Successful requests will fall within both the current eligibility guidelines and funding priority areas established by the Amgen Foundation. The Amgen Foundation has established a grantmaking partnership with United Way Worldwide to manage donations to organizations chartered in Europe.

Eligibility Limitations:

The Amgen Foundation will not consider requests for:

- 1) Support to individuals
- 2) Fundraising or sports-related events
- 3) Corporate sponsorship requests
- 4) Religious organizations unless the gift is designated to a program that is secular in nature and benefits a broad range of the community (e.g. soup kitchens and homeless shelters). Additionally the program must have a formal mission and separate budget and staff.
- 5) Political organizations or lobbying activity
- 6) Labor unions
- 7) Private foundations
- 8) Organizations not described in sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1), (2), (3) of the Internal Revenue Code
- 9) Organizations that discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, veteran or disability statuses in the delivery of services and in their employment practices.
