## Amended and Restated By-Laws of Chicago Fire Foundation

April 29, 2009

#### **ARTICLE I**

#### Name

Section 1. Name. The name of the corporation shall be Chicago Fire Foundation.

#### **ARTICLE II**

#### <u>Purposes</u>

- Section 1. Not For Profit. The corporation is organized under and shall operate as an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, and shall have such powers as are now or as may hereafter be granted by the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986, as amended (the "Act").
- Section 2. <u>Purposes</u>. The purposes of the corporation are charitable and educational within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including but not limited to the furtherance of the charitable efforts of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC, namely the development of economically disadvantaged children.
- Section 3. Rules. The following rules shall conclusively bind the corporation and all persons acting for or in behalf of it:
  - No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the a. benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these by-laws, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the

corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

- b. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), as the board of directors shall determine. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of common pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
- c. The corporation shall not adopt any practice, policy or procedure which would result in discrimination on the basis of race, religion, or creed.

#### <u>ARTICLE III</u>

#### Registered Office, Agent and Seal

- Section 1. Registered Office and Agent. The corporation shall have and continuously maintain in the State of Illinois a registered office and a registered agent whose office shall be identical with such registered office, and may have such other offices within or without the State if Illinois and such other registered agents as the board of directors may from time to time determine.
- Section 2. Seal. The board of directors shall provide a corporate seal which shall be in the form of a circle and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the words "Corporate Seal, Illinois."

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Members

Section 1. <u>No Members</u>. The corporation shall have no members. Any provision of the Act requiring notice to, the presence of, or the vote, consent or other action by members of the corporation in connection with such matter shall be satisfied by

notice to, the presence of, or the vote, consent or other action of the board of directors of the corporation.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Officers

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, one or more vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and such other officers as may be determined by the board of directors. The board of directors may elect or appoint such other officers as it shall deem desirable, such officers to have authority to perform the duties prescribed from time to time by the board of directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person. Officers need not be residents of Illinois.
- Section 2. Election and Term of Office. The officers other than the president shall be elected by the board of directors for an annual term after their nomination is approved by the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC. The president shall be nominated by the honorary chairman and approved by the board of directors for an annual term. The officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the board of directors nearest the expiration of their term of office and shall serve until their successors have been duly elected and have qualified. Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the board of directors, but any vacancy in the office of president shall only be filled after nomination of such individual by the honorary chairman and any vacancy in any other officer position shall only be filled after approval of the nomination of such individual by the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC.
- Section 3. Removal and Resignation. Any officer may be removed by the board of directors whenever the board of directors determines in its judgment that the best interests of the corporation would be served thereby. Any officer may resign at any time, subject to any rights or obligations under any existing contracts between the officer and the corporation, by giving written notice to the president or the secretary of the corporation. An officer's resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the corporation unless the notice specifies a later effective date, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. An officer shall be deemed to have resigned in the event of such officer's incapacity as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- Section 4. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the board of directors for the unexpired portion of the term.
- Section 5. President. The president shall, in general, supervise and control all of the affairs of the corporation. He shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors and shall chair those meetings of the board of directors. He may sign, with the secretary or any other proper officer of the corporation authorized by the board of directors, any deeds, mortgages, contracts, or other instruments which the board of directors have authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution

thereof shall be expressly delegated by the board of directors or by these by-laws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the corporation. The president shall, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of president and such other duties as may be prescribed by the board of directors from time to time.

- Section 6. <u>Vice President</u>. In the absence of the president or in the event of his inability or refusal to act, the vice president (or in the event there be more than one vice president, the vice presidents, in the order designated, or in the absence of any designation, then in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the president, and when so acting shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the president. Any vice president shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the president or by the board of directors.
- Section 7. Secretary. The secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the board of directors in one or more books provided for that purpose; see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or as required by law; be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the corporation and see that the seal of the corporation is affixed to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the corporation under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws; and, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of the secretary and other such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the president or the board of directors.
- Section 8. <u>Treasurer</u>. If required by the board of directors, the treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the board of directors shall determine. He shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the corporation; receive and give receipts for monies due and payable to the corporation from any sources whatsoever, and deposit all such monies in the name of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws; and in general perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the president or by the board of directors.
- Section 9. Assistant Treasurers and Assistant Secretaries. If required by the board of directors, the assistant treasurers shall give bonds for the faithful discharge of their duties in such sums and with such sureties as the board of directors shall determine. The assistant treasurers and assistant secretaries, in general, shall perform such duties as shall be assigned to them by the treasurer or the secretary or by the president or the board of directors.
- Section 10. <u>Compensation of Officers and Employees</u>. The salaries and any other compensation of the officers and employees of the corporation shall be recommended by the board of directors to the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC, but shall be finally determined by the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **Board of Directors**

Section 1. <u>General Powers</u>. Except as otherwise provided in the Act, the articles of incorporation or these by-laws, all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of, and the business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by, its board of directors.

#### Section 2. Qualifications, Number, Classification, Election and Tenure.

- a. <u>Number and Qualifications</u>. The number of directors shall be no less than twelve nor more than seventeen. Directors need not be residents of Illinois.
- b. <u>Classification</u>. At the first meeting of the board of directors following the adoption of these by-laws, classification of the directors shall be made by dividing them into three classes. The composition of each class shall be jointly proposed by the honorary chairman and the chairman and approved by the board of directors. The term of office of the directors of the first class shall expire at the end of the first annual meeting of the board of directors held after such classification; the term of office of the directors of the second annual meeting of the board of directors held after such classification; and the term of office of the directors of the third class shall expire at the end of the third annual meeting of the board of directors after such classification. Except as set forth in this Section 2(b), the term of each director shall be three years.
- c. <u>Election and Tenure</u>. At each annual meeting of the board of directors after the classification described in Section 2(b) above, the number of directors equal to the number of vacancies on the board shall be appointed by the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC, to hold office until the end of the third succeeding annual meeting. Each director so elected shall hold office until such director's term expires and thereafter until such director's successor shall have been elected and qualified, or until such director's earlier death, resignation or removal. Directors may be reappointed for additional terms.
- d. <u>Honorary Chairman</u>. The corporation's board of directors shall have an honorary chairman, who shall be a director. The honorary chairman shall be appointed by the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC.
- Section 3. Resignation, Removal and Vacancies. Any director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the president or the secretary of the corporation. A

director's resignation shall take effect at the time specified in such notice, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. A director shall be deemed to have resigned in the event of such director's incapacity as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction. Any director may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC. Any vacancy of an elected director may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer. LLC. A director elected, appointed or designated to fill a vacancy shall hold the office for the unexpired term of such director's predecessor in office and thereafter until such director's successor shall have been elected and qualified, or until such director's earlier death, resignation or removal. Any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of directors shall be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC, and a director so chosen shall hold office until the next election of the class of directors for which such director was chosen and thereafter until such director's successor shall have been elected and qualified, or until such director's earlier death, resignation or removal. A vacancy that will occur at a specific later date may be filled before the vacancy occurs, but the new director may not take office until the vacancy occurs.

- Section 4. Regular Meetings. A regular annual meeting of the board of directors shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by resolution of the board of directors. The board of directors may provide by resolution the time and place, either within or without the State of Illinois, for the holding of additional regular meetings of the board of directors without other notice than such resolution.
- Section 5. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the board of directors may be called by or at the request of the president or any two directors. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the board may fix any place, either within or without the State of Illinois, as the place for holding any special meeting of the board of directors called by them.
- Section 6. Notice. Notice of any special meeting of the board of directors shall be given at least three days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or sent by mail to each director, deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid or by any electronic means. If notice be given by mail, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered on the day following the day such notice is deposited in the United States mail. If notice be given by electronic means, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when transmitted. Any director may waive notice of any meeting.
- Section 7. <u>Deemed Assent</u>. A director of the corporation who is present at a meeting of the board of directors when corporate action is taken is deemed to have assented to all action taken at the meeting unless (i) the director objects at the beginning of the meeting, or promptly upon the director's arrival, to holding the meeting or transacting business at the meeting and does not thereafter vote for or assent to any action taken at the meeting, or (ii) the director contemporaneously requests the director's dissent or abstention as to any specific action taken be entered in the minutes of the meeting, or

- (iii) the director causes written notice of the director's dissent or abstention as to any specific action to be received by the presiding officer of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or by the corporation promptly after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right of dissension or abstention is not available to a director who votes in favor of the action taken.
- Section 8. Quorum. A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the board of directors, provided, that if less than a majority of the directors are present at said meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.
- **Section 9.** Manner of Acting. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the board of directors, except where otherwise provided by law or by these by-laws.
- Section 10. <u>Informal Action by Directors</u>. Any action required to be taken or which may be taken at a meeting of the board of directors may be taken without a meeting if consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof.
- Section 11. <u>Meetings by Telephone</u>. Members of the board of directors or any committee thereof may participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through the use of, any means of communication by which all directors participating may hear each other during the meeting. A director participating in a meeting by this means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.
- Section 12. <u>Compensation</u>. Directors shall not receive salaries for their services as such; however, by resolution of the board of directors, a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the board of directors. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

#### Committees

- Section 1. <u>Committees of Directors</u>. The board of directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may designate one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors, which committees, to the extent provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the board of directors in management of the corporation, but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the board of directors, or any individual director, of any responsibility imposed upon them by law.
- Section 2. Other Committees. Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the board of directors in the management of the corporation may be designated by a resolution adopted by a majority of the directors present at a meeting at

which a quorum is present. Except as otherwise provided in such resolution, members of each such committee shall be directors of the corporation, and the president of the corporation shall appoint the members thereof. Any member thereof may be removed by the board of directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the corporation shall be served by such removal.

- **Section 3.** <u>Term of Office</u>. Each member of a committee shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the board of directors of the corporation and until his successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member shall cease to qualify as a member thereof.
- **Section 4.** Committee Chairman. One member of each committee shall be appointed chairman of such committee.
- Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u>. Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner provided in the case of original appointments.
- **Section 6.** Quorum. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the board of directors designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.
- Section 7. Rules. Each committee may adopt rules for its own government not inconsistent with these by-laws or with rules adopted by the board of directors.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### Contracts, Checks, Deposits and Funds

- Section 1. <u>Contracts</u>. The board of directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these by-laws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation, shall be signed by such officer, officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the board of directors. In the absence of such determination by the board of directors, such instruments shall be signed by the treasurer or an assistant treasurer and countersigned by the president or a vice president of the corporation.
- Section 3. <u>Deposits</u>. All funds of the corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the board of directors may select.

Section 4. Gifts. The board of directors may accept on behalf of the corporation any contribution, gift, grant, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the corporation. Donor-designated contributions will be accepted for special funds, purposes or uses, and such designations generally will be honored. However, the corporation shall reserve all right, title and interest in and to and control over such contributions, and shall have authority to determine the ultimate expenditure or distribution thereof in connection with any such special fund, purpose or use. Further, the corporation shall acquire and retain sufficient control over all donated funds (including designated contributions) to assure that such funds will be used exclusively to carry out the corporation's tax-exempt purposes.

#### **ARTICLE IX**

#### **Books and Records**

Section 1. <u>Books and Records</u>. The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its board of directors and committees having any of the authority of the board of directors.

#### **ARTICLE X**

#### Fiduciary Matters

**Section 1.** <u>Indemnification</u>. The corporation shall indemnify all officers and directors of the corporation to the fullest extent permitted by the Act and shall be entitled to purchase insurance for such indemnification of officers and directors to the fullest extent as determined from time to time by the board of directors of the corporation.

#### Section 2. General Standards of Conduct for Directors and Officers.

- a. <u>Discharge of Duties</u>. Each director shall discharge the director's duties as a director, including the director's duties as a member of a committee of the board of directors, and each officer with discretionary authority shall discharge the officer's duties under that authority (i) in good faith, (ii) with the care an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances and (iii) in a manner the director or officer reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the corporation.
- b. Reliance on Information, Reports, Etc. In discharging duties, a director or officer is entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, if prepared or presented by (i) one or more officers or employees of the corporation whom the director or officer reasonably believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented, (ii) legal counsel, a public accountant or another person as to matters the director or officer reasonably believes are within

such person's professional or expert competence or (iii) in the case of a director, a committee of the board of directors of which the director is not a member if the director reasonably believes the committee merits confidence. A director or officer is not acting in good faith if the director or officer has knowledge concerning the matter in question that makes reliance otherwise permitted by this Section 2(b) unwarranted.

- c. <u>Liability to the Corporation</u>. A director or officer shall not be liable as such to the corporation for any action taken or omitted to be taken as a director or officer, as the case may be, if, in connection with such action or omission, the director or officer performed the duties of the position in compliance with the standards of conduct set forth in this Section 2.
- d. <u>Director Not Deemed to Be a "Trustee"</u>. A director, regardless of title, shall not be deemed to be a "trustee" within the meaning given that term by trust law with respect to the corporation or with respect to any property held or administered by the corporation including, without limitation, property that may be subject to restrictions imposed by the donor or transferor of such property.

#### Section 3. Conflicts of Interest.

<u>Definition</u>. A conflict of interest arises when any "responsible a. person" or any "party related to a responsible person" has an "interest adverse to the corporation." A "responsible person" is any individual in a position to exercise substantial influence over the affairs of the corporation, and specifically includes, without limitation, directors and officers of the corporation. A "party related to a responsible person" includes his or her extended family (including spouse, ancestors, descendants and siblings, and their respective spouses and descendants), an estate or trust in which the responsible person or any member of his or her extended family has a beneficial interest or a fiduciary responsibility, or an entity in which the responsible person or any member of his or her extended family is a director, trustee or officer or has a financial interest. "An interest adverse to the corporation" includes any interest in any contract, transaction or other financial relationship with the corporation, and any interest in an entity whose best interests may be impaired by the best interests of the corporation including, without limitation, an entity providing any goods or services to or receiving any goods or services from the corporation, an entity in which the corporation has any business or financial interest, and an entity providing goods or services or performing activities similar to the goods or services or activities of the corporation.

- b. <u>Disclosure</u>. If a responsible person is aware that the corporation is about to enter into any transaction or make any decision involving a conflict of interest, (a "conflicting interest transaction"), such person shall (i) immediately inform those charged with approving the conflicting interest transaction on behalf of the corporation of the interest or position of such person or any party related to such person, (ii) aid the persons charged with making the decision by disclosing any material facts within the responsible person's knowledge that bear on the advisability of the corporation entering into the conflicting interest transaction and (iii) not be entitled to vote on the decision to enter into such transaction.
- c. Approval of Conflicting Interest Transactions. The corporation may enter into a conflicting interest transaction provided either (i) the material facts as to the responsible person's relationship or interest and as to the conflicting interest transaction are disclosed or are known to the board of directors or to a committee of the board of directors that authorizes, approves or ratifies the conflicting interest transaction, and the board or committee in good faith authorizes, approves or ratifies the conflicting interest transaction by the affirmative vote of a majority of the disinterested directors on the board or committee, even though the disinterested directors are less than a quorum, or (ii) the conflicting interest transaction is fair as to the corporation.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### Miscellaneous

- **Section 1.** <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the corporation shall be determined by the board of directors.
- Section 2. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Whenever any notice whatsoever is required to be given under the provisions of the Act or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation or the by-laws of the corporation, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.
- Section 3. Amendments to By-Laws. These by-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new by-laws may be adopted by a majority of the directors present at any regular meeting or at any special meeting, provided that at least fifteen days' written notice is given of intention to alter, amend or repeal and to adopt new by-laws at such meeting. All amendments must receive the approval of the Managers of Chicago Fire Soccer, LLC in order to be valid and effective.
- Section 4. <u>Principles of Construction</u>. Words in any gender shall be deemed to include the other gender; the singular shall be deemed to include the plural and

vice versa; the words "pay" and "distribute" shall also mean assign, convey and deliver; and the table of contents, headings and underlined paragraph titles are for guidance and shall have no significance in the interpretation of these by-laws.

Section 5. Severability. The invalidity of any provision of these by-laws shall not affect the other provisions hereof, and in such event these by-laws shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid provision were omitted.
