The organization does not include in bad debt expense any amount that could reasonably be attributable to patients who likely would qualify for financial assistance under the hospitals' charity care policy. The following are the relevant portions of the Company's footnote to the financial statements related to bad debt. Included in net receivables is the allowance for uncollectible receivables. The allowance for uncollectible receivables is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in healthcare coverage, and other collection indicators. Management periodically assesses the adequacy of the allowance for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category. The results of these reviews are used to modify, as necessary, the provision for bad debts and to establish appropriate allowances for uncollectible net patient accounts receivable.

Inpatient and outpatient Medicare costs are calculated on the cost report. Inpatient costs are a product of routine service costs based on per diems and ancillary costs based on inpatient Medicare charges factored by inpatient cost to charge ratios. Outpatient costs are based on Medicare outpatient charges factored by outpatient cost to charge ratios.

Exempla, Inc. has billing and collection practices in place that take into account each patient's ability to pay, and that demonstrate our Core Value of Respect. We work with each patient to help them understand their financial responsibility for care received, financial assistance available to them, and to establish payment programs. An integral component of our Mission is to be good financial stewards. This requires us to determine which patients are in need of charity care and which are able to contribute some payment for care received. We maintain a balance that enables us to continue to provide charity care to those who need it most, and to ensure that we manage our resources so that we can continue to be here when people need us most. Notice of Availability of Charity Care and Financial Assistance is provided to each patient at the time of registration. Such availability is noted in the Understanding the Billing Process brochure received by each patient. Financial Counselors are available at the appropriate services sites to provide additional information or assistance. Charity Care information is available at Exempla Hospitals and Clinics in one of the following areas. * Registration Department. * Financial Counselor. * Business Office. * Patient Representatives. * Outside benefits-eligibility agency liaisons. The Exempla website provides information about financial assistance (including a copy of the charity care policy). Through the process for collecting payment, Exempla's internal and external collectors are knowledgeable of and guided by Exempla's charity care policy. If identified during the collection process that a patient does not have financial means for payment, they are referred to Business Office Charity Care for assistance. In 2009, Exempla, Inc. provided a total of \$13,463,152 in traditional charity care and \$11,433,685 for the unpaid cost of Medicaid.

- good An Exempla Healthcare's Needs Assessment was recently completed. It was based on research that integrated data gathered from governmental, public and private agencies whose primary purpose is to provide organizations with information regarding he health needs of Colorado residents. The assessment included a partnership with over 100 organizations, under the umbrella of the Denver Healthy People 2010 campaign sponsored by the US Department of Healthy and Human Services. Exempla also partnered with additional organizations specific to each hospital's location and we also considered data regarding hospitals' top diagnostic related groupings (DRGs) from the inpatient, outpatient, emergency and Primary Care physician settings. Priorities were selected through gap analysis between the Healthy People 2010 focus areas, the status of our community within those focus areas and hospital service lines. Based on prioritization Community Education and Outreach programs to improve the health of our community were funded. Strategies were developed to ensure that community health needs are being addressed in focus areas such as access to health cares, tobacco use, stroke and cancer. We clearly post our financial assistance and charity care policy, including financial assistance contact information, in admissions areas, emergency departments, billing offices, and other high traffic areas. For amounts over \$10,000 and up to \$25,000, a Manager has the authority to approve the adjustments. For amounts over \$25,000 and up to \$50,000, a Director has the authority to approve the adjustments. For amounts over \$50,000, the information is provided to the Charity Committee for approval. If the patient does not qualify for charity care, the patient is immediately notified and the appeal process is explained, in following with our core values of Respect and Dignity. The not-for-profit health system is headquartered in Lenexa, Kan , and comprises nearly 16,000 employees SCLHS is sponsored by the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth, who opened their first hospital in 1864. Community benefits provided in 2009 throughout SCLHS totaled \$204 9 million. As part of SCLHS, we promote the shared Mission that "We will, in the spirit of the Sisters of Charity, reveal God's healing love by improving the health of the individuals and communities we serve, especially those who are poor or vulnerable "We are committed to living and demonstrating our Core Values of Excellence, Respect, Response to Need, Stewardship and Wholeness SCLHS supports its hospitals by providing guidance, oversight, and resources to help them accomplish initiatives that improve health in all our communities.
