Orphan children in 9 countries, living in group homes were supplied with all of their basic needs. Basic needs include: Food, clothing, shelter, medical care, education, mentoring and nurturing, life-skills training, hygiene, Bibles, etc. The organization added an additional home in the cap Hatien area of Haiti. The organization also added post graduation education components to the scope of its programs. These were initiated in India and Africa. A total of approximately 19,175 orphan children were served. All homes are provided for year round. Special needs are provided for based upon a grant request specific to the need that falls outside of the normal daily needs. All needs are fulfilled based upon importance categorized as critical, ongoing, and special.

Children's homes in 9 countries were provided with management and facilitation services. The services include: Assistance in starting and / or managing aspects of the children's home including budget preparation, selection of all goods and services needed to operate the home, assessment of the physical, mental, emotional condition and related needs of the children. Facilitation includes purchase and delivery of goods and / or services to specific homes (primarily those in Russia), inspection of the homes for adherence to program policies, etc. Surprise visits to homes for these inspections are a part of the services provided as well. Another element is initial assessment of proposed or existing homes to verify validity and viability of the home including its location, presence of children, presence of adequate and competent caregivers and director(s), proximity to medical care and schools, etc.

Lifeline of Hope has very strict policies and procedures in regards to the use of grant funds.

The first step of the procedures in keeping with the policies, is the RFI to the children's home in the foreign country.

The RFI requires proof of NGO status, and a volume of other information, including a proposed budget for the home, profiles of all of the children, a list of caregivers, Directors, etc. that includes qualifications. The next step is a surprise visit to the children's home in which all information supplied in response to the RFI is verified, including the presence of each child for each profile. The children are interviewed separate from the staff of the home and asked specific questions to verify their status as an orphan, their residency in the home, required education status, general health and well being, etc., etc. If the home passes the surprise inspection and are approved for funding, the Children's Home Management team at Lifeline of Hope Corporate offices, works with the home to fine tune and create a realistic budget for the children's home. Once complete, and all other criteria is approved, funds are sent monthly, either through wire transfer or Western Union. The Director of the home is required to mail or scan and email receipts for all goods and services purchased, which in turn, must match the budget line items in each submitted monthly budget and grant request. All receipts are maintained in hard and / or electronic files at Lifeline of Hope Corporate offices. Surprise inspections are conducted on a regular basis each calendar year, but are always unannounced to verify the proper use of funds, adherence to Children's Homes Management policies, as well as all criteria investigated in the initial visit. All of the children's homes and their respective financial records are inspected by local government officials as well. The above statement applies to all children's homes outside of Russia. In Russia, we have established two separate registered non-profit entities. One is in the Barnaul region, the other is in Khabarovsk Krai. Each has it's own Russian Director and facilitators. Each maintains records for the orphanages given aid and supplies Lifeline of Hope with all required documentation for all goods and services purchased. Each is required to gain approval from the Ministry of Health and Education for all goods and services purchased and copies of all receipts are maintained by the respective Ministry in each region. The Ministry in each region also conducts inspections of the homes to verify goods and services are as reported and are maintained within each orphanage as well. Lifeline of Hope makes visits to each regional office and the orphanages in Russia as well. All Children's Homes in all countries are required to provide each element of Lifeline of Hope's program requirements, including standards of care and adherence to all other policies for reporting in order to continue to receive funding.
