**BYLAWS OF
LILITH FUND, INC.**

**ARTICLE I
NAME AND LOCATION**

- 1.1 Name. The name and location of this nonprofit organization shall be Lilith Fund, Inc. (hereinafter "Corporation").
- 1.2 Office. The principal office of the Corporation shall be located in the City of Austin, County of Williamson, in the State of Texas. The Corporation may have such other offices within the State of Texas as the Board of Directors may determine, or as the affairs of the Corporation may require from time to time.
- 1.3 Registered Office and Registered Agent. The Corporation shall have and continuously maintain in the State of Texas a registered office and a registered agent whose office is identical with such registered office, as required by the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act. The registered office may be, but not need be identical with the principal office of the Corporation in the State of Texas, and the Board of Directors may change the address of the registered office from time to time.

**ARTICLE II
CORPORATE PURPOSES**

- 2.1 Corporate Status. Lilith Fund, Inc. was incorporated on April 10, 2001 as a Texas Non-Profit Corporation.
- 2.2 Corporate Purpose. The Corporation, as a non-profit corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, is organized and will be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, including financial assistance and public education on reproductive health matters and services.

**ARTICLE III
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

- 3.1 Authority. The Board of Directors shall have control of and be responsible for the management of the affairs and property of the Corporation; shall have power to appoint and remove all officers in accordance with the provisions of Article V of these Bylaws, and to prescribe their duties, not inconsistent with the provision of these Bylaws; shall have the power to remove a Director from the Board for cause in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 3.5 of these Bylaws; and generally shall have full power to do, or require to be done, everything deemed necessary or expedient for the promotion and protection of the welfare of the Corporation.

3.2 Number of Directors. The Board shall consist of no less than three (3) and as many as fifteen (15) Directors, with no more than twelve (12) Directors permanently residing in Travis and contiguous counties.

3.3 Election, Terms and Vacancies. Six (6) Board positions shall be for two year terms and six (6) Board positions shall be for one year terms. Directors may be re-elected but no member of the Board can serve for more than four (4) consecutive years. Two year terms shall be staggered terms with three (3) expiring in odd years and three (3) expiring in even years. After their term ends, a member is eligible for re-consideration one (1) year after s/he has been off the Board. In case of a vacancy, the Board may elect a Director to complete the unexpired term. Election of each Director shall be by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board's total membership. Each new Director shall serve a three-month probation period. The new Director shall remain on the Board unless voted off by a majority of the Board at the end of the three (3) months.

3.4 Compensation. No member of the Board of Directors shall receive any salary or pecuniary compensation for services as a Director, but subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, may be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses necessarily incurred in the discharge of duties as such.

3.5 Removal. Unless this provision is waived by a majority of the Board of Directors, the unexcused absence of a Director from three (3) consecutive regular meetings or a total of four (4) regular meetings of the Board of Directors in a twelve (12) month period shall be cause for the automatic removal from the Board. A Director may also be removed for malfeasance in office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the other Directors. "Malfeasance in office" shall mean an intentional refusal or failure to perform any duty required by the Oath of Office, which was signed by the Director, provided that the refusal or failure to perform would compromise the integrity of the Corporation or an intentional performance of any such duty in an unlawful manner.

3.6 Leave of Absence. With an affirmative vote of a quorum of the Board of Directors, a Director may take a leave of absence for good cause shown not to exceed six (6) months. Written notice of intent to take a leave of absence must be provided to the Secretary fourteen (14) days before such leave is to commence. The amount of time taken for such leave by a Director shall be considered to be part of the Director's term of elected office and may not be applied to extend the term of office.

3.7 Manner of Acting. The act of a majority of the Directors present at the meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by these Bylaws.

3.8 Action by Directors Without a Meeting. Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of Directors, or any action, which may be taken at a meeting of Directors, may be taken

without a meeting pursuant to a consent in writing setting forth the action so taken and signed by all the Directors.

3.9 Financial Liability. Directors shall not be personally liable for debts incurred by the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4.1 Regular Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the Corporation's Board of Directors shall be held during the last quarter of the calendar year. Officers shall be elected during the last meeting of the calendar year and shall assume office the first meeting of the subsequent calendar year. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at least bi-monthly. Notices of all regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be sent to all members of the Board at least five (5) days before any such meeting. Notice may be provided in the form of a letter, postcard, electronic mail, through a newsletter of the Corporation, or through inclusion in a mailed agenda.

4.2 Special Meetings. The Secretary, when so directed in writing (via e-mail) by the President, or upon e-mail request to the President by a Board member, shall call Special Meetings of the Board at any time. Notice of any such meeting and the purpose(s) for which it is called shall be sent to each member of the board in the same manner as provided for regular meetings, unless Board members requesting or consenting to such meeting shall declare that an emergency necessitates the giving of shorter notice. In such an emergency, notice of a Special Meeting may be given to members of the Board by telephone, provided that an e-mail notice follows, and given by telephone no less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time of such Special Meeting. Notices of Special Meetings must clearly state the purpose(s) of such meetings.

4.3 Agendas. Written agendas shall be provided for each meeting. Agenda items for regular meetings must be submitted to the President prior to the scheduled meeting; and completed agendas must be mailed or electronically mailed to each member of the Board prior to the scheduled meeting. At the President's discretion, urgent items may be added to the agenda when presented to the President at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the scheduled meeting.

4.4 Quorum. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board.

4.5 Voting. Unless otherwise specified in these Bylaws, a majority of those present and voting shall prevail in any Board action.

4.6 Open Meetings. All meetings of the Board shall be open, except that the Board may meet in closed session to discuss personnel matters or to receive outside legal counsel.

4.7 Procedures Resolution. The Board shall designate procedures for the conduct of meetings of the Board of Directors. Any question concerning parliamentary procedure at Board meetings shall be determined by reference to Roberts Rules of Order, unless otherwise directed by these Bylaws.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS

5.1 Officers. The Officers of the Board of Directors shall be President, President-elect, Secretary, and Treasurer and such other officers as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

5.2 Election and Term of Office. At their final meeting of the calendar year the Board shall elect the Officers of the Board. If the election of Officers cannot be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as possible. New officers may be created and filled at any meeting of the Board. Each Officer shall hold office for one year (see section 3.3) or until a successor shall have been duly elected and thoroughly informed of the duties. Persons who have been members of the Board of Directors for at least one (1) calendar year at the time of the election are eligible to hold an officer position; however, by majority vote, the Board of Directors may waive this provision. The President-elect shall serve one year in that capacity before assuming the office of president the subsequent calendar year; however, by majority vote, the Board of Directors may waive this provision.

5.3 Removal. The Board shall have the power to remove by two-thirds (2/3) vote an Officer for failure to perform prescribed duties, as determined in a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board. Written notification of removal from an office shall be sent within two weeks of the decision. Removal from an office does not constitute removal from the Board.

5.4 Vacancies. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

5.5 President. The President shall be the principal Executive Officer of the Corporation and shall in general supervise and control all the business and affairs of the Corporation, ensuring adequate communications with members and interested parties on the Corporation's activities. The President shall 1) preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors; 2) develop an agenda for all meetings; 3) initiate and appoint special committees that may be required from time to time; 4) provide leadership required to assure adequate performance of duties assigned to the Board, Officers and any committees.

5.6 President-elect. In the absence of the President, the President-elect shall assume the duties of the President. The President-elect shall report to, observe and assist the President in the performance of his/her duties particularly those dealing with coordination of activities of the Executive Committee. The President-elect will assume the position of the President when the President's term expires.

5.7 Treasurer. The Treasurer shall perform the following duties: 1) be responsible for the accounting records of the Corporation; 2) present monthly financial statements to the Board; 3) present an annual financial statement to the Board; and 4) in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the Board of Directors.

5.8 Secretary. The Secretary shall perform the following duties: 1) ensure that the minutes of all meetings of members of the Board are kept; 2) post the minutes of such meetings on the Lilith Fund yahoo groups Board web site; 3) issue required notices and agendas of all meetings of the Board; 4) be custodian of the Corporate records and the seal of the Corporation; and 5) in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI

COMMITTEES

6.1 Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the President-elect, the Treasurer, the Secretary and one other Director elected by the Board of Directors. The immediate Past President shall serve, without vote, if not a member of the committee, as a consultant to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for dealing with matters of urgency that may arise between Board meetings. The committee shall meet at the discretion of the President.

6.2 Other Committees. The Board of Directors or the President may appoint other committees.

6.3 Committee policies. Each Committee chair shall: 1) give a committee report at the Board's regular meetings, and 2) submit to the Board for approval policy changes. No committee can take actions that are solely within the power of the Board.

6.4 Quorum. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Directors designating a committee, two-thirds (2/3) of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the committee members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.

6.5 Rules. Each committee may adopt rules for its own governance not inconsistent with these Bylaws or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII

FINANCIAL

7.1 Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation, in addition to the officer so authorized by these bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver an instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

- 7.2 Checks and Drafts. All checks, drafts, or orders for the payment of money, notice or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation shall be signed by two (2) members of the Executive Board and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.
- 7.3 Deposits. All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.
- 7.4 Gifts. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or equipment for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors and shall keep at the registered or principal office a record giving the names and addresses of those entitled to vote.

ARTICLE IX

FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on the first day of January and end on the last day of December in each year.

ARTICLE X

PROHIBITED ACTIVITY

The Corporation shall make distributions at such time and in such manner as not to subject to tax under Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954; the Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing which would be subject to tax under Section 4941 of the Code; the Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings which would subject it to tax under Section 4943 of the Code; the Corporation shall not make any investments which would subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and the Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures which would subject it to tax under Section 4945 of the Code; or corresponding sections of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE XI

WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws of the Corporation, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice,

whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such a notice.

ARTICLE XII

AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed; and new Bylaws may be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board at any regular meeting or any special meeting if at least fourteen (14) days written notice is given in intention to alter, amend or repeal, or to adopt new Bylaws at such meeting.

ARTICLE XIII

INDEMNITY

The Corporation shall indemnify any Director or Officer or former Director or Officer of the Corporation, in accordance with Article 1396-2.22A, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas (or any revised, amended or successor to such statute), against expenses actually and necessarily incurred in connection with the defense of any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil or criminal, in which the person is made a party by reason of being or having been such Director or Officer, except in relation to matters as to which such person shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be liable for misconduct in performance of duty.


ARTICLE XIV

AFFILIATION WITH NNAF

As a voting member (affiliate) of the National Network of Abortion Funds (NNAF), a District of Columbia nonprofit corporation, Lilith Fund, Inc. is bound by a written affiliation agreement to comply with NNAF's pertinent dues, rules and regulation for affiliates, and as an affiliate that enjoys 501 (c)(3) tax-exemption under NNAF's group exemption. Lilith Fund, Inc. is further prohibited from modifying Article XII of its Articles of Incorporation, which renders it subject to pertinent NNAF policies, rules and regulations, without NNAF's consent. Nothing in these Bylaws shall be interpreted inconsistently with NNAF's applicable policies, rules and regulations, nor shall any amendment of these Bylaws be so framed or interpreted.
