DNR offers si maps of gove

Six updated maps showing state, federal and other public lands in sections of Washington State are now available. The maps, which are popular with outdoor recreationists and others, are part of a set of 49 maps produced by the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the state's official mapping agency.

The six full-color maps announced today display public lands and other features around the Clarkston, Colville, Republic, Skykomish River, Wenatchee, and Yakima areas. Each map is 1:100,000 scale and approximately 26 x 37 inches in size when opened.

In addition to showing state trust lands managed by DNR, the maps identify lands managed by the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, and several federal agencies. Other features include highways, roads and trails; public recreation sites; water features, and geographic names, all shown on a shaded relief background indicating terrain.
