RESPONSE TO FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES TEST TO QUALIFY AS A PUBLICLY SUPPORTED ORGANIZATION

ACE Public School Network's mission of public education reform in traditionally underserved neighborhoods in San Jose California has successfully created three small, autonomous schools within the Alum Rock Union School District, one similar school in the Franklin McKinley School District, and a public charter school (which has since moved into a separate organization structure). This mission appealed to a number of affluent individuals and corporations in the Silicon Valley communities. Their generations tended to be very generous, frequently greater than the \$16,340 2% threshold. These organizations and individuals all shared ACE Public School Network's passion for public education reform. This has resulted in ACE Public School Network traditionally not having to devote resources to fundraising, allowing it to focus on its primary mission, which is a larger sense, is to improve and enrich people's lives and better society. Putting all this together, ACE Public School Network believes it meets the test of a Publicly Supported Organization.
