BY-LAWS

OF

THE MYRON STRATTON HOME

ARTICLE I PRINCIPAL OFFICE OF CORPORATION

The principal office of the Corporation shall be maintained at 555 Gold Pass Heights, in the City of Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado.

ARTICLE II QUALIFICATIONS, ELECTIONS, COMPENSATION

- Section I. <u>Duties.</u> The Board of Trustees shall consist of five (5) trustees, a majority of whom shall, at all times, be residents of El Paso County, Colorado, and shall exercise general supervision over the affairs of the Corporation, and shall have all the powers conferred upon it by the Statutes of the State of Colorado, and by the Certificate of Incorporation and by these By-Laws.
- <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Election, Term of Office and Compensation.</u> The election, the term of office and the compensation to be paid the Trustees are set forth under Article VI of the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation to which reference is hereby made, and the provisions thereof are adopted and incorporated herein.
- Section 3. Designation and Duties of Chairman. One of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be designated as Chairman. He shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall carry out such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board from time to time. The Chairman shall receive such compensation for his duties as is established by proper order of the District Court of El Paso County, Colorado.
- Section 4. <u>Disqualifications of Trustee.</u> Any Trustee of the Corporation shall be disqualified and forfeit his trusteeship, who shall be convicted of a felony on the final judgment of a court having jurisdiction, or who shall continuously absent himself from the State of Colorado for more than one year without the unanimous consent of the Board of Trustees or who shall become a mental incompetent, a habitual drunkard, or grossly immoral.
- Section 5. Affidavit. The election of any person as a member of the Board of Trustees of this Corporation shall be contingent upon his making an affidavit before entering upon the duties of his office, which affidavit shall be in the following form:

ARTICLE III OFFICERS

- <u>Section 1.</u> The officers of this Corporation, who shall be members of the Board of Trustees, shall be a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Board of Trustees may create the office of Assistant Secretary and Assistant Treasurer whenever it deems it advisable to do so.
- <u>Section 2.</u> No two offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of Secretary and Treasurer.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The officers of the Corporation shall receive only such compensation as is provided under the terms of the Corporation's Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation and proper order of the District Court of El Paso County, Colorado.
- <u>Section 4.</u> The Board of Trustees may, at any regular or at any special meeting called for the purpose, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of its members, remove any officers and may fill any vacancy existing in any office.
- <u>Section 5.</u> The officers of the Corporation shall be elected annually at the meeting of the Board of Trustees designated as the Annual Meeting in each year. Each officer of the Corporation, unless sooner removed, shall hold his office until his successor shall have been elected and duly qualified.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Section 1. Duties of President. It shall be the duty of the President, in consultation with the Board of Trustees, to oversee the activities of The Home and the management of its assets, and in conjunction with the Secretary, to sign all bonds, deeds, agreements, or other instruments in writing made and entered into by or on behalf of the corporation, except as otherwise ordered by the Board of Trustees; and in general, to perform all the acts incident to this office, and all other duties required of him by law, by these By-Laws, or by the Board of Trustees.
- Section 2. <u>Duties of Vice President.</u> The Vice President shall have like duties and authority with the President in case of any vacancy in the office of the President, or in the absence of the President from El Paso County, or in case of his refusal or inability to act.
- Section 3. Duties of Secretary. The Secretary shall give due notice, whenever so required by these By-Laws or by the laws of the State of Colorado, of all meetings of the Board of Trustees. He shall prepare and keep a true and correct record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Board of Trustees. He shall oversee the preparation and keeping of proper books of record and such other books as the Board of Trustees

shall prescribe. He shall be the custodian of the corporate seal and shall countersign and attest all instruments, bonds, deeds, agreements, or other instruments in writing, made and entered into by or on behalf of the Corporation, except as otherwise ordered by the Board of Trustees. He shall attach the corporate seal of the Corporation to all instruments requiring it and perform such other duties as are incident to his office.

- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Duties of Assistant Secretary.</u> The Assistant Secretary shall perform such duties as may from time to time be required of him by the Board of Trustees, and in the absence from El Paso County, or disability, or refusal to act of the Secretary, or a vacancy in the office of the Secretary, the assistant Secretary shall have power to perform any and all of the duties of the Secretary.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Duties of Treasurer.</u> The Treasurer shall oversee all of the Corporation's accounting functions and furnish to the Board of Trustees such data and reports as the Board may designate.
- <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Duties of the Assistant Treasurer.</u> The Assistant Treasurer shall have such duties and authority as may be prescribed or vested in him by the Board of Trustees, and in the case of vacancy in the office of Treasurer, his absence from El Paso County, or his refusal or inability to act, the Assistant Treasurer shall perform all the duties of Treasurer.

ARTICLE V PRINCIPAL OPERATING PERSONNEL

- Section 1. The Board of Trustees may engage to serve at the discretion of the Board, such employees and agents as are necessary to accomplish those duties delegated by the Board in the operation and routine management of The Myron Stratton Home. Reasonable compensation for such employees shall be established by the Board from time to time. One of such employees may be designated as "Executive Director."
- Section 2. <u>Duties of Executive Director.</u> The Executive Director shall, in consultation with the Board of Trustees, plan, organize, direct, control, and coordinate the activities and operation of The Myron Stratton Home and manage its assets. He shall exercise all authority and perform all duties delegated to him by the Board of Trustees; and, accomplish all responsibilities required of him by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE VI INDEMNIFICATION

Section 1. The Corporation shall indemnify each trustee, officer, employee and volunteer of the corporation to the fullest extent permissible under the laws of the State of Colorado, and may in its discretion purchase insurance insuring its obligations hereunder or otherwise protecting the persons intended to be protected by this section. The Corporation shall have the right, but shall not be obligated, to indemnify any agent

of the Corporation not otherwise covered by this Section to the fullest extent permissible under the laws of the State of Colorado.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of these bylaws, the corporation shall neither indemnify any person nor purchase any insurance in any manner or to any extent that would jeopardize or be inconsistent with the qualification of the corporation as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or that would result in the imposition of any liability under either section 4941 or section 4958 of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE VII SEAL

The Corporation shall have a corporate seal, and hereby adopts as its seal the following: The words, "The Myron Stratton Home, Incorporated 1909," encircling a profile of the late Winfield Scott Stratton.

ARTICLE VIII DEBTS

No debts shall be contracted for or on behalf of, or in the name of, the Corporation except upon the authority of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

The By-Laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees upon a majority vote of the members of said Board. Any proposed amendment to these By-Laws shall be submitted to each member of the Board of Trustees at least ten (10) days prior to any regular or any proposed special meeting of the Board, unless such requirement is waived by each respective member.

ARTICLE X MEETINGS OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section 1. Calling of Meetings. The time and place of the annual and regular meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be established by resolution of the Board. Special Meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called at any time by the President or the majority of the Board of Trustees by delivering to each member of the Board notice of such meeting at least two (2) days prior to any proposed special meeting, unless notice is waived by each respective member.

Section 2. Action Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Trustees or any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by a majority of the Trustees or committee members entitled to vote with respect

to the subject matter thereof. The action shall only be effective if there are writings which describe the action, signed by the Trustees, received by electronically transmitted facsimile or other form of wire or wireless communication or otherwise, providing the Corporation with a complete copy of the documents including a copy of the signature. Such consent (which may be signed in counterparts) shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of the Trustees or committee members.

Section 3. Participation in a Meeting. The Board of Trustees may permit any Trustee to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through the use of, any means of communication by which all Trustees participating may hear each other during the meeting. A Trustee participating in a meeting by this means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

Section 4. Proxies. The Board of Trustees may permit any Trustee to be present at and vote at a meeting by proxy. If so permitted by the Board, the Trustee requesting a proxy must use the form shown on the attached Exhibit A. A person voting by proxy shall be counted for the purpose of establishing a quorum. The Trustee's vote by proxy shall be counted as if he or she was present and voting.

ARTICLE XI AUDITING COMMITTEE

The auditing committee, as specified under the provisions of the Will of Winfield Scott Stratton, shall consist of representatives of firms of certified public accountants, which firms shall be annually appointed by the Board of Trustees to examine the receipts, expenditures, and disbursements of said Corporation, and make a report of its examination to said Board of Trustees. In no event shall any firm of certified public accounts so selected by the Board of Trustees have any member or members who shall be related by blood or marriage to any Trustee or officer of the Corporation. The same firm of certified public accounts may serve for up to five (5) consecutive years. However, any such firm may be re-appointed after five (5) years have elapsed from its previous appointment. Such firm shall make a true, condensed report of the affairs of the Corporation for publication purposes, and said report shall, within thirty (30) days after it submission to the Board of Trustees, be published in full in a daily newspaper of general circulation of Colorado Springs, Colorado.

ARTICLE XII DEFINITION OF TERMS

Whenever in these By-Laws the words "he," or "his," or "him," or other words importing the male gender appear, the same be held to include the female gender.
