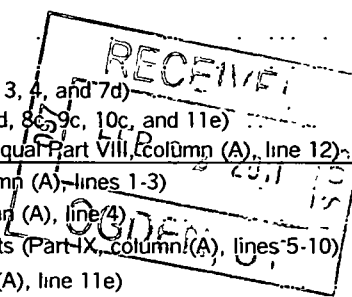

The Foundation (aka "IronMatt") funds cutting-edge research to ultimately find a cure for pediatric brain tumors. IronMatt also supports investigators looking into ways to lessen the negative long-term effects that treatment including surgery, chemotherapy and radiation have on a child's growing brain. A medical advisory committee, composed of doctors from prominent research hospitals nationwide, guides the Foundation in determining the scientific merit of medical grants.

IronMatt increases awareness of pediatric brain tumors through participation in associations and sponsorship of symposiums. IronMatt collaborated with leading nonprofit organizations to establish "Childhood Cancer Charities United" (C3U) to work together to raise awareness and advance research in an effort to find a cure of childhood cancers. IronMatt co-sponsors symposiums that bring together health care professionals from around the world to present current trends in care, management and treatment of patients with central nervous system tumors. This provides a platform at which new information and results can be shared and new collaborations can be established.

IronMatt provides assistance to qualified families who have a child undergoing treatment for a brain or central nervous system (CNS) cancer. 

## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

We have audited the accompanying statement of financial position of The Matthew Larson Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation/aka, IronMatt (a New York not-for-profit corporation) as of March 31, 2010 and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Foundation's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. **NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

This summary of accounting policies of The Matthew Larson Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation (the Foundation) is presented to assist in understanding the entity's financial statements.

Nature of Activities

The Matthew Larson Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation, also known as IronMatt, was created by the family and friends of 7 year old Matthew James Larson, who lost a 5 year battle with brain and spinal tumors in April 2007. The Foundation was formed as a New York not-for-profit corporation on March 23, 2007. The mission of the Foundation is to raise awareness and funds to overcome pediatric brain tumors and to help the children and families affected by it. The Foundation is supported primarily by fund-raising events and donor contributions. The attendees and contributors are individuals and businesses located mainly in the New Jersey-New York metropolitan area.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Foundation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board. The Foundation reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The Foundation does not have any permanently restricted net assets.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions Receivable and Allowance for Uncollected Amounts

Contributions are recorded at fair value when made by donors. The Foundation has not recorded an allowance for uncollectible amounts because it is immaterial. All of the Foundation's contributions receivable are due within one year. There are no significant concentrations of credit risk associated with the Foundation's contributions receivable.

Contributed Services

For the years ended March 31, 2010 and 2009, no amounts have been reflected in the financial statements for contributed services because the value of these services cannot be practically determined. The Foundation generally pays for services requiring specific expertise. However, many individuals volunteer their time and perform a variety of tasks that assist the Foundation in fundraising activities, obtaining contributions and maintaining its mission including the officers, executive committee, board of directors and advisory committee.

Investments

The Foundation maintains an account with Fidelity Investments. Prior to November of 2008, management had invested all of the funds at Fidelity in short-term cash reserves that were classified as cash equivalents. During November of 2008, the Foundation began investing in marketable securities, including mutual funds and equities, to improve the earnings on investments. Additional investments in mutual funds and equities were made during the year ended March 31, 2010. The value of these securities are subject to market fluctuations. The fair market value of marketable securities was \$474,420 at March 31, 2010 with a cost of \$393,845 and a fair market value of \$261,080 at March 31, 2009 with a cost of \$365,497. The securities are reported at fair market value and the unrealized gain or loss is included in the change in net assets in the statement of activities.

The Foundation follows ASC 820-10, *Fair Value Measurements*, which defines and establishes a framework for measuring fair value based on observable inputs. All of the Foundation's investments are reported at fair value based on quoted market prices for identical securities in an active market, which valuation measurements are considered Level 1 inputs under the ASC 820-10.

Income Tax Status

The Foundation is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the Foundation qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization other than a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2). As such, contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible by donors to the extent provided under the Code.

**NOTE 2 UNINSURED CASH BALANCES**

The Foundation maintains a demand deposit checking account at TD Bank (formerly Commerce Bank). The Foundation also maintains an account with Fidelity Investments of which \$1,361,267 at March 31, 2010 and \$1,525,671 at March 31, 2009 in this account is classified as cash and cash equivalents.

At March 31, 2010, the TD Bank account is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000 and the Fidelity account is insured by the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC) up to \$250,000. During the year, the Foundation's cash balances exceeded the FDIC and SIPC insured limits. As of the date of these financial statements, the Foundation has experienced no losses in these accounts.

**NOTE 3 DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM SERVICES**

Research Grants

The Matthew Larson Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation seeks to fund cutting-edge research to ultimately find a cure for pediatric brain tumors. The Foundation also supports investigators looking into ways to lessen the negative effects that treatment, including surgery, chemotherapy and radiation have on a child's growing brain. Using a competitive application and review process, a medical advisory committee, composed of doctors from prominent research hospitals nationwide, guides the Foundation in determining the scientific merit of the medical grants.

For the year ended March 31, 2010 four grants totaling \$300,000 were awarded to:

1. \$75,000 grant to Dr. Christopher Pierson from Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital, Columbus, Ohio.
2. \$75,000 grant to Dr. Angela J. Sievert from The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
3. \$75,000 grant to Dr. Rachid Drissi, PhD from the Cincinnati Children's Hospital, Cincinnati, Ohio.
4. \$75,000 grant to Vidya Gopalakrishnan, PhD from MD Anderson Cancer Center, Houston, Texas.

For the year ended March 31, 2009 three grants totaling \$200,000 were awarded to:

5. \$75,000 grant to Dr. Weiling Zhao, PhD from Wake Forest University, Winston-Salem, North Carolina
6. \$75,000 grant to Tim Gershon from Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, New York City, New York.
7. \$50,000 grant to Dr. Joseph Lasky from UCLA, Los Angeles, California

Sponsorships

The Foundation increases awareness of pediatric brain tumors through participation in associations and sponsorships of symposiums. IronMatt collaborated with leading nonprofit organizations to establish Childhood Cancer Charities United (3CU) to work together to raise awareness and advance research in an effort to find a cure of childhood cancers. IronMatt co-sponsors symposiums that bring together health care professionals from around the world to present current trends in care, management and treatment of patients with central nervous systems tumors. This provides a platform at which new information and results can be shared and new collaborations can be established.

Family Assistance

The Foundation provides family assistance to qualified families in need who have a child undergoing treatment for Brain or Central Nervous System (CNS) cancer. Hardships associated with having a child diagnosed with a cancer include increased expenses as they experience difficult treatments or extended hospitalization. During the years ended March 31, 2010 and 2009, the Foundation provided assistance in the amount of \$20,430 and \$6,424 to qualified families. A contribution of \$10,000 was received during the year ended March 31, 2010 to be used to fund these expenses and is shown as a temporarily restricted contribution on the statement of activities. All of these funds were used for family assistance during the fiscal year ended March 31, 2010

**NOTE 4 DESCRIPTION OF SUPPORTING SERVICES**

Fund-raising and Promotion

During the years ended March 31, 2010 and 2009, various display and clothing items were purchased and distributed to sponsors and contributors as a way to promote the awareness of the Foundation's mission and purpose. During the year ended March 31, 2009 certain promotional jewelry items were purchased with the intent of selling those items. As of March 31, 2010 and 2009, there were promotional items held by the Foundation valued at \$9,595 and \$10,870 shown as inventory on the balance sheet. It is expected that these items will be sold within one year.

As described further in Note 1, Contributed Services, all of the Foundation's fund-raising activities were conducted by unpaid officers, directors and other volunteers.

General and Administrative

General and administrative includes all organizational expenses that have not been charged directly to or allocated to a program service or another supporting activity.

**NOTE 5 SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

The Foundation formed the Matthew Larson Scholarship Fund. This separately funded and distinct Scholarship Fund will annually award \$1,000 scholarships to students from The Ramapo-Indian Hills Regional High School District. The scholarships will be awarded to two Indian Hills High School seniors and two Ramapo High School seniors that best reflect the characteristics that defined Mathew Larson's short life. Contributions to the Scholarship Fund are recorded as temporarily restricted. An initial contribution of \$2,500 was made during the year ended March 31, 2008. An additional contribution of \$5,500 was made for the year ended March 31, 2010. Scholarships in the amount of \$4,000 were paid out in the years ended March 31, 2010 and 2009 from the unrestricted funds of the Foundation.

**NOTE 6 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Foundation has received contributions of money and services from its officers and directors and others involved with management. For the years ended March 31, 2010 and 2009, the aggregate amount of these contributions do not represent a significant portion of the Foundation's total support and revenue.

**NOTE 7 RECLASSIFICATION OF PRIOR YEAR FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

Certain amounts from the 2009 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2010 presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on total net assets reported at March 31, 2009.

**NOTE 8 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

In preparing these financial statements, The Foundation's management has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition and disclosure through December 15, 2010, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
