FUNDING PRIORITIES

The Foundation gives priority to projects and programs targeted by members of The Chambers Family Foundation in the fields of arts, education, medical, health, and human needs in Lane, Benton and Deschutes Counties in Oregon.

The Foundation will consider those projects with the greatest potential for furthering Foundation values and for benefiting the community. Additionally, we seek projects that result in assisting individuals to achieve their highest potential.

For larger requests (over \$5,000), preference is given to specific projects over general operating support; prevention over rehabilitation; underlying causes for concern rather than short-term symptoms, and independent charitable organizations over traditionally taxpayer supported organizations.

The Foundation generally will not make more than one grant per organization per year. Typically, grants are made with no implied renewals, but we will entertain multi-year proposals in appropriate circumstances.

The Foundation will examine on a continuing basis the quality of its funded programs by evaluating what is accomplished against what could and should be accomplished.

PROPOSAL REVIEW AND GRANT DECISIONS

Proposals are normally reviewed and funding decisions made during the months of May and November.

Proposals can be submitted at any time but must be received in their entirety by March 31 or September 30 to be considered at the next Trustees' meeting.

The Foundation will focus its assessment on the quality and potential of the project rather than the quality of the written grant proposal.

If a proposal has been declined, but the Foundation indicates it would be appropriate, it may be resubmitted for consideration at a later time.
