The cost-to-charge ratio was used determine unreimbursed services provided to patients. The amounts reported represent all hospital segments including inpatient, outpatient, and emergency department. All health plans including Medicare, Medicaid and private insurance are also accounted for The cost-to-charge ratio, specific to the services rendered, is also used to determine the cost of charity care provided to patients.

There is no footnote in our financial statements concerning bad debt. The costing methodology used in determining the cost of bad debt is cost accounting software built upon cost to charge ratios at the departmental level

These are significant losses for the hospital and they provide a tremendous benefit to the community as do the other government programs that do not cover the cost of care for the patients served. The cost-to-charge ratio was used determine unreimbursed services provided to patients with a third-party payer. The amounts reported represent all hospital segments including inpatient, outpatient, and emergency department.

All patients receive information about financial assistance on each of 6 statements that are sent over a period of 135 days, prior to being sent to collections. Patients who are known to qualify for charity care or are in the process of applying for charity care are not sent to collections until a final charity care determination is made.

- 2 Needs assessment. Describe how the organization assesses the health care needs of the communities it serves
- In 2009, Cottage Health System performed an extensive review of its community benefit. First, Cottage reviewed focus areas of local, state, and national organizations to determine focus areas and then next reviewed the internal community outreach programs to ensure they aligned. Cottage Health System reviewed its external community grants process. Grants from hospital operations and grant guidelines were developed around the identified focus areas. Both the focus areas and grant program were part of an overall Community Benefit Plan that was approved by the Board of Directors in early 2010. As part of the community benefit review in 2009, Cottage Health System reviewed focus areas of multiple organizations. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and The National Health Foundation were reviewed at the national level, and the California Department of Public Health was reviewed at a state level. Locally, four organizations' focus areas and reports were reviewed. Santa Barbara County Public Health Department Status Report 2009, Santa Barbara KIDS Network, United Way of Santa Barbara, and Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics. Cottage Health System conducts a regular community perception survey, which included questions regarding community needs. Cottage Health System also held a brainstorming session with 20 different hospital departments, and the Community Health Coordinating Committee provided input. After reviewing all of the information, Cottage Health System determined the greatest needs to be children's health, seniors' health, cancer, heart disease and stroke, and prevention and wellness.
- 3 Patient education of eligibility for assistance. Describe how the organization informs and educates patients and persons who may be billed for patient care about their eligibility for assistance under federal, state, or local government programs or under the organization's charity care policy

Santa Ynez Cottage Hospital (SYVCH) has a multi-faceted Financial Assistance Program to ensure that patients who do not have insurance are screened for eligibility in a government-sponsored healthcare plan and receive information about charity care programs. Every patient who does not provide the hospital with proof of insurance or existing government support will be given a handout (in English or Spanish) upon registration that is compliant with California Assembly Bill 774 (AB774). The handout contains information about the Hospital's charity care programs. This includes where to obtain applications, income guidelines, other qualification information and contact information for Customer Service and the Admitting department. The Hospital posts information about the charity care program in all areas required by AB774. Signs in English and Spanish are located in all areas where patients are registered for inpatient and outpatient services. Signs are also located in the patient billing office and cashier office. Patients will also be contacted by eligibility personnel to assist patients in determining eligibility for government-sponsored insurance programs and assist with the application process. There is no expense to the patient for these services. Patient Financial Counselors who answer customer service calls are instructed to offer charity care applications to all patients who indicate they have financial need.

4 Community information. Describe the community the organization serves, taking into account the geographic area and demographic constituents it serves

The Santa Ynez Valley (SY Valley) Community is located in Santa Barbara County and has an estimated population of 22,000. The community includes the cities of Santa Ynez, Buellton, Los Olivos, Ballard and Solvang and is located 25 miles north of Santa Barbara. The SY Valley population is 51% female and 49% male mirroring California's slightly larger percent of women. The 2008 Santa Barbara County Economic Outlook estimates that 79% of the SY Valley is non-Hispanic while in California 54% of the population consider themselves non-Hispanic According to the 2000 Census, the median income of the SY Valley households was \$66,582, over \$13,000 higher than the California median income of \$53,025. In 2000, the age group with the largest population was the 45-64 year old group with 36% of the population.

The Board of Directors is made up of prominent community members who volunteer their time to ensure that the Santa Ynez Valley Community has access to high-quality, affordable healthcare. The Board of Directors is actively involved in the Hospital's strategic decisions and takes its commitment to the Community very seriously. The Board approves an annual financial budget and ten-year financial plan to guarantee the Hospital will continue to offer hospital services to the Community for years to come. The Board also approves annual top goals that are consistent with the mission, vision and values of the Hospital. The financial forethought of the Board of Directors resulted in surplus funds that are being used to rebuild the facility. SYVCH is building a new hospital in order to comply with the unfunded mandate of the State of California's Senate. Bill 1953 (SB1953), which requires all hospitals to retrofit or rebuild in order to withstand a major earthquake. The Hospital used this opportunity to live the core value of excellence by ensuring that the new facility will meet the current and future healthcare needs of the Community. SYVCH works cooperatively with the open medical staff to improve healthcare in the community. The Hospital is exploring how to better align with physicians in order to provide the highest quality of care.

Cottage Health System is the parent organization of Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital, Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital and Santa Ynez Valley Cottage Hospital These organizations have a common Board of Directors. Cottage Health System Hospitals are the sole hospital providers in the Community and strategic plans are created with all the Hospitals and their Communities in mind. SYVCH is the smallest of the three hospitals and the only federally-designated critical access hospital.
