Briefly describe the organization's mission

Good Samaritan Hospital, Corvallis (GSH) is a member of Samaritan Health Services (SHS), a regional network of hospitals, physicians and senior care facilities. The filing organization submits an annual community benefit report to the State of Oregon. In addition, the parent organization, Samaritan Health Services (SHS) provides an annual report to the community that includes community benefit reporting for the system as a whole

Physician clinics meeting the definition of subsidized health services were included in the reporting for line 7g. The portion of net community benefit expense related to these clinics is \$16,691,003

The costing methodology used to calculate the amounts reported in Schedule H, Part I, line 7a and 7b is a cost-to-charge ratio derived using Worksheet 2, Ratio of Patient Care Cost-to-Charges from the Schedule H instructions. For line 7g, a combination of the cost-to-charge ratio and cost accounting system calculations is used since not all services are tracked in the cost accounting system.

The costing methodology used to calculate bad debt expense (at cost) on line 2 of Part III is based on the facility cost-to-charge ratio, in conjunction with Worksheet A from the Schedule H, Part III instructions Line 3 represents an estimate of the amount of cost included in Line 2 (bad debt expense at cost) that reasonably could be attributable to patients who likely would qualify for financial assistance under the organization's charity care policy, but for whom the organization was not able to obtain sufficient information to make a determination. The methodology used to estimate this potential charity care cost is based on financial assistance applications denied due to incomplete documentation, multiplied by the average charity care write-off for approved applications Good Samaritan Hospital (GSH) is the largest of five hospitals of Samaritan Health Services (SHS). As a network, SHS prepares its financial statements on a consolidated basis. Footnote 1(r) from the audited consolidated financial statements entitled "Provision for Uncollectible Accounts" describes bad debt expense as follows "SHS provides for an allowance against patient accounts receivable for amounts that could become uncollectible SHS estimates this allowance based on the aging of accounts receivable, historical collection experience by payor, and other relevant factors. There are various factors that can impact the collection trends, such as changes in the economy, which in turn have an impact on unemployment rates and the number of uninsured and underinsured patients, the increased burden of copayments to be made by patients with insurance coverage and business practices related to collection efforts. These factors continuously change and can have an impact on collection trends and the estimation process used by SHS."

Total Medicare allowable costs reported on Part III, Section B, line 6 is calculated by utilizing Worksheet B in the Schedule H instructions in conjunction with amounts taken directly from the filing organization's Medicare cost report. The cost report includes activity for Medicare fee-for-service patients but not Medicare managed care patients. In addition, certain costs of providing healthcare services, such as physician compensation, are not allowable on the Medicare cost reports. Therefore, the amount of Medicare shortfall shown on Line 7 is smaller than the shortfall calculation using revenue and cost data for ALL Medicare patient activity, as follows. Net revenue received from Medicare (all Medicare patient programs) 72,207,003Medicare costs (based on a cost-to-charge ratio). 82,939,893Unpaid cost of providing services to ALL Medicare patients. (10,732,890)

Per hospital guidelines, if a patient is determined to qualify for financial assistance prior to sending an account to collections, the charity write-off is processed and no collection attempt is made. If an account is already in collections and Medicaid eligibility is deemed active during the account date of service, no further collection attempt will be made.

2 Needs assessment. Describe how the organization assesses the health care needs of the communities it serves

Good Samaritan Hospital (GSH) actively participates in assessing the health care needs of the community. GSH partners with United Way, the City of Corvallis, Benton County government, Oregon State University, and other non-profit organizations in the community every three years to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment. Both quantitative and qualitative data are collected by researchers from county residents to help identify needs and establish priorities for the community. This process includes telephone surveys, focus groups, community forums and personal interviews with several community members from throughout Benton County.

3 Patient education of eligibility for assistance. Describe how the organization informs and educates patients and persons who may be billed for patient care about their eligibility for assistance under federal, state, or local government programs or under the organization's charity care policy

The organization is committed to providing highest quality healthcare services to all, regardless of their ability to pay. If qualifications are met, patients' care may be provided free or at a reduced cost. The determination is based in part on poverty income guidelines issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Once a completed financial questionnaire has been submitted, individuals/families at or below 200 percent of the established Federal Poverty Level (FPL) could be eligible to receive free or discounted care (charity care). The organization informs and educates patients and community members by publishing information regarding all financial assistance options on its website, in addition to in person at the Registration area, and through clearly identified materials located in the Registration area.

4 Community information. Describe the community the organization serves, taking into account the geographic area and demographic constituents it serves

GSH primarily serves the residents of Benton County However, residents from the adjoining communities of Lincoln and Linn counties are also seen at GSH. With a total population of 86,725 (US Census Bureau), Benton County is designated as an urban county. The County includes the cities of Corvallis and Philomath as well as the small incorporated townships of Monroe and Adair Village. Approximately 21% of Benton County residents live in rural areas of the county. The median household income for Benton County is \$70,800, and 15.6% of the residents live below the federal poverty level. According to the Oregon Office of Rural Health, 17.1% of Benton County residents are uninsured. Portions of Benton County have designations of Medically Underserved Areas and Medically Underserved Populations according to the Health Resources and Services Administration, with GSH being the only hospital located in Benton County.

5 Community building activities. Describe how the organization's community building activities, as reported in Part II, promote the health of the communities the organization serves

GSH provides services and activities that are classified as community building. This includes leading disaster preparedness drills with local agencies and staff participating in one-on-one mentoring programs at a local school. GSH also provides opportunities for community members to obtain training on civic and cultural issues that impact health. Some of the training opportunities included grant writing and board development. GSH staff serve on many local coalitions and boards that promote the health of the community. Board affiliation includes, but is not limited to Community Outreach Inc., the Grace Center, the Center for Healthy Aging Research/Scientific Advisory Board, and the Caring Place. Additionally GSH staff serve on the Oregon Health Policy Advisory Board, the Oregon Health Resources Commission, the Medicaid Advisory Committee and regional boards that address health care issues.

 GSH's governing board is comprised of local-area residents. The majority of the board members are independent, meaning they and their family members are not employees of GSH nor do they have any significant business relationships with GSH. GSH extends its medical staff privileges to all qualified physicians in the community. GSH applies surplus funds to improve patient care, medical education and research. GSH invests in updating equipment, technology and facilities to improve patient care. GSH is accredited for continuing medical education and offers weekly programs for area physicians and other health professionals. The Center for Health Research and Quality, a department of GSH's parent company, Samaritan Health Services (SHS), provides administrative oversight for health and clinical research, quality improvement projects and studies, and other sponsored activities for GSH and its affiliated hospitals. GSH also contributes financially to the Linn-Benton Community College nursing program.
- 7 If the organization is part of an affiliated health care system, describe the respective roles of the organization and its affiliates in promoting the health of the communities served

"Building Healthier Communities Together" is the commitment of, and the motivation for, Samaritan Health Services (SHS), a network of Oregon hospitals, physicians, and senior care facilities that serves the health care needs of people in the mid-Willamette Valley and the Central Oregon Coast As the individual entities of SHS came together to build healthier communities, they were drawn by a shared mission "to enhance community health and achieve high value through quality services across the continuum of care "That means SHS looks carefully at local health care needs, and it gives thoughtful consideration to the most effective ways to meet those needs. The result is a rich mix of local and centralized regional services which provide high value and excellent healthcare for people at all stages of their lives. Services are provided to all individuals, regardless of their ability to pay. The collective vision of SHS is to successfully operate as a values-driven, church-related organization governed by a partnership of community members, physicians and other health care providers.
