**1. Summary of significant accounting policies:**

**Organization:**

Preeclampsia Foundation (the Organization) is incorporated under the laws of the state of Washington as a non-profit organization operating exclusively for charitable purposes. The primary purpose of the Organization is to reduce maternal and infant illness and death due to preeclampsia by supporting innovative research, raising public awareness, and helping women access safe reproductive technology, support and care. The organizational mission is fulfilled in numerous ways; including dissemination of educational brochures in English and Spanish, the Vision Grant Program supporting the efforts of young investigators, development of outreach campaigns, and on-line Forums that create a sense of community for personal and emotional support as well as access to accurate and current information about preeclampsia.

The Organization has been granted exemption from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and applicable sections of Washington Statutes. The Organization has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation.

**Use of estimates:**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from the estimates.

**Basis for presentation:**

The Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Assets accumulated and resources received and expended by the Organization are either unrestricted as to use or purpose or restricted by the donor for a particular purpose. Permanently restricted net assets account for donations restricted for specific purposes whereby the restriction does not expire. The Organization records contributions as temporarily restricted if they are received with donor stipulations that limit their use either through purpose or time restrictions. When donor restrictions expire, that is, when a time restriction ends or a purpose restriction is fulfilled, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets. The Organization had temporarily restricted net assets of \$21,615 and \$19,115 as of December 31, 2009 and 2008, respectively. At December 31, 2009 and 2008 there were no permanently restricted net assets.

Donor-restricted contributions in which restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as temporarily restricted support with an accompanying reclassification for the satisfaction of the restriction.

**1. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued):**

**Cash and cash equivalents:**

Cash and cash equivalents includes demand accounts with banks, and money market accounts and certificates of deposit with an initial maturity of three months or less.

**Certificate of deposits:**

The Organization holds two certificates of deposit. At December 31, 2009 and 2008 the historical cost and fair value of the certificates of deposit was \$194,050 and \$188,009, respectively. Interest income of \$6,041 and \$8,009 was earned on the certificates of deposit for the years ended December 31, 2009 and 2008, respectively, and is included in interest income on the statements of activities and changes in net assets.

**Promises to give:**

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets. Contributions receivable due within one year at December 31, 2009 and 2008 were \$5,850 and \$71,932, respectively.

The Organization uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible unconditional contributions receivable. There is no allowance at December 31, 2009 and 2008. Based upon prior years' experience and management's analysis of outstanding receivables as of December 31, 2009, an allowance is not considered necessary.

**Property and equipment:**

Property and equipment are carried at the lower of depreciated cost or net realizable value. Donated property and equipment are valued at fair market value at the date of the gift. The Organization uses a capitalization policy of \$500. Depreciation is provided on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets. Expenditures for major renewals and betterments that extend the useful lives of property and equipment are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as incurred. When items of property or equipment are sold or retired, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts, and any gain or loss is included in income.

**Donated materials and services:**

The fair market value of donated materials and services are estimated based upon the cost of comparable materials and services. Donated materials and services are recorded as public support and expense when such materials and services create or enhance non-financial assets or require specialized skills, are performed by people with those skills, and would otherwise be purchased by the Organization. Donated materials and supplies consisted of auction items contributed to the Organization totaling approximately \$17,000 and \$20,000 for the years ended December 31, 2009 and 2008, respectively. Contributed services consisted of design for the annual report and website hosting and management totaling approximately \$0 and \$700 for the years ended December 31, 2009 and 2008, respectively.

No amounts have been reflected in the statements for services by volunteers who have donated significant amounts of time to the Organization's program services.

**Functional allocation of expenses:**

The majority of expenses can generally be directly identified with the program or supporting services to which they relate and are charged accordingly. Other expenses by function have been allocated between program and supporting services classifications based on the best estimates of management.

**Reclassifications:**

Certain accounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform to the presentation in the current year financial statements.

**2. Restriction on net assets:**

Temporarily restricted net assets at December 31, 2009 and 2008 consist of contributions received for book publication, educational DVD production and time restrictions. The Organization did not release any net assets from donor restrictions during the year ended December 31, 2009 and released \$78,625 during the year ended December 31, 2008.
