Over the 40 year period of the Old Bokoshe Cemetery Association all the committees have worked long and hard in an attempt to build a perpetual fund account that will provide enough annual interest to care for the upkeep of the cemetery without the necessity of having to take up collections at the gate each decoration day. As the fund has grown, the cemetery has also grown, along with the public's desire for additional amenities to the cemetery, thus over the years, the road has been improved, the second gate and access added, the chain link fence installed, tables and benches at each entrance, flag poles, restrooms (and they are open at all times and well maintained) along with the pavilion. This has resulted in increased expense of maintenance, which means we must continue the gate collections. We earnestly and sincerely solicit your support in this worth while project.

Please take time to review the treasurer's report included in this bulletin. It lists all the expenses as well as all the income, for the preceding year. Only the interest from the perpetual fund may be used in operating the cemetery, the principal cannot be touched.

OLD BOKOSHE CEMETERY POLICY

The cemetery was established in 1910 with the purchase of three acres of land. This was enlarged with a gift of three acres in 1953 for a total of six acres.

As there are now literally thousands of people with roots in Bokoshe and due to the limited amount of space, the following is the policy of Old Bokoshe Cemetery Association.

The ability to establish and maintain a certain number of plots for a family has become impossibility, due to the demands on the available ground space. Those spaces marked off by perpetual fund members during the past years will be honored to the best of our ability. Future grave spaces will be on a first come, first served basis.

We will continue to attempt to keep families together at least through the direct children lineage. Grandchildren and other descendants will be encouraged to establish in the south (newer end) of the cemetery. To at least keep spouses together, we strongly encourage the setting of a double stone by the surviving spouse, which will ensure that he/she will be placed adjacent.

In the old (north) portion of the cemetery, there are many unmarked graves. It is not uncommon to start to open a grave and have to move it because of an older grave being located there. In this case there is nothing the cemetery association can do to maintain families together.

If you have old, unmarked graves, in your family area, please let a member of the association know. We will place a flat concrete block, at that grave to ensure that we do not dig into it.

Also, we ask in advance, forgiveness for any errors in placement of grave sites that we may make. It is impossible for the members of the cemetery board to know all the descendants of various families. When we get a call for a grave site, we attempt to make sufficient inquiries to enable us to know what family we are dealing with. Sometimes there is not sufficient information from the surviving children for us to be completely sure, where the intent for burial was, as they do not have sufficient information their selves, to guide us.

A Note to our Friends, Supporters and Visitors

Every month brings forth many interesting things happening at the cemetery. I'm sure that most of you think that all we do is take in money, spend it, express our sympathy to family members who have burials going on but there is much more than that.

We get calls from all over the United States from people wanting to know if Great Great Grandparent is buried in the Cemetery. This year we had a list of 17 people faxed to us, 14 were buried at Old Bokoshe, 1 at Milton and 1 at Nubbin Ridge. One we could not locate so is most likely an unmarked grave at Old Bokoshe.

Some of these people are working on genealogy, some on their Native American Heritage and some just want to know if what Grandmother said was right.

Then we had a Mr. Morris to call from Miramar, Florida. He said that the entire row against the fence on the north side of the north gate is his family. He is in the process of getting names from his Aunt for us. We knew that was a row of Unmarked graves but had no idea what family.

The most interesting thing this year was about Idona Dickey. Harold Arter of Panama had a phone call from a nursing home in Memphis, Tenn. The story: This woman had gotten off a bus at Memphis, Tenn in 1990 with no identification, did not know who she was or where she came from. She had to have surgery and when she woke up she said she was Idona Dickey and wanted to go live with her Sister and Brother in Law at Bokoshe, Ok, Clifford and Inez Arter. Since they had been dead many years ago we helped them find Guy Dickey's daughter Liz Combest of Tuska, Ok. Before arrangements could be made to bring her home, she died. Liz and her husband and a few of us who remember Idona had a small service for her and placed her ashes in the Dickey family plot which is south of the north table. Liz, said her disappearance had worried her Mother and all the family for many years and even though she did not see her in life, it was great to have her at home in death.

We request your support in observation of the following

Before interment contact one of the Board Members or the Caretaker
This is necessary due to the number of unmarked graves

Vaults or concrete boxes are required for interment

A \$25.00 fee for leveling and keeping the lot level is required, it one time fee

Please pick up your flowers on the ground by June 15, so we may begin to mow

Gates are locked at sundown

Admittance may be obtained if necessary by contacting a board member or the caretaker.
