Cottage Health System

The Hospital provides subacute and outpatient wound care services to the Community, despite a financial loss or negligible profit margin These losses are not broken out, but are included in the Medi-Cal and Medicare shortfalls. The Subacute Unit at the Hospital has the capacity for up to 35 residents needing subacute level of care, including patients who have tracheostomies and may be on ventilators, patients with feeding tubes, and patients who are compromised in two or more activities of daily living as a result of illness or trauma Subacute services are offered to the Community at a financial loss to the Hospital Wound care services are specifically designed to combine wound care with ongoing health care as most problem wounds are often associated with other underlying medical conditions such as diabetes or heart disease. At the request of referring physicians, patients enter an appropriate outpatient program for evaluation and treatment. The team, made up of specialists from many different fields, reviews all the patient's needs. They develop individualized treatment plans, coordinate care, and provide patients and caregivers with education on how to care for their wounds at home, as well as lifestyle adjustments that will speed the healing process. Patients who meet the income guidelines are eligible for financial assistance. Wound care services are provided to the Community though there is minimal financial benefit to the hospital

The cost-to-charge ratio was used determine unreimbursed services provided to patients with a third-party payer The amounts reported represent all hospital segments including inpatient, outpatient, and emergency department. All health plans including Medicare, Medicaid and private insurance are also accounted for The cost-to-charge ratio, specific to the services rendered, is also used to determine the cost of charity care provided to patients

There is no footnote in our financial statements concerning bad debt. The costing methodology used to determine the cost of badt debt is cost accounting software built upon cost to charge ratios at the departmental level

These are significant losses for the hospital and they provide a tremendous benefit to the community as do the other government programs that do not cover the cost of care for the patients served. The cost-to-charge ratio was used determine unreimbursed services provided to patients with a third-party payer. All patients receive 6 statements over 135 days, which inleudes a statement about how to inquire about financial assistance. Patients who are known to qualify for charity care or are in the process of applying for charity care are not sent to collection until a final charity care determination is made

The health needs of Southern Santa Barbara County are assessed as a part of the strategic planning process for healthcare services provided by Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital, Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital, and Santa Ynez Valley Cottage Hospital The last assessment performed by the SBCH was in 2005 as a part of Cottage 2012 Integrated Strategic and Financial Plan (Cottage 2012) Health data from multiple sources was analyzed to predict future health needs, identify physician shortages, expand service lines and develop the facility master plan Areas of need were identified and integrated into Cottage 2012. The Hospital also relies an assessments performed by government, educational, and non-profits organizations in the area. The Hospital participates in the assessments of other organizations as requested

Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital (GVCH) has a multi-faceted Financial Assistance Program to ensure that patients who do not have insurance are screened for eligibility in a government-sponsored healthcare plan and receive information about charity care programs. Every patient who does not present the hospital with proof of insurance or existing government support will be given a handout (in English or Spanish) upon registration that is compliant with California Assembly Bill 774 (AB774) The handout contains information about the Hospital's charity care programs This includes where to obtain applications, income guidelines, other qualification information and contact information for Customer Service and the Admitting department. The Hospital posts information about the charity care program in all registration areas required by AB774 Signs in English and Spanish are located in all areas where patients are registered for inpatient and outpatient services. Signs are also located in the patient billing office and cashier office. Patients will also be contacted by an admitting representative to assist patient in determining eligibility for government-sponsored insurance programs and assist with the application process at no cost to the patient Patient Financial Counselors who answer customer service calls are instructed to offer charity care applications to all patients who indicate they have financial need

Santa Barbara County lies on the southern coast of California and has just over four hundred thousand residents. The County has eight incorporated cities, most of the population resides in Santa Barbara/Goleta and Santa Maria In 2008, 50 4% of Santa Barbara County residents were males and 49% between the ages of 20 and 54. Twenty-eight percent of residents were under the age of 19 and 13% were 65. and over The most prevalent races in the County are Caucasian (53%) and Hispanic or Latino (39%) In 2008, 13 5% of the County residents were living below the federal poverty level. The County, roughly square in shape, contains 1,756,000 acres (2,744 square miles) of varied terrain. The Santa Ynez transverse mountain ranges divide the County into two regions, North County and South County. North County is more rural and agricultural, while South County is more of a university and resort community. Currently, 51% of the population resides in the North and 49% in the South

The Board of Directors is made up of prominent community members who volunteer their time to ensure that the Santa Barbara Community has access to high-quality, affordable healthcare. The Board of Directors is actively involved in the Hospital's strategic decisions and takes its commitment to the Community very seriously. The Board approves of an annual financial budget and ten-year financial plan to guarantee the Hospital will continue to offer hospital services to the Community for years to come. The Board also approves of annual top goals that are consistent with the mission, vision and values of the Hospital. The financial forethought of the Board of Directors resulted in surplus funds that are being used to rebuild the facility. Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital is building a new hospital in order to comply with the unfunded mandate of the State of California's Senate Bill 1953 (SB1953), which requires all hospitals to retrofit or rebuild in order to withstand a major earthquake The Hospital used this opportunity to live the core value of excellence by ensuring that the new facility will meet the current and future healthcare needs of the Community Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital works cooperatively with the open medical staff to improve healthcare in the community The Hospital is exploring how to better align with physicians in order to provide the highest quality of care
