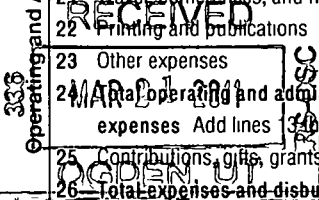



BYLAWS OF MHA HEALTH, RESEARCH AND EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION, INC.

PURPOSE: The general corporate purposes of MHA Health, Research and Educational Foundation, Inc. ("Foundation") are as set forth in Article SIXTH of the Foundation's Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation dated June 30, 2000.

ARTICLE I. OFFICES

The principal office of the Foundation in the State of Mississippi shall be located in the City of Madison, Mississippi. The Foundation may have such other offices, either within or without the State of Mississippi, as the Board of Directors may designate or as the business of the Foundation may require from time to time.

The registered office of the Foundation, required by the Mississippi Non-Profit Corporation Act to be maintained in the State of Mississippi, may be, but need not be, identical with the principal office in the State of Mississippi, and the address of the registered office may be changed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II. NON-MEMBER

Section 1. Membership. This non-profit Foundation shall have no members.

ARTICLE III. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. General Powers. The business and affairs of the Foundation shall be managed under the authority and direction of its Board of Directors.

Section 2. Number, Tenure and Qualifications. The Board of Directors of the Foundation shall consist of three (3) inside voting Directors, four (4) outside voting Directors and one (1) ex officio, non-voting Director.

The inside Directors shall be the Executive Director and CEO of the Mississippi Hospital Association, the Immediate Past Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Mississippi Hospital Association and the President and CEO of MHA Health, Research and Educational Foundation, Inc. The inside Directors shall each serve in their capacity as Directors of the Foundation for as long as they fill the official designated positions with the Mississippi Hospital Association or MHA Health, Research and Educational Foundation, Inc.

The outside Directors shall be chosen and elected as a result of their occupying various official positions with organizations and associations that represent Disciplines of the Health Care Industry with whom the Foundation has contact and working relationships in the conduct of its charitable activities. The outside Directors shall be:

1. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee to the Office of Nursing Workforce;
2. A representative who serves as a Hospital Administrator and CEO within the State of Mississippi; and
3. Two (2) representatives from Health Care Disciplines represented in hospitals and/or Health Care Education or Workforce Development.

The outside Directors shall serve for two (2) year terms which shall be staggered by classes determined according to their year of election. Initially, however, two outside Directors shall each be elected for a two (2) year term, and two outside Directors shall each be elected for a one (1) year term in order to create and implement staggered terms for the outside Directors. When those initial staggered terms expire, the successor Directors shall be elected for two (2) year terms.

Outside Directors shall be eligible to be elected and serve two (2) successive two (2) year terms and then must rotate off the Board of Directors for one (1) year or more before they are eligible for re-election to the Board of Directors. The initial outside Directors who are elected for a one (1) year term shall be eligible to serve a full two (2) year term if re-elected after their initial term.

Outside Directors shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Foundation.

All seven (7) voting Directors shall elect from their number by majority vote each year a Chairman of the Board.

The ex officio, non-voting Director shall be the Chief Operating Officer of the Mississippi Hospital Association.

Section 3. Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held quarterly without other notice than this Bylaw, with one of the quarterly regular

meetings being designated as the annual meeting of Directors. The Board of Directors may provide, by resolution, the time and place, either within or without the State of Mississippi, for the holding of additional regular meetings without other notice than such resolution. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the President and CEO of the Foundation or by any three Directors. Regular or special meetings may be conducted through the use of any means of communication by which all Directors participating may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting.

Section 4. Notice. Notice of any special meeting of Directors shall be given at least two (2) days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Director at his or her business address, or sent by facsimile or e-mail. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail, so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by facsimile or e-mail, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the facsimile or e-mail is sent. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business and does not thereafter vote for or assent to action taken at the meeting. Neither the business to be transacted at nor the purpose of any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors needs to be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.

Section 5. Quorum. A majority of the total number of Directors fixed by Section 2 of this Article III shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

Section 6. Manner of Acting. Except as otherwise provided herein, the act of the majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors.

Section 7. Action Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Directors at a meeting may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Directors and included in the minutes or filed with the corporate records.

Section 8. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors shall be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors. A Director filling a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

Section 9. Resignation. A Director may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Board of Directors or to the President and CEO or the Secretary of the Foundation.

Section 10. Removal. The Board of Directors by majority vote may remove one or more Directors at any time for cause or when a Director's or the Directors' attendance record at meetings of the Board is less than 50% during a twelve-month period; provided, however, any such Director or Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors only at a special meeting called for the purpose of removing the Director or Directors, and the meeting notice must state that the purpose or one of the purposes of the meeting is removal of the Director or Directors.

Section 11. Conflicts of Interest. Officers and Directors are fiduciaries and have an obligation of loyalty to act in the best interest of the Foundation. Officers and Directors have an affirmative duty to disclose conflicts of interest including, but not limited to, fiduciary relationships with other individuals, partnerships, corporations, and other entities engaged in business similar to that of the Foundation. Officers and Directors also have an obligation to disclose to the Board of Directors any business opportunity which comes to the attention of the Officer or Director which is relevant to the Foundation's present or future business activities.

The Board of Directors shall approve and adopt a written Conflict of Interest Policy which shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors at least annually thereafter. Copies of the Conflict of Interest Policy shall be made available to the Officers, staff and employees of the Foundation.

Section 12. Committees. The Board of Directors may, as allowed by statute, create one or more committees of the Board as the Board deems appropriate, and appoint to each of the committees two (2) or more Directors who serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.

Section 13. Rules and Regulations. The Board of Directors may adopt and amend as necessary operating rules and regulations which do not conflict with these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS

Section 1. Number. The Officers of the Foundation shall be a President and CEO, and, when deemed necessary by the Board of Directors, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. Such other Officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person.

Section 2. Election. The Officers of the Foundation shall be elected by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Resignation; Removal. Any Officer or agent may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Foundation. Any Officer or agent may be removed by the Board of Directors at any time with or without cause.

Section 4. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 5. President and CEO. The President and CEO shall be the principal executive Officer of the Foundation and, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, shall in general supervise and control all the business and affairs of the Foundation. The President and CEO shall appoint all committee members, chairmen of committees and project directors with approval of the Board; shall serve as a voting member of the Board; and shall serve as an ex officio member on all committees except the nominating committee. The President and CEO shall serve a term of two (2) years and may be re-elected biennially without limitation at the pleasure of the Board.

Section 6. Vice President. If a Vice President is elected to serve and if the President and CEO is not able to render and perform his or her duties or exercise his or her powers due to absence or otherwise, then the same shall be performed and exercised by the Vice President. If elected, the Vice President shall assist the President and CEO and shall learn the mechanics, organization and operation of the Foundation. If elected, the Vice President shall serve as Vice President for a term of two (2) years and may be re-elected biennially without limitation at the pleasure of the Board.

Section 7. Secretary. If a Secretary is elected to serve, the Secretary shall (a) keep the minutes of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for the purpose; (b) see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by law; (c) be custodian of the corporate records; (d) be responsible for preparing minutes of the Directors' meetings and for authenticating records of the Foundation; and (e) perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President and CEO or by the Board of Directors. If elected, the Secretary shall serve as Secretary for a term of two (2) years and may be re-elected biennially without limitation at the pleasure of the Board.

Section 8. Treasurer and CFO. If a Treasurer and CFO is elected to serve, the Treasurer and CFO shall (a) have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Foundation; (b) receive and give receipts for money due and payable to the Foundation from any source whatsoever, and deposit all such moneys in the name of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of Article VII of these Bylaws; and (c) in general perform all of the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and CFO and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President and CEO or by the Board of Directors. If elected, the Treasurer and CFO shall serve as Treasurer and CFO for a term of two (2) years and may be re-elected biennially without limitation at the pleasure of the Board.

ARTICLE V. COMMITTEES

Section 1. Purposes of Committees. The general purposes of the Committees shall be to direct, manage and supervise the operation of specific activities of the Foundation under the direction of the Board of Directors. The specific purposes and duties of the Committees shall be determined by the President and CEO with the approval of the Board.

ARTICLE VI. INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

Each Director and Officer of the Foundation now or hereafter serving as such, shall be indemnified by the Foundation against any and all claims and liabilities to which he or she has or shall become subject by reason of serving or having served as such Director or Officer, or by reason of any alleged action or omission by him or her as such Director or Officer; and the Foundation shall reimburse each such person for all legal expenses, expenses and court costs reasonably incurred by him or her in

connection with any such claim or liability; provided, however, that no such person shall be indemnified against, or be reimbursed for any expense incurred in connection with, any claim or liability arising out of his or her failure to discharge his or her duties in accordance with his or her good faith belief that he or she is acting in the best interest of the Foundation.

The right of indemnification hereinabove provided for shall not be exclusive of any rights to which any Director or Officer of the Foundation may otherwise be entitled by law.

ARTICLE VII. FINANCE

Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any Officer or Officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Loans. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Foundation and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Directors. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 3. Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notices or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Foundation shall be signed by such Officer or Officers, agent or agents of the Foundation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Deposits. All funds of the Foundation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board may select.

Section 5. Dues and Fees. Dues and fees collected from affiliated entities and groups within the Foundation shall be placed in appropriate accounts and shall be used for operating expenses related to the charitable activities of the Foundation.

Section 6. Grants. The Foundation may make application for and manage grant funds to support the charitable purposes and activities of the Foundation.

Section 7. Emergency Funds. The Foundation may, during any natural disaster or state of emergency, raise or solicit contributions to aid persons in the Health Care Industry who suffer needs due to the disaster or emergency.

ARTICLE VIII. DISSOLUTION

Section 1. Articles of Dissolution. The Board of Directors by a vote of no less than two-thirds (2/3) of the Directors may adopt certain articles of dissolution recommending the dissolution of the Foundation.

Section 2. Distribution of Assets Upon Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of this Foundation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding section of any future federal Tax Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. The residual assets of this Foundation shall not be distributed in any form or amount or under any circumstances to the incorporators, Directors, Officers, employees or agents, or any other individual or entity not qualifying as a tax exempt organization under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

ARTICLE IX. MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Foundation shall begin on the first day of May in each calendar year and end on the thirtieth day of April in the following calendar year.

Section 2. Waiver of Notice. Whenever any notice is required to be given to any Director of the Foundation under the provisions of these Bylaws or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or under the provisions of the Mississippi Non-Profit Corporation Act, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, and delivered to the Foundation for inclusion in the minutes or filing with the corporate records, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Section 3. Amendments. Any amendment to these Bylaws must be approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X. EMERGENCY BYLAWS

The Emergency Bylaws provided in this Article X shall be operative during any emergency in the conduct of the business of the Foundation resulting from a catastrophic event that prevents a quorum of the Directors from being readily assembled, notwithstanding any different provision in the preceding Articles of the Bylaws or in the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation or in the Mississippi Non-Profit Corporation Act. To the extent not inconsistent with the provisions of this Article, the Bylaws provided in the preceding Articles shall remain in effect during such emergency, and upon its termination the Emergency Bylaws shall cease to be operative.

During any such emergency:

a. A meeting of the Board of Directors may be called by any Officer or Director of the Foundation. Notice of the time and place of the meeting shall be given by the person calling the meeting to such of the Directors as it may be feasible to reach by any available means of communication. Such notice shall be given at such time in advance of the meeting as circumstances permit in the judgment of the person calling the meeting.

b. At any such meeting of the Board of Directors, a quorum shall consist of two.

c. The Board of Directors, either before or during any such emergency, may provide, from time to time for the modification of the lines of succession in the event that during such an emergency any or all Officers or agents of the Foundation shall for any reason be rendered incapable of discharging their duties.


d. The Board of Directors, either before or during any such emergency, may change the principal office or designate several alternative principal offices or regional offices, or authorize the Officers so to do.

No Officer, Director or employee acting in accordance with these Emergency Bylaws shall be liable except for willful misconduct.

These Emergency Bylaws shall be subject to repeal or change by further action of the Board of Directors but no such repeal or change shall modify the provisions of


