SAINT JOHN'S HEALTH CENTER treats patients with respect and dignity regardless of their ability to pay. Our financial assistance and charity care policy strives to balance our Mission and responsible financial management, while stewarding our resources. As part of our responsibility to educate and inform, we believe it is important to help people understand what assistance is available to them and how to

access it. We communicate this in a variety of ways to ensure that messages reach multiple audiences. We post a summary of our financial assistance and charity care policy, including financial assistance contact information, in admissions areas, emergency departments, billing offices, and other high traffic areas. Brochures and take-away materials are also placed in these locations. We provide materials and education when patients register, including discussing the availability of various government benefits, such as Medicaid or state programs, and assisting the patient with qualifying for such programs where applicable.
