Statement of ICAN Program Services Accomplishments for 2009:

ICAN's Cancer Patient Advocacy Programs and Clinical Trials Advocacy Programs

Throughout 2009, ICAN continued expanding its Cancer Patient Advocacy Programs, Clinical Trials Advocacy Programs, and Public Education and Information Programs in over 200 separate cancers and cancer subtypes directly serving patient contacts diagnosed with Stage IV cancer. Such patients typically had been "written off" by their medical teams—as related by the patient to ICAN—and had been given no viable strategic options before approaching ICAN. Referrals to ICAN are set in motion by a cancer patient's friends, physicians, relatives, or fellow cancer patients who have previously worked with or who are currently working with ICAN as well as by those who have attended ICAN special events, community outreach, or networking/educational meetings. Referrals also come in from medical centers and through the Web. Complex cases at ICAN take between 20 and 80 hours of Program Services staff/research intern time per case, with over 100 such cases handled during 2009. Over 800 major medical center, medical oncology, surgical oncology, radiation oncology, radiology, interventional radiology, stereotactic radiosurgery, pathology, and specialty laboratory referrals were made on behalf of ICAN patients in ICAN's Cancer Patient Advocacy Programs as a follow-up to our patient case analyses.

With the severe economic climate in the southwest U.S. and the downturn of philanthropic support because of the financial challenges of donors across our donor base, ICAN was nonetheless able to pursue its 24/7/365 Patient Program Services through the in-kind services of close to 500 volunteers hailing from volunteermatch.org and other volunteer recruitment sources. These volunteers assisted ICAN in areas such as tumor biomarkers, gene expression profiling information, and cancer literature research updates on a per-cancer basis or per-clinical trials basis. All told, ICAN's Governance Committee estimates that this infusion of volunteer support—a fair number of these volunteers having been laid off from law firms, marketing firms, pharmaceutical, or corporate positions—led to an in-kind donation to ICAN of close to \$5 million were ICAN to have paid street rates for the quality of talent and the quantity of donated hours that flowed into ICAN beginning in February, 2009. Most ICAN volunteers are college graduates or post graduate school. By the end of the year, ICAN had created Internship Programs for high school through post-doctoral students and had launched a Community Service program as well.

Isbell Carcinoid Cancer Patient and Clinical Trials Advocacy Program; and the Kae Robb Breast Cancer Clinical Trials Advocacy Program for Her-2/neu Patients. Because ICAN, during 2009, also reviewed and researched the issue of compassionate use requests for late-stage cancer patients, the infrastructure for The Muriel Finlayson Williams Compassionate Use Drug Information Program continued to be pursued on behalf of patients who are seeking information about emergency release of promising compounds from their developmental sponsors. ICAN's in-house resources and experience in that area dates to 1996, a year before the organization was formally launched.

In 2009, ICAN Program Services staff continued to respond to the many hundreds of inquiries from all over the country relating to specific anticancer compounds, clinical trials options, physician referrals, and major cancer center/oncology practice referrals. Because of heightened publicity, the leading inquiry at ICAN throughout 2009 concerned immunotherapy. ICAN Public Education Program Services and Drug Pipeline Information Programs responded to patient and public inquiries regarding specific vaccine clinical trials, hormone therapy, brachytherapy, proton beam therapy, antiandrogen therapy, steroid therapy, endocrine therapy, biologic therapy, as well as to questions regarding new compounds characterized as vascular targeting agents and angiogenesis inhibitors. Other areas of patient and public inquiries included: the bloodbrain barrier and anticancer drugs targeting brain metastasis (whether solitary lesions and multiple metastases), conventional surgery, radiation therapy, complementary and alternative medicine, multi-drug resistance, pain management, fatigue management, cachexia, and nausea management. The issue of small bowel obstruction continued to be prominent among gastrointestinal cancer and ovarian cancer patients during 2009. ICAN Patient Program Services also responded to requests for additional information concerning new diagnostic procedures, tumor biomarkers, new imaging technology, and cutting-edge, interventional radiology procedures such as SIR-Spheres®.

Over the last several years, ICAN has succeeded in developing a revolutionary cancer information search engine which is expected to be publicly launched by the end of 2011. The search engine, used internally at the present time, is an innovative service which will be housed on one of ICAN's websites, http://www.askican.org/ for cancer patients and

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their families. The search engine will enhance and accelerate retrieval of relevant and specific patient-appropriate information and clinical trials.

Less than 5% of the nation's cancer patients are enrolled in clinical trials and 80 to 88% (depending on the survey) of cancer patients surveyed by market researchers reported that their oncologists had never even mentioned the availability of a particular clinical trial to them, let alone the concept of clinical trials. For this reason, ICAN has reinvented the process by which cancer patients will not only access clinical trials information, but will have the benefit of their own computerized patient advocate, so to speak. Patient responses to a series of specific questions will fuel the search engine to ferret out the most suitable trials for that particular patient and his/her specific cancer and treatment history. The project puts primacy on security and confidentiality.

The highly innovative technology that created ICAN's search engine enables users to enter the type of cancer and other information about the patient on the search utility. Based on specific criteria, ICAN's search engine automatically examines myriad web sites containing virtually all the clinical trials published on the Internet. The search engine can look for trials either closest to the patient's home town or around the world as well.

Prominent oncologists who have seen ICAN's search engine are in full support of the project and have indicated that there is a tremendous need for a comprehensive cancer information search engine that can access such targeted, up-to-the-minute information.

The international launch and announcement of the new search engine will catapult the mission, vision, and reach of ICAN to a whole new level of exposure. The vision for ICAN is one of growth, evolutionary change, and expansion of comprehensive patient services, including ICAN's search engine, to meet the escalating needs of an everincreasing population of cancer patients. This will result in ICAN needing to develop crucial capacity-building resources in the years ahead to meet the overwhelming patient demand for its life-extending services.

ICAN continues to prepare for the launch of its 2011-2012 capital campaign to fund its major research initiatives as well as its search engine and other projects.
