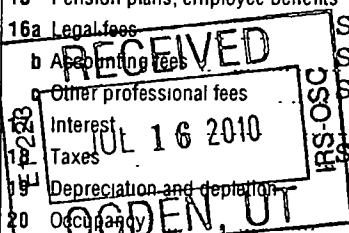



Guidelines for Grant Applications/March 1, 2010

GENERAL

These guidelines are designed to furnish information necessary to apply for a grant from the K. T. Wiedemann Foundation, Inc. ("Foundation") The Foundation reserves the right to amend the guidelines at any time. Grantseekers should first determine that the guidelines have not been amended and should then study the guidelines to determine whether or not their charitable activities and funding needs are consistent with the Foundation's interests. Ultimately, each proposal is evaluated on its consistency with the Foundation's areas of interest, potential value to the community, quality of planning, leadership, support and vision expressed in the proposal, and funds available for disbursement.

The Foundation awards approximately sixty grants annually totaling approximately \$1,000,000. Grants from the Foundation usually range from several thousand dollars to \$25,000.

BACKGROUND

The K. T. Wiedemann Foundation, Inc. was established on February 26, 1959, by Karl T. Wiedemann. A native of El Dorado, Kansas, Mr. Wiedemann subsequently moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota, where he established a gasoline distribution firm. In 1950, he and his wife, Gladys, moved to Wichita, Kansas, to be near business interests he had developed over the years in the Wichita area. He owned extensive interests in the oil and gas industry and ranching. An astute and determined businessman, Mr. Wiedemann was known for his unfailing integrity, innate modesty and acts of philanthropy, always anonymously given to worthy organizations. He passed away on January 29, 1961, of injuries suffered in an automobile accident near Leon, Kansas. Subsequent to his death, and prior to Mrs. Wiedemann's death on February 6, 1991, Mrs. Wiedemann served as a trustee and as president of the K. T. Wiedemann Foundation, Inc.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Organizations classified as tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) with a 509(a)(1) or 509 (a)(2) designation
2. Organizations located in Butler, Chase, Cowley, Greenwood, Sedgwick or Sumner Counties in Kansas
3. Organizations whose primary charitable activities fall within the Foundation's areas of interest-arts; "at-risk" children, youth and families; elderly; health; low income; and mentally and physically challenged
4. If organization is religious or religious affiliated, organization should receive broad based Christian support (Protestant and Catholic churches/organizations). During their lives, the Wiedemanns supported primarily Presbyterian, Lutheran, Catholic, and Methodist causes. The Wiedemanns were also proponents of ecumenical and interfaith efforts. If the organization does not receive that type of support, describe in detail the efforts that have been made by the organization to obtain that type of support.

NON-ELIGIBLE FOR GRANTS

1. Individuals
2. Endowment projects and scholarships are typically not funded
3. Conferences, seminars, media events, or workshops are not supported unless they are an integral part of a broader project
4. Churches or religious affiliated organizations for direct religious activities or religious instruction
5. Operating deficits or retirement of debt
6. Political projects of any kind
7. Civic organizations or trade associations
8. Veterans' organizations, fraternal societies or orders
9. National fundraising efforts

RESTRICTIONS

1. Grants awarded that cover less than the total cost of capital items or projects will normally be released when all funds needed to purchase the item, or complete the project, have been pledged.
2. Most grants are for one year. The Foundation is not likely to make grants to the same organization in consecutive years and does not expect to make recurring grants to the same organization.

GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING GRANT APPLICATION

The Foundation accepts proposals on an ongoing basis. All questions must be answered completely and all attachments provided in order for the proposal to be reviewed. Proposals will be processed as expeditiously as possible based upon the number of proposals submitted, the interest in the project, the start date of the project, and on the fact that the fiscal year of the Foundation ends on the last day of February. If the Foundation deems it advisable, it may request a site visit once the proposal has been received and may also subsequently request a formal presentation. The Foundation does not provide an oral or written explanation for denying a proposal.

The proposal must contain the following information and must be 2 pages or fewer:

1. Background information-Project title, organization name, address, phone, fax, e-mail address, website, contact person, title
2. History and major accomplishments of the organization

3. Mission and geographic focus of the organization
4. Number of full-time staff, part-time staff and number of volunteers of the organization
5. How often does board meet
6. Approximate number of people served by the organization and by the project
7. Project start date and duration
8. Goals of the project (immediate and long-range). If possible, list as many as three measurable results that you expect to accomplish with this project
9. Principal staff that will be working on the project and their qualifications
10. Implementation plan to achieve the goals
11. Impact on the relevant communities
12. Organizations in the community that are also working on the same issues and how the organization is collaborating with them
13. Criteria and procedures that will be used to evaluate the project
14. Amount requested from the Foundation
15. Information relating to how the project will be affected if the Foundation funds the project in a lesser amount
16. Indicate how the project will be sustained after Foundation funding has ceased

In addition, you must furnish the following attachments:

1. Verification of tax-exempt status as set forth above
2. List the names of churches or other religious affiliated organizations that support the organization and the amount and type of support that it receives from these groups (see 4 above under Application Criteria)
3. List the ten largest contributors to the organization during the past five years and the total amount of support received from each of them during that time period
4. Organization's current operating budget together with year-to-date revenue and expenses compared with budget, and, if available, next year's operating budget
5. Project budget
6. List individually other funding sources for the project. Include amounts and whether received, committed or pending
7. Most recently submitted IRS Form 990
8. Organization's most recent audited financial statement
9. List of current board of directors
10. List and describe any issues, i.e. legal or accreditation, which might impact the organization's ability to successfully complete the project
11. Copies of any newspaper or periodical articles concerning the organization or the project, if desired
12. Letters of support, if desired
