## AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

### OF

### BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF LAS VEGAS, INC.

a Nevada nonprofit corporation

## I. CORPORATION'S ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

1.1. References to Articles. Any reference in these bylaws (the "Bylaws") made to the Articles of Incorporation (the "Articles") of Boys & Girls Club of Las Vegas, Inc. (the "Corporation") will be deemed to refer to its articles of incorporation and all amendments thereto at any given time on file with the Nevada Secretary of State, together with any and all certificates filed by the Corporation with the Nevada Secretary of State pursuant to applicable law.

## II. CORPORATE OFFICES

2.1. Office. The principal place of business of the Corporation in the State of Nevada will be 2850 Lindell Road, Las Vegas, Nevada 89146, unless otherwise designated in the Articles or in a written statement filed with the records of the Corporation. The Corporation may have such other offices, either within or without the State of Nevada, as the board of directors of the Corporation (the "Board") may designate or as the business of the Corporation may require from time to time.

2.2. Registered Agent. The Board may change the Corporation's registered agent from time to time by filing a statement with the Nevada Secretary of State pursuant to applicable law.

## III. MEMBERS

The membership of the Corporation will consist of the individual members of the Board.

## IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4.1. Board of Directors. The Board shall administer the affairs of the Corporation and has general powers to manage and direct the activities of the Corporation. The Board shall be comprised of not less than 10 nor more than 45 voting members (each, a "Director" and collectively, the "Directors"), until changed by amendment to the Articles and the Bylaws. The number of Directors within the foregoing fixed minimum and maximum may be established and changed from time to time by resolution adopted by the Board without amendment to the Articles or the Bylaws. The Directors may elect persons to the Board. Vacancies may be filled by a majority of the remaining Directors, though less than a quorum. Directors will be elected to hold office for a term of one year or until their successors are duly elected and installed. All terms will commence on January 1 of each year. Subject to Sections 4.12 and 8.1 below and annual evaluation by the Board, each Director's term automatically renews upon expiration of such Director's term.

4.2. Regular Meetings. The Board shall hold not less than five (5) regular meetings of the Board during each calendar year, one of which will be the annual meeting. Such meetings shall be held at a time and place designated by the Board. A regular annual meeting of the Board must be held within the first sixty (60) days of each calendar year. Additional regular meetings may be held at regular intervals designated by the Board.

4.3. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be held whenever and wherever called for by the Chairman or the number of Directors that would be required to constitute a quorum.

4.4. Notices. No notice need be given of regular meetings of the Board. Advance written notice of the time and place (but not necessarily the purpose or all of the purposes) of any special meeting or change of date, time or place of a regular meeting will be given to each Director in person or by mail, electronic mail or facsimile addressed to him or her at his or her latest mailing address, electronic mail address or facsimile number appearing on the Corporation's records. Notice to any Director of any such special meeting will be deemed given sufficiently in advance when (a) if given by the U.S. Postal Service, the same is deposited in the mail, with first class or airmail postage prepaid, at least five days before the meeting date, (b) if personally delivered or delivered by electronic mail, the same is transmitted at least two days before the meeting date, or (c) if given by facsimile, the same is transmitted and electronic confirmation of successful transmission is received at least two days prior to the convening of the meeting. Any Director may waive call or notice of any meeting (and any adjournment thereof) at any time before, during or after it is held. Attendance of a Director at any meeting will automatically evidence his or her waiver of call and notice of such meeting (and any adjournment thereof) unless he or she is attending the meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of business because the meeting has not been properly called or noticed. Any meeting, once properly called and noticed (or as to which call and notice have been waived as aforesaid) and at which a quorum is formed, may be adjourned to another time and place by a majority of those Directors in attendance.

4.5. Quorum. A quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Board will consist of a majority of those Directors duly elected, installed and entitled to vote at the meeting.

4.6. Voting. Any matter submitted to a meeting of the Board at which a quorum is present will be resolved by a majority of the votes cast thereon. In the case of equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting will have an additional or deciding vote.

4.7. Committees. The Board, from time to time, by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board, may appoint other standing or temporary committees, and vest such committees with such powers as the Board may include in its resolution; provided, however, that such committees shall be restricted in their authority as described by this Section 4.7. In accordance with the limitations on committee actions set forth in Chapter 82 of the NRS, a committee shall not have the authority of the Board in reference to the following matters: (a) the filling of vacancies on the Board or in any committee of the Board, and (b) the amendment or repeal of the Articles or the Bylaws, or the adoption of new Articles or bylaws. A member of any committee may be removed, with or

without cause, by the Board. In the event any vacancy occurs in a committee, it shall be filled by the Board. Unless otherwise specifically required pursuant to a resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board, a member of a committee need not be a Director of the Corporation; provided, however, that each committee must have at least one Director.

4.8. Presumption of Assent. A Director who is present at a meeting of the Board or of any committee at which action is taken on any matter will be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his or her dissent or abstention is entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless he or she files a written dissent or abstention to such action with the person acting as secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof. A right to dissent will not be available to a Director who voted in favor of the action.

4.9. Compensation. No Director shall receive or be entitled to receive any compensation from the Corporation by reason of serving on the Board. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a Director may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses, if any, incurred by the Director on behalf of the Corporation.

4.10. Action by Directors Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board or any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if a majority of Directors or committee members entitled to vote on the matter, as the case may be, consent thereto in writing. Such consent shall have the same effect as a majority vote of the Directors or committee members of the Corporation at a meeting duly called and noticed.

4.11. Meetings by Conference Telephone. Any member of the Board or a committee thereof may participate in any meeting of the Board or such committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communication equipment whereby all members participating in such meeting can hear one another. Such participation shall constitute attendance in person.

4.12. Removal From the Board of Directors. A Director may be removed only by a majority of the remaining members of the Board entitled to vote on the matter. The removal of a person as a Director does not automatically prevent the same person from serving as an officer.

## **V. COMMITTEES**

5.1. Committees. There shall be an Executive Committee and a Finance Committee. Changes in the membership of any body created pursuant to this Article V will be subject to the approval of the Board. A majority of all the members of any such committee, council or subcommittee may determine its action and fix the time and place of its meetings.

5.2. Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will consist of the Chairman of the Corporation, one or more Vice Chairmen of the Corporation, the Secretary of the Corporation, the Treasurer of the Corporation, the Immediate Past President of the Corporation, at least three (3) Directors chosen by the Chairman of the Corporation, and the chairpersons of various standing committees. The Chairman of the Corporation serves as chairperson of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee meets on call between regular Board meetings and assumes duties and powers as delegated by the Board. It does not assume the authority of the Board unless authorized by the Board. The Executive Committee formulates recommendations for Board action. In addition, the Executive Committee:

- a. Using external counsel as needed, reviews all legal matters affecting the Corporation and makes recommendations to the Board;
- b. Reviews the Corporation's insurance program annually and determines, with Board approval, the coverage needed by the Corporation;
- c. Handles all insurance matters involving the Corporation;
- d. Assures the establishment and implementation of a comprehensive risk management program;
- e. With the assistance and guidance of the Facilities Committee, determines the need for additional facilities and the need to extend club services to other areas;
- f. Using guidance and assistance from Boys & Girls Clubs of America, develops a master plan for extending and improving facilities and the establishment of additional service locations; and
- g. Works closely with other committees and makes periodic progress reports to the Board.

5.3. Finance Committee. The Finance Committee will consist of at least three (3) Board members, including the Treasurer. The Finance Committee will report and make recommendations to the Board concerning all the financial affairs of the Corporation.

5.4. Advisory Boards, Councils and Other Committees. The Board, or the Executive Committee if the Board grants such authority, from time to time, may create and appoint advisory boards, councils or other committees, including, without limitation, an Associate Board, a Board of Trustees, a Facilities Committee, a Marketing Committee and a Legal & Insurance Committee, whether composed of Directors, officers or employees (so long as each committee of the Corporation has at least one Director), with such duties, responsibilities and authority as may be prescribed by the Board or the Executive Committee, pursuant to the authority of the Board or the Executive Committee. Upon the creation of a new committee, advisory board or council, the responsibilities and authority of such body shall be defined in writing and approved by the Board or the Executive Committee, as appropriate.

## **VI. OFFICERS - GENERAL**

6.1. Elections and Appointments. The Board shall elect or appoint a Chairman of the Board, one or more Vice Chairmen, a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers of

the Corporation as the Board may approve. The office of the Immediate Past President shall be held by the person who has just concluded his or her term of office as the President and shall be an officer of the Corporation. A person elected or appointed to any office will serve for a one (1) year term and continue to hold that office until a successor is elected, or such officer resigns pursuant to Section 8.1 or is removed pursuant to Section 6.2. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person.

6.2. Removal; Resignation; Delegation of Duties. The Board may, whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Corporation will be served thereby, remove any officer or agent of the Corporation or temporarily delegate such officer's or agent's powers and duties to any other officer or to any Director.

6.3. Salaries. An officer may be paid reasonable compensation and shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses, if any, incurred by such officer on behalf of the Corporation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no salary or other compensation shall be paid to an individual serving as an officer of the Corporation who is also on the Board unless such compensation relates solely to such individual's capacity as an officer. The following guidelines shall be followed by the Directors when determining reasonable compensation of any officer:

- a. The Corporation's Conflict of Interest Policy must be consulted and satisfied;
- b. Compensation arrangements must be based on (i) information about compensation paid by at least three similarly situated organizations (taxable or tax-exempt) for similar services, (ii) current compensation surveys compiled by independent firms, or (iii) actual written offers from similarly-situated organizations;
- c. Compensation arrangements must be approved pursuant to this Section 6.3 in advance of any payment of compensation;
- d. The date and terms of approved compensation arrangements must be documented in writing, and the written documentation must identify (i) the members of the authorized body who were present during debate on the approved compensation arrangement, (ii) the decision made by each individual who participated in the determination of the approved compensation arrangement, (iii) the information on which the compensation arrangement was based and its source, and (iv) any actions taken, consistent with the Conflict of Interest Policy referenced in Section 6.3(a), with respect to consideration of the compensation arrangement by anyone who otherwise is authorized to vote on compensation arrangements but who had a conflict of interest with respect to the transaction.

## VII. SPECIFIC OFFICERS

7.1. Chairman. The Chairman will:

- a. preside at all meetings of the members of the Corporation and of the Board;
- b. be an ex-officio member of all committees;

- c. sign such papers as may be required by the office or as may be directed by the Board;
- d. make such reports and recommendations to the Board and to the members of the Corporation at any regular or special meetings concerning the work and affairs of the Corporation as in his or her judgment may be necessary for their information and guidance;
- e. request from the President, Secretary and Treasurer such reports as he or she determines are necessary; and
- f. perform such other duties incidental to the office.

7.2. Vice Chairmen. In the absence of the Chairman, a Vice Chairman may exercise any and all powers and perform all duties pertaining to the office of the Chairman, or conferred or imposed upon the Chairman by the Board.

7.3. President. The President will be the chief executive officer of the Corporation. The President will:

- a. attend all meetings of the Board, unless otherwise directed by the Board, and be an ex-officio member of all committees;
- b. manage the affairs and direct the work and employees of the Corporation, subject to, and in accordance with, the directions of the Board;
- c. prepare expense budgets for the approval of the Finance Committee;
- d. be authorized to incur expenses in accordance with the approved budget, or as directed by the Board; and
- e. from time to time make reports of the work and affairs of the Corporation to the Chairman, the Board and members of the Corporation at the annual and special meetings.

7.4. Secretary. The Secretary will:

- a. keep the minutes of meetings of the Board, the minutes of the meetings of any committee of the Board, and all written consents of the Board and any committee of the Board;
- b. see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by law;
- c. be custodian of the corporate seal, if any, and corporate records and, in general, will perform all duties incident to the office; and

d. except as may otherwise be specifically provided in a resolution of the Board, the Secretary and each Assistant Secretary will be a proper officer to impress the Corporation's seal, if any, on or certify any instrument signed by the Chairman, President, a Vice Chairman, or any other duly-authorized person, and to attest to the same.

7.5. Treasurer. The Treasurer will:

- a. receive all moneys of the Corporation and have custody thereof;
- b. cause all money and other valuable effects to be deposited in the name and to the credit of the Corporation in such depositories, subject to withdrawal in such manner, as may be designated by the Board;
- c. disburse such funds in accordance with the directions of, and upon the signature of, persons designated by the Board;
- d. keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the Corporation;
- e. render to the Board at proper times an account of all of his or her transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation;
- f. cause the book of account of the Corporation to be audited at least once annually by a public accountant approved by the Board;
- g. cause to be present and prepared at each annual meeting a comprehensive financial statement, including the audit report of the accountant;
- h. be responsible for preparing and filing such financial reports, financial statements and returns as may be required by law;
- i. sign such papers as may be required by his or her office or as may be directed by the Board, including giving such bonds as may be necessary to secure his or her faithful performance of the office; and perform such other duties as may be incidental to his or her office.

7.6. Immediate Past President. The Immediate Past President will assist the President in such duties as the President or the Board may request.

## **VIII. RESIGNATIONS AND VACANCIES**

8.1. Resignations. Any Director, committee member or officer may resign from his or her office at any time by written notice delivered or addressed to the Corporation at its known place of business. Any such resignation will be effective upon its receipt by the Corporation unless some later

time is therein fixed, and then from that time. The acceptance of a resignation will not be required to make it effective.

8.2. Vacancies. If the office of any Director, committee member or officer becomes vacant by reason of his or her death, resignation, disqualification, removal or otherwise, the provisions of Section 4.1, 4.7 or 6.1, as the case may be, will apply with respect to the selection of a successor to hold office for the unexpired term.

## **IX. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

The Corporation's Conflict of Interest Policy must be consulted and satisfied prior to entering into any transaction or arrangement covered by such policy. The Directors and officers of the Corporation shall annually acknowledge such policy consistent with Article 6 of such policy.

## **X. INDEMNIFICATION**

The Corporation shall, to the full extent consistent with Nevada law, indemnify the Directors, officers, employees and agents of the Corporation with respect to liabilities and expenses arising out of any action, suit or proceeding in which they become involved by reason of their affiliation with the Corporation. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the Corporation from obtaining appropriate liability insurance for any of the foregoing.

## **XI. FISCAL YEAR**

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be the calendar year.

## **XII. AMENDMENTS**

These Bylaws may be altered, amended, supplemented, repealed, or temporarily or permanently suspended, in whole or in part, or new bylaws may be adopted, by the vote of at least a majority of the voting power of the Directors then in office or, alternatively, by way of a written consent without a meeting of the Board, executed by at least a majority of the voting power of the Directors then in office.

**CERTIFICATION OF ADOPTION**

Boys & Girls Club of Las Vegas, Inc. hereby amends and restates its Articles of Incorporation in connection with the conversion, pursuant to Chapter 92A of the Nevada Revised Statutes, of such corporation from a Nevada nonprofit cooperative corporation to a Nevada nonprofit corporation that will be subject to Chapter 82 of the Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS").

The Corporation's principal place of business will be 2850 Lindell Road, Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, but its board of directors (the "Board") may meet for the transaction of business at such other places within or without the State of Nevada as the Board may, from time to time, designate.

**ARTICLE II**

**DURATION**

The duration of the Corporation shall be perpetual.

**ARTICLE III**

**PURPOSE AND POWERS**

A. The Corporation accepts Chapter 82 of the NRS and adopts these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation (these "Articles") to conform to the provisions of such chapter.

B. The Corporation is formed and organized and shall always be operated exclusively for educational and charitable activities, solely and exclusively in the interest of the general public. More specifically, the Corporation's objects, purposes and nature of business are to provide behavioral guidance and to promote the health, social, educational, vocational and character development of boys and girls, irrespective of race, color, creed or national origin; and to receive, invest and disburse funds and hold property for the purposes of the Corporation; provided, that such activities are for educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) (the "Code").

C. The Corporation's powers as aforesaid shall include, but shall not be limited to, the several powers and purposes set forth in NRS, Section 82.121, *et seq.*, as amended or renumbered, or the analogous provision of any future Nevada nonprofit corporations code, which are incorporated herein by this reference.

#### ARTICLE IV

##### TAX EXEMPT

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the Corporation shall engage only in activities that may be conducted by an organization which is described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and contributions to which are deductible pursuant to Code Sections 170(c)(2), 642(c), 2055 and 2522.

#### ARTICLE V

##### INITIAL BUSINESS

The Corporation's initial activities will include educating teens and young adults.

#### ARTICLE VI

##### EARNINGS; LOBBYING; LIQUIDATION

A. The Corporation shall not be for profit or pecuniary gain and shall have no capital stock or shares. No part of any net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any officer or director of the Corporation or any private individual, or be appropriated for any purposes other than the purposes of the Corporation as set forth in these Articles; provided, however, that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation as set forth in these Articles.

B. No substantial part of the Corporation's activities shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation (except as otherwise provided in Section 501(h) of the Code). The Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.

C. Upon the winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the Board shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of its assets to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or religious and/or scientific purposes, and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, as the Board shall determine. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, to such

organization(s), as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

## **ARTICLE VII**

### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS**

The Corporation's affairs shall be conducted by the Board, which shall be composed of not less than 10 nor more than 45 voting members, notwithstanding any non-voting members of any advisory board appointed by the Board in accordance with the bylaws of the Corporation (the "Bylaws"). The Board may adjust the number of directors within the aforesaid limits and shall fill any vacancies occurring in the Board pursuant to the Bylaws.

## **ARTICLE VIII**

### **PRIVATE PROPERTY**

The private property of the directors and officers of the Corporation shall be forever exempt from the debts, obligations and liabilities of the Corporation.

## **ARTICLE IX**

### **MEMBERSHIP AND CAPITAL STOCK**

The Corporation shall have no capital stock of any kind. The membership of the Corporation shall consist of the members of the Board. The members shall have no property rights in the Corporation.

## **ARTICLE X**

### **INDEMNIFICATION**

A. Every person who was or is a party to, or is threatened to be made a party to, or is involved in any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that such person, or a person of whom such person is the legal representative, is or was a director or officer of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director or officer of another corporation, or as its representative in a partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, shall be indemnified and held harmless to the fullest extent legally permissible under the laws of the State of Nevada in effect from time to time against all expenses, liability and loss (including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid or to be paid in settlement) reasonably incurred or suffered by such person in connection therewith. Such right of indemnification shall be a contract right that may be enforced in any manner desired by such person.

B. The expenses of officers and directors incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding must be paid by the Corporation as they are incurred and in advance of the final disposition of the action, suit or proceeding, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on


