation subject to the President's orders and control alone; the President being responsible entirely to the Board of Directors.

SECTION 10. The nomination committee shall be the President and the nine (9) District Vice-Presidents. In the event that one of the District Vice-Presidents is a candidate for an office in the Federation, he/she shall designate one of his/her assistant District Vice-Presidents to serve on the nominating committee in his/her stead. In the event of the absence of the District Vice-President or his/her selected Assistant District Vice-President at the meeting of the Nominating Committee, the President shall appoint a member of the Federation's Board of Directors from that particular District to serve on the Nominating Committee.

The Nominating Committee shall select one of their members, other than the President, to make the nominations at the election to be held at the next meeting of the Federation Board of Directors.

SECTION 11. EMAIL VOTING.

At the discretion of the Federation president or a majority of the Executive Committee, the LWF Board of Directors may be asked to cast votes via electronic internet mail (email) in an election for Federation office, or on issues (questions) regarding organization management, policy, programs or conservation issues when action cannot be delayed until the next regularly scheduled meeting. The ballot or question shall be sent via email to all State Directors and LWF Past Presidents who have provided valid email addresses to the Federation. Proxies shall not be accepted for internet voting. The deadline for returning a ballot or responding to a question shall be no later than ten (10) calendar days after the original email transmission. A quorum shall be achieved when twenty-five (25) Directors have replied to the emailed request by either voting YEAH, or NAY, or declaring that they wish to abstain from the vote in question, prior to the deadline.

For elections held via email, a winner will be declared when one candidate receives a simple majority of the votes cast in the initial voting. If no candidate receives more than Fifty Percent (50%) of the votes cast, a runoff election via the same process will be held between the two candidates receiving the most votes.

When questions must be decided within ten (10) days, or the number of responses received are less than twenty-five (25), at the direction of the Federation president or a majority of the members of the Executive Committee, the Executive Committee may decide the question. In such votes, a quorum is achieved when five (5) responses to the question are received.

A Sixty-Seven Percent (67%) supermajority of votes cast shall be required to decide a question via email. This supermajority rule applies to email decision making by both the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the State Board of Directors and all meetings of the Congress, and shall be a member of all committees ex-officio. The President shall create committees as prescribed in Section 1 of Article X and define their duties. He/she shall purchase or authorize purchase by others of any and all supplies necessary for the use of the Federation.

SECTION 2. The 1st Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Statewide Membership Committee. In the absence or inability of the President to act, the 1st Vice-President shall perform his/her duties. The 2nd Vice-President shall co-chair the State Legislation Committee. The Secretary shall be in charge of and handle all national legislation and chair the National Affairs Committee.

SECTION 3. The Executive Director, or in his/her absence the Secretary of the Federation shall cause to be taken the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and the Congress of the Federation; shall timely notify all members thereof of the meetings and in general attend to the correspondence of the Federation under the direction of the President; and shall furnish copies of the minutes of these meetings as follows: Minutes of the Congress shall be furnished the president and secretary of each association within thirty (30) days after adjournment of said meeting; minutes of the Board of Directors meeting shall be furnished each member of said Board of Directors and each association president and secretary within thirty (30) days after adjournment of said meeting.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall keep the accounts, collect dues and assessments, make payments when and in the manner authorized by the President and/or the State Board of Directors and shall have charge of all funds of the Federation. He shall give such bond and in such form and in such amount as the Board of Directors shall from time to time prescribe, and bonding fee shall be paid by the Federation.

SECTION 5. District Vice-Presidents shall coordinate activities in their districts. A District Vice-President shall affiliate new clubs and visit each unit within his district at least once during his term of office. By virtue of their office, District Vice-Presidents sit on the Statewide Membership Committee chaired by the 1st Vice-President. District Vice-Presidents may appoint one or more assistants from their respective districts to assist them. The assistants shall assist the District Vice-President in affiliating new clubs and coordinating activities in their districts and they shall be known as Assistant District Vice-Presidents.

ARTICLE IV

LOUISIANA WILDLIFE FEDERATION CONVENTION

SECTION 1. Any Federation member, officer, or director may be a delegate to the convention.

SECTION 2. Each Association, in each parish, having fifteen (15) or more members belonging to the Federation may designate and send as many of their members as they choose to attend committee meetings and the general sessions of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation's Congress.

SECTION 3. VOTING IN CONSERVATION COMMITTEE. Each Federation affiliate and at-large board member is eligible to cast one vote per question at conservation committee meetings.

Any person duly elected to represent more than one association may cast as many as but no more than two (2) votes per question.

SECTION 4. VOTING IN CONGRESS. Each Affiliate having at least fifteen (15) members will be entitled one (1) vote by its delegate, or a weighted vote equal to its total number of State Directors. The voting strength of the Affiliate at the Congress will be based upon the total number of State Directors of said Affiliate as of the previous December 31st. Each Association shall from its membership elect one (1) voting delegate and one (1) alternate delegate to vote its club strength in open Congress. In the event the elected voting delegate or alternate voting delegate cannot attend the Congress, the President of the local Association shall select a substitute voting delegate. This delegate shall be a member of the local association. This substitute voting delegate must present such authorization in writing from the Association President. Proxies of voting delegates or alternates may be exercised only by members of his/her own Association. Names of the voting delegate and alternate should be submitted to the Federation's secretary by 8:00 PM on the opening day of the annual convention. Voting delegates elected to represent more than one association at the Congress may cast the voting strengths of no more than two (2) associations that they have been duly elected to represent. Each at-large director present may cast one vote at the Convention Congress.

SECTION 5. The Board of Directors is hereby given power to refuse the right of any delegate to vote, who, in their opinion violates the rules, intentions, or purposes of this Federation.

ARTICLE V

FISCAL YEAR

SECTION 1. The Fiscal Year of the Federation shall end on December 31. The Treasurer shall prepare a financial statement for each Congress and regular Board meeting listing the assets and liabilities of the Federation, to date, and a copy of the year-end statement shall be mailed to the president of each Association and to each State Director, as part of the minutes of the Congress.

SECTION 2. The executive director, or in his absence the secretary, shall prepare annually a list of Associations, and their voting strength, and a copy of said list shall be mailed to the president of each Association and to each State Director thirty (30) days before the annual convention of the Federation.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. There shall be three (3) classes of membership, to wit: Association Memberships, Life Memberships, and Contributing Memberships. Association Memberships will include all of the local associations which are affiliated with the Federation and statewide associations whose club members are members of the Federation.

SECTION 2. Membership cards will be issued to individual members of Associations, designating that they are members of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc., with the name of their local

association and the dues paid to a certain date. Membership cards will be issued to Contributing Members of the Federation, designating that they are members of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc., and the dues paid to a certain date. Associations will be issued a letter or certificate designating that their Association is a member of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc.

SECTION 3. Members may join the Federation in accordance with rules prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII

MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The annual convention shall be set by a Convention Committee appointed by the President within thirty (30) days after the annual convention to designate the time and date of the next annual convention.

ARTICLE VIII

ASSOCIATIONS

SECTION 1. Associations shall elect a president, a vice-president, and a secretary and treasurer, and as many additional officers as they choose.

SECTION 2. Associations shall, through their members, officers, and directors conduct the affairs of their Associations in any manner or form that in their opinion will best suit their purpose, so long as said operation is not in violation of the Charter and By-Laws of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc.

SECTION 3. Associations may elect their delegates and alternate delegates to the Louisiana Wildlife Federation's convention in any manner they see fit.

SECTION 4. Each Association, as one condition to continued membership in the Federation, shall furnish to the Federation office by February 1st each year information regarding its organization, activities, and committees as deemed necessary by the President of the Federation.

SECTION 5. Each Association shall endeavor to attain its maximum membership in order to enjoy the full benefits of the Federation.

SECTION 6. Each Association shall endeavor to operate within its own charter and by-laws; constitution; or articles of incorporation.

ARTICLE IX

DUES

SECTION 1. AFFILIATE MEMBERS. To maintain its status as an affiliate with the Federation, an Affiliate shall remit annual dues of One Hundred Twenty-Five (125) Dollars, plus Twenty-Five

(25) Dollars per State Director in excess of one. An Association whose membership consists of a majority of either full-time students and/or members under twenty-five years of age is eligible for a discounted dues rate of \$2 per member; such Association may be referred to as a Student/Youth Affiliate. In the event that a new club should be affiliated within the last 3 months of the fiscal year, their dues shall cover their Federation dues for the ensuing fiscal year. A list of membership of each Association, as of December 31, with names and addresses, shall be forwarded by the affiliate to the Federation office by January 31 and failure to pay dues and/or supply membership lists shall deprive the Association of its voting privileges in the Congress.

SECTION 2. INDIVIDUAL LIFETIME AFFILIATE MEMBERS. Affiliate Club Members may join the Federation as Life Affiliate Members by the payment to the Federation of One Hundred (100) Dollars. The benefits of Life Affiliate Membership shall include a plaque, Life Membership card, and other tokens of recognition as determined appropriate and authorized from time to time by the Federation's Board of Directors. To qualify as a Life Affiliate Member in the Federation a person must be or have served as an Officer of the Federation or a local club; or must be or have served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Federation or a local club. The payment of such dues shall exempt said Life Affiliate Member, and the Association through which he became a Life Affiliate Member from payment of his yearly dues which would be due the Federation through said Association. Each Association is required to send a list of its Life Affiliate Members of the Federation to the Executive Director of the Federation on or before the deadline for fourth quarter dues each year.

SECTION 3. CONTRIBUTING MEMBERS. Individuals may join the Federation as contributing members. Minimum dues for this category of membership is Fifteen (15) Dollars per year.

SECTION 4. INDIVIDUAL LIFETIME CONTRIBUTING MEMBERS. Individual members may become a lifetime contributing member of the Federation by payment to the Federation of One Thousand (1,000) Dollars. The benefits of a lifetime contributing membership may include a subscription to the Federation's publication, a Louisiana Wildlife Federation plaque, complimentary convention registration and other tokens of recognition as determined appropriate and as authorized from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation.

SECTION 5. CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP/LIFE MEMBERSHIPS. Any business or corporation may become a contributing member of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation. Corporate member dues are One Thousand (1,000) Dollars annually. A corporation or business may become a corporate lifetime contributing member by payment to the Louisiana Wildlife Federation of Five Thousand (5,000) Dollars. The benefits of a lifetime corporate membership may include a subscription to the Federation's publication, complimentary convention registration and other tokens of recognition as determined appropriate and authorized from time to time by the Federation's Board of Directors.

SECTION 6. Any person, corporation, partnership, or Association may make donations of money or property which may be received or rejected by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X

ADMINISTRATION

SECTION 1. The President shall appoint the Chairman and members of the following standing committees:

- (1) Executive Advisory Committee. The Executive Advisory Committee shall serve in an advisory capacity to the LWF Executive Committee and be comprised of LWF Past-Presidents and other past officers and members of the LWF Executive Committee who volunteer to serve on the Executive Advisory Committee. Members of the Executive Advisory Committee will be kept informed of meetings and other business of the LWF Executive Committee in the same manner and to the same extent as elected members of the LWF Executive Committee and be entitled to attend all LWF Executive Committee meetings. Executive Advisory Committee members have no voting privilege on the LWF Executive Committee, but may participate in Executive Committee business as recognized by the LWF President or other officer chairing the meeting. Advisory Committee members may participate in Executive Committee meetings in a similar manner to the voting members of the Executive Committee, with appropriate deference given by the chairman to the voting members. The purposes of the LWF Executive Advisory Committee are to provide support and guidance to the LWF President and Executive Committee and to apply its collective knowledge, wisdom and experience to advance the Louisiana Wildlife Federation.
- (2) Conservation Education Committee. The primary purpose of the Conservation Education Committee is to formulate a program of education for the purpose of enlightening not only our own membership, but the entire public as to the importance of conservation of our natural resources.
- (3) Finance Committee. This committee has for its purpose the monitoring of the finances of the Federation, reporting on the status of such and making suggestions and recommendations regarding the raising of funds with reference to the financial well-being of the Federation. Its functions not only cover the former, but includes such duties as surveying the items of expenditure made by the Federation and recommendations as to any savings which may be made or the elimination of any expense thought to be useless or not necessary in connection with the Federation's business. The Finance Committee may audit or inspect the books at their discretion.
- (4) Environmental Quality Committee. This committee shall concern itself with investigating and publicizing sources of pollution and recommending measures for abatement of pollution problems affecting Louisiana.
- (5) Charter and By-Laws Committee. Purpose of this committee is to investigate proposed changes in the Charter and By-Laws and insure they do not conflict with and/or duplicate existing Articles; determine whether Board of Directors and officers are performing duties according to Charter and By-Laws; endeavor to familiarize each state director and club member with the Charter and By-Laws.

SECTION 2. Each Officer and Director of the Federation and each Officer and Director of every Association or chapter of said Federation shall, upon election and acceptance of said office, read the Charter and By-Laws of the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, Inc. and make him/herself familiar with their purpose and provisions.

SECTION 3. A copy of the Charter and By-Laws shall be mailed to each member of the Federation when requested of the Federation office.

SECTION 4. The minutes of the Federation's Annual Meeting shall be recorded under the direction

of the executive director, or in his absence, the Secretary, and incorporated in the minutes book and be read or not read, at the pleasure of the members then present.

SECTION 5. A list of paid clubs shall be kept by the executive director and shall be available to the Board of Directors at any and all of its meetings. In the absence of the executive director, this list shall be provided by the Secretary.

SECTION 6. (a) When votes on resolutions are not unanimous the vote shall be recorded on the resolutions. (b) Associations shall prepare all resolutions in triplicate. Resolutions, other than those pertaining to seasons and bag limits, shall be submitted to the Federation office at least sixty (60) days prior to the annual convention. These resolutions shall then be assigned to the resolutions committee for assignment to the proper convention conservation committee. Thirty (30) days prior to the annual convention the executive director, or in his absence the secretary, will submit the pertinent or resolved portion of each resolution and its convention conservation committee assignments to each Association president and secretary. Recommendations for seasons and bag limits shall be worked out by the proper convention conservation committee for submission to the open forum without the need for Associations submitting written resolutions. One copy of each written resolution will be posted on the bulletin board at the annual convention prior to the committee meetings. (c) Resolutions shall be numbered consecutively and be kept in a resolution book and final results of said resolution shall be noted thereon. (d) Approved resolutions shall be signed by the chairman of the committee before being submitted to the open forum of the convention. (e) Resolutions of the Federation or the Board of Directors require a majority vote of the delegates or Board of Directors present for adoption.

SECTION 7. The Board of Directors shall elect from among themselves, a Representative and Alternate Representative to the National Wildlife Federation (NWF), the Representative to serve as a member of the Executive Committee. Nominations for Representative and Alternate Representative to the National Wildlife Federation will be open from the time of the Fall Board Meeting through the 15th of October at which time nominations will be closed. Nominations shall be submitted to the Federation President, Secretary and Executive Director and include the nominee's name, contact information, duration and nature of Federation experience and service, explanation of interest in serving as Representative or Alternate Representative and any other background information that the nominator desires to include. The election(s) of these officers shall be held between October 15th and the first Friday in December each year. An election for the office of Representative shall be conducted first, followed by an election for the office of Alternate Representative. Runners-up from the election for Representative may also run for Alternate if they so choose. They shall assume office immediately upon conclusion of the election, and they will be sworn-in along with other elected Federation officers at the next LWF Convention. Their term of office shall be for one (1) year from the date of their election until replaced, and they may serve up to three (3) consecutive full terms.

SECTION 8. (a) All meetings and conventions of the Federation and its Board of Directors shall be conducted in accordance with Parliamentary Law, usage and custom. In the event of conflict, Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall govern. (b) These By-Laws, or any part thereof, may be suspended by a three-fourth's (3/4's) majority vote of the total Board of Directors.
