#### **HISTORY**

In 1988, the Mortimer Fleishhacker Foundation (established in 1947) merged with the Janet and Mortimer Fleishhacker Foundation. The two are now jointly administered as the Fleishhacker Foundation.

The Foundation has two grantmaking program areas: Arts & Culture, and Precollegiate Education (K-12 level). Assets are approximately \$13 million. Correspondence should be addressed to Christine Elbel, Executive Director.

#### **GRANTS IN THE ARTS**

# **Small Grants in the Arts**

The majority of the Foundation's arts grantmaking takes place through this program. Grants between \$1,000 and \$10,000 are made to support a range of artistic efforts within the following disciplines: dance, film/video and media arts, interdisciplinary arts, music, theater, and visual arts. This grant program serves organizations with budgets between \$100,000 and \$750,000. Separate guidelines should be requested before applying.

#### Eureka Fellowship Program

The Foundation offers an unrestricted fellowship program for visual artists. Artists must be nominated by a local nonprofit arts organization to qualify. Awards of \$25,000 per artist are determined by a review panel of non-Bay Area arts experts. The process of selecting artists for the 2008 – 2010 awards has been completed. General applications are not accepted.

#### **Special Arts Grants**

Periodically grants which exceed the scope of the Small Grants Program are considered. Applicants must have budgets larger than \$750,000, and must be able to clearly demonstrate the project's potential for broad and long term impact. Community benefit and enhancement of an arts discipline are primary considerations. Grants generally do not exceed \$25,000. Potential applicants should consult with the Foundation's Executive Director before applying. Applications for large capital facility projects (campaigns over \$10 million total) are not considered. Endowment requests are not considered.

#### **BOARD DISCRETIONARY GRANTS**

Board members may periodically use limited discretionary funds to support programs of special interest. Such grants are not open to application.

#### **GRANTS IN EDUCATION**

# **Application Guidelines**

Due to economic uncertainties, at the current time the Foundation plans to make more limited grants for core programs, and will not be accepting applications for new programs or expansion activities (applications from new applicants to the Foundation will be accepted). In addition, the Foundation will not be funding Arts Education or Facilities Projects, in order to concentrate on its main Education Grant priorities: Improving Students' Learning Skills, and Teacher Professional Development.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

The Fleishhacker Foundation funds Precollegiate Education (grades K-12), with an emphasis on the K-8 level. Grants are only made to institutions within the San Francisco Bay Area.

### **Eligible Applicants:**

- independent schools
- nonprofit organizations that offer school-based support services to schools
- other special projects which fall under the funding program categories listed on the following page
- public schools or districts which meet all the review criteria in the grantmaking guidelines (the Foundation rarely considers requests from individual public schools due to the limitations of its funding, and prefers to support one-time needs, projects serving multiple sites, or activities that can be replicated at other sites).

#### Not Eligible for Funding:

- deficit financing
- annual funds
- endowment campaigns
- capital campaigns over \$10 million
- youth who have dropped out of school
- adult education
- fundraising events
- travel.

#### **GENERAL INTEREST AREAS**

The Foundation is interested in programs and projects which:

- take place at the school site, preferably during the school day;
- are innovative;
- involve coordination of programs and services which support the educational process;
- connect in-school learning to the student's home, community, and cultural life;
- are cost effective;
- and which show potential for longevity.

It is the Foundation's preference not to fund regional branches of national organizations.

#### **PROGRAM CATEGORIES**

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS - Through this grant category the Foundation supports programs that help teachers become more effective through professional growth and renewal activities. The Foundation emphasizes programs for teachers new to the profession.

IMPROVING STUDENTS' LEARNING SKILLS - This category supports programs taking place at the school site with the goals of fostering students' critical thinking, problem solving, and active learning. Such programs may include innovative curricula, academic support for core subjects, enrichment programs, programs that encourage parental involvement in a child's education, linking families and schools, and involving schools in the local community. A clear description of the goals and benefits is crucial to successful review. The Foundation also looks for cost-effective programs and those with potential to be replicated or adapted at other sites.

#### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Submit the <u>application cover sheet</u>, and a <u>proposal narrative of no more than 1 page</u> describing the grant request and attach:

- a project budget showing income as well as expenses (break out foundation, corporate, board and then other individual contributions on separate lines);
- the organization's budget for the current year;
- the organization's financial statement for last year;
- a Board of Directors list with affiliations;
- a one page overview of the organization (e.g. brief history and other programs);
- evidence of nonprofit status.

Grants normally range between \$5,000 and \$10,000, and are for a one year period. The Foundation expects that if a multi-year grant award is made, the grantee will wait at least that long after the grant's conclusion before re-applying.

# Eureka Fellowship Program

The Foundation offers an unrestricted fellowship program for visual artists. Artists must be nominated by a local nonprofit arts organization to qualify. Awards of \$25,000 per artist are determined by a review panel of non-Bay Area arts experts. The process of selecting artists for the 2008 – 2010 fellowships has been completed. General applications are not accepted.

#### **Special Arts Grants**

Periodically grants which exceed the scope of the Small Grants Program are considered. Applicants must have budgets larger than \$750,000, and be able to clearly demonstrate the project's potential for broad and long-term impact, which might involve: facility access or use; community-wide program initiatives; or exceptional projects of major-budget institutions. Community benefit and enhancement of an arts discipline are primary considerations for grants made in this program. Grants generally do not exceed \$25,000. All potential applicants must contact the Executive Director well in advance of the two annual grant deadlines (see Page 3) to determine the advisability of submitting a proposal. These grant proposals are 4 to 6 pages of narrative, plus attachments (no form is required).

Applications for large capital facility projects (campaigns over \$1 million total) are not considered, though smaller renovation or equipment requests are eligible. Endowment requests are not considered.

Board members may periodically use limited discretionary funds to support programs of special interest. Such grants are not open to application.

# Application Guidelines

#### **FUNDING PRIORITIES**

The majority of the Foundation's arts grantmaking takes place through this program. The particular emphasis of the Small Grants Program is to support the development and presentation of the work of living Bay Area artists. New work is the first priority, however retrospectives and classical repertory of non-living artists will be considered.

Grants may be awarded for: artists' fees for creative time; production costs for performances or film/video projects; exhibition/installation costs for visual, media, or interdisciplinary arts projects; activities that contribute to overall artistic development; and efforts to strengthen an organization's artistic impact within the community.

The Foundation seeks to fund a broad range of arts groups during the course of each year. It strives to make grants that represent a diversity of arts disciplines, aesthetic sensibilities, and forms of cultural expression. The Foundation generally priorities the proposals that best support working artists. Only nonprofit arts organizations may apply for funding; individual artists are not eligible for grants through this program.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

#### Applicants must be:

- arts and cultural organizations incorporated as not-for-profit [501©(3)];
- organizations residing and offering programming in the greater San Francisco Bay Area;
- able to demonstrate a consistent artistic presence in the Bay Area for at least 3 years;
- of budget size between \$100,000 and \$750,000.

#### Not eligible are:

- programs/projects whose fundamental purpose or benefit falls within the social services, health, youth, or community development fields;
- individuals (unless conducting a project under the sponsorship of an eligible nonprofit organization see next page);
- organizations based outside the greater San Francisco Bay Area;
- deficit financing, endowment campaigns, major capital campaign requests (campaigns over \$10 million).

#### **DISCIPLINES ELIGIBLE**

- Dance
- Music
- Theater
- Visual Arts
- Interdisciplinary Arts
- Film& Video/Media Arts

#### **REVIEW CRITERIA**

The most important factors considered in making a grant through this category are:

- How would our grant help advance the body of work being developed by the principal artist(s)?
- Is there an audience for this work?
- What is the contribution to the community at large?
- What is the potential impact on the arts discipline involved?
- How viable is the applying organization?
- Does the applicant use its resources efficiently and well, seeking to collaborate and pool resources when appropriate?
- Is there evidence of a strong Board of Directors and community support for the organization?

#### FISCAL SPONSORSHIPS

When using a fiscal sponsor, the applicant must have entered into a written agreement with that sponsor which delineates responsibilities for accounting procedures, fiscal oversight, and grant reporting. To be eligible for a grant, the sponsoring nonprofit organization's mission and ongoing programming must correlate with those of the sponsored project.

A letter of sponsorship summarizing the specific nature of this agreement must accompany the application. The budget figures of the sponsor organization go on the application form. Applicants should also attach a simple financial summary of the activities of the last completed year, if they are available. Also attached should be the sponsor's organizational budget, financial report, and board list as noted in the attachments section of Page 3.

Film applicants: please refer to the additional application instruction sheet provided with our guidelines.

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

Grants are between \$1,000 and \$10,000, and normally in the \$2,500 - \$5,000 range. The grant period is one year from the date of Board of Directors approval. The Small Grants in the Arts program is designed to support a variety of organizations over time, rather than to provide annual funding for a specific group of organizations.

In order to review an application, the Foundation needs the following.

- 1) Completed application form.
- 2) Complete project budget with projected income and expenses. (If request is project-specific.)
- 3) Current year's organizational budget, separating grants, board, and other contributions, and itemizing expenses.
- 4) Financial statement for the last completed fiscal year, using the California Cultural Data Project format (www.caculturaldata.org),
- 5) Evidence of tax-exempt status.
- 6) Sample film or video clip required for film proposals (of the work for which funding is being sought), with postage-paid return envelope and optional notation of tape's contents. Film clips of performances are optional.
- 7) Filmography is required for film directors; brief artistic biographies are helpful for other project-related applications.
- 8) Board of Directors list with affiliations.
- 9) Copy of Letter of Agreement with Fiscal Sponsor (if applicable).

Note: do not bind or staple application materials, use paper clips, only 12 point type. The Foundation cannot review extensive proposal packets. Additional materials must be limited, and may include: a brochure or newsletter; performance reviews; letters of support; or video clip of performances. These materials are not required to complete the application, except that a film sample is required of film applicants. Work samples will be returned if a stamped mailing envelope is provided (although the Foundation keeps films it funds).

All applicants will receive written confirmation of receipt of their proposal, and of the action taken on the request. Please allow up to four weeks for each notification. When an applicant is using a fiscal sponsor, all communication is sent to the sponsor organization which in turn communicates with the sponsored project.

There are two grant cycles each year:

Application deadline **January 15** for May decisions; Application deadline **July 15** for November decisions.

Note: these are postmark deadlines; please mail applications via regular mail.

### **Application Guidelines**

Due to economic uncertainties, at the current time the Foundation plans to make more limited grants for timely, core needs of arts organizations. Proposals for new programs or expansion activities will not be accepted, unless they are vital to the organization's health (applications from new applicants to the Foundation will be accepted). The main priority for the near future will be mid-sized arts organizations.

Periodically grants which exceed the scope of the Small Grants Program are made to groups with budgets greater than \$750,000. The project must clearly demonstrate potential for broad and long-term impact on the local community and the art form involved. This might involve: facility access or use, community-wide program initiatives, or exceptional artistic projects. Not eligible are capital campaigns over \$1 million and endowment campaigns. Grants normally do not exceed \$25,000.

Applicants to the Special Arts Grants category should submit the <u>application form</u> and required attachments: project budget, organizational budget, last year's financial statement, board list with affiliations, and brief supporting materials.

To apply, contact the Foundation's Executive Director well in advance of the two annual application deadlines -- January 15 and July 15 - to approve submission of a grant proposal. This contact can be made by phone or email.

As of the July 15, 2009 application deadline, the Fleishhacker Foundation will require applicants to submit financial information through the California Cultural Data Project.
