The filing organization submits an annual community benefit report to the State of Oregon. In addition, the parent organization, Samaritan Health Services (SHS) provides an annual report to the community that includes community benefit reporting for the system as a whole

Physician clinics meeting the definition of subsidized health services were included in the reporting for line 7g. The portion of net community benefit expense related to these clinics is \$2,680,174

The costing methodology used to calculate the amounts reported in Schedule H, Part I, line 7a and 7b is a cost-to-charge ratio derived using Worksheet 2, Ratio of Patient Care Cost-to-Charges from the Schedule H instructions. For line 7g, a combination of the cost-to-charge ratio and cost accounting system calculations is used since not all services are tracked in the cost accounting system.

The costing methodology used to calculate bad debt expense (at cost) on line 2 of Part III is based on the facility cost-to-charge ratio, in conjunction with Worksheet A from the Schedule H, Part III instructions Line 3 represents an estimate of the amount of cost included in Line 2 (bad debt expense at cost) that reasonably could be attributable to patients who likely would qualify for financial assistance under the organization's charity care policy, but for whom the organization was not able to obtain sufficient information to make a determination. The methodology used to estimate this potential charity care cost is based on financial assistance applications denied due to incomplete documentation, multiplied by the average charity care write-off for approved applications. Samaritan Pacific Health Services (SPHS), includes Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital (SPCH) one of five hospitals of Samaritan Health Services (SHS). As a network, SHS prepares its financial statements on a consolidated basis. Footnote 1(r) from the audited consolidated financial statements entitled "Provision for Uncollectible Accounts" describes bad debt expense as follows "SHS provides for an allowance against patient accounts receivable for amounts that could become uncollectible SHS estimates this allowance based on the aging of accounts receivable, historical collection experience by payor, and other relevant factors. There are various factors that can impact the collection trends, such as changes in the economy, which in turn have an impact on unemployment rates and the number of uninsured and underinsured patients, the increased burden of copayments to be made by patients with insurance coverage and business practices related to collection efforts. These factors continuously change and can have an impact on collection trends and the estimation process used by SHS."

Total Medicare allowable costs reported on Part III, Section B, line 6 is calculated by utilizing Worksheet B in the Schedule H instructions in conjunction with amounts taken directly from the filing organization's Medicare cost report. The cost report includes activity for Medicare fee-for-service patients but not Medicare managed care patients.

Per hospital guidelines, if a patient is determined to qualify for financial assistance prior to sending an account to collections, the charity write-off is processed and no collection attempt is made. If an account is already in collections and Medicaid eligibility is deemed active during the account date of service, no further collection attempt will be made.

2 Needs assessment. Describe how the organization assesses the health care needs of the communities it serves

Samaritan Pacific Health Services (SPHS) actively participates in assessing the health care needs of the community SPHS works closely with the Community Health Improvement Partnership (CHIP) Coordinator to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment every few years. The CHIP Coordinator facilitates the needs assessment process in alignment with the Oregon Pacific Area Health Education Center (OPAHEC) and several community partners. Both quantitative and qualitative data are collected by the Coordinator and OPAHEC staff from county residents to help identify needs and establish priorities for the community. This process includes telephone surveys, focus groups, community forums and personal interviews with several community members from throughout Lincoln County.

3 Patient education of eligibility for assistance. Describe how the organization informs and educates patients and persons who may be billed for patient care about their eligibility for assistance under federal, state, or local government programs or under the organization's charity care policy

The organization is committed to providing highest quality healthcare services to all, regardless of their ability to pay. If qualifications are met, patients' care may be provided free or at a reduced cost. The determination is based in part on poverty income guidelines issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Once a completed financial questionnaire has been submitted, individuals/families at or below 200 percent of the established Federal Poverty Level (FPL) could be eligible to receive free or discounted care (charity care). The organization informs and educates patients and community members by publishing information regarding all financial assistance options on its website, in addition to in person at the Registration area, and through clearly identified materials located in the Registration area.

4 Community information. Describe the community the organization serves, taking into account the geographic area and demographic constituents it serves

Samaritan Pacific Health Services (SPHS) operates Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital (SPCH), a critical-access hospital located in Newport that primarily serves the residents in southern Lincoln County. Located on a primarily rural portion of Oregon's central coast, Lincoln County is home to 44,700 residents. Within Lincoln County, the large tribal population is disproportionately burdened by health inequities. There are 4,660 enrolled tribal members of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, of which 21.6% live in Lincoln County. Lincoln County lacks a major metropolitan area and consists of many small communities scattered throughout the region. Newport is the county seat and has a population of 10,600. Lincoln City is the second largest town and has a population of 7,930. The median income for Lincoln County is \$50,000, with 16.8% living below the federal poverty level. Thirty-eight percent of the population lives in rural unincorporated areas and 14.7% of residents are uninsured. Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital, located in Lincoln City, is a sister hospital in northern Lincoln County serving local residents.
