BY-LAWS OF THE JUNIOR LEAGUE OF ASHEVILLE

Article I — Name

The name of this organization shall be the Junior League of Asheville, Incorporated, hereinafter referred to as the League or JLA. The principal office of the League shall be located in Asheville, North Carolina. The League has established its non-profit tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article II — Mission and Purpose

Section 1 The Junior League of Asheville, Inc. is an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving communities through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

Section 2 Reaching Out Statement

The Junior League of Asheville reaches out to women of all races, religions, and national origins who demonstrate an interest in and a commitment to voluntarism.

Article III — Membership

Section 1 Membership in the Association

A Qualifications for Membership

In order to qualify for and maintain membership as a Junior League, the mission of JLA shall be the same as stated in Article 1 of The Association of Junior Leagues International Inc. bylaws. JLA shall be administratively independent of any other organization and it shall not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, religion or national origin. JLA shall demonstrate to the Board of Directors of the

Association (hereinafter referred to as the Board of Directors), the commitment to

- 1 Serve as a catalyst and/or leader in effecting community improvement efforts as an organization that seeks broad-based involvement with the community.
- 2 Create a supportive environment for the personal and volunteer development of women through formal and experiential training.
- 3 Reach out to women of all races, religions and national origins who demonstrate an interest in and commitment to voluntarism.
- 4 Value and include a variety of perspectives in the organization's membership, decision-making process, practices and program development, and
- 5 Accomplish the purpose of the organization through sound financial and resource management

Section 2 Categories of Membership

The categories of membership shall be as follows

- A Provisional Provisional members are those members who are engaged in training established by JLA to prepare them for effective community and League involvement
- B Active Active members are those members who have completed Provisional training and justify active membership by demonstrating volunteer service to their communities and League as defined by JLA
- C Sustaining Sustaining members are those members who fulfilled the active membership requirements as defined by JLA and who continue to support JLA and their communities
- D Sustaining Emeritus Emeritus membership shall be granted to any Sustaining member who has reached the age of 80 years Upon being granted Emeritus

membership, the member shall no longer be required to pay dues to the League or Association. Her membership shall be reflected on the League's membership roll, but the League will have no financial obligation to the Association for her membership.

Section 3 Privileges of Membership Transfer, Inter-League, Seasonal Inter-League non-Resident and Non-Resident Transfer Privileges

- A No member shall at any one time be a member of more than one Junior League
- B Any provisional, active or sustaining member in good standing of JLA may transfer membership to another Junior League. A member who transfers to another Junior League shall be granted the status consistent with the specifications of membership categories of the receiving Junior League. A provisional member who transfers has the right to complete the training for effective community and Junior League involvement as determined by the receiving Junior League.
- C Except as otherwise provided in these bylaws, the JLA Board of Directors shall from time to time adopt written policies governing the privileges of membership including transfer, inter-League, seasonal inter-League non-resident, and non-resident transfer privileges.

Section 4 Resignations

Any member who is not in arrears in dues or in the performance of JLA duties may resign in good standing.

Section 5 Reinstatements

Any member who has resigned may be reinstated upon request and by paying prorated dues as specified in JLA policies.

Section 6 Removal

A member who has failed to maintain her membership in good standing shall be mailed a notice of her pending removal

Article IV — Officers of JLA

Section 1 Composition

The elected officers of the JLA shall be a President, President-Elect, Vice-Presidents (Funding, Communications, Community, and Personnel), Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer

Section 2 Eligibility

Any JLA member in good standing who is an active member shall be eligible to serve as an officer of the JLA

Section 3 Nomination

A slate of officers will be presented to members for a vote

Section 4 Additional Candidates

Independent nominations, with the consent of the nominee, may be made in writing by five (5) active members. They shall be received by the Nominating Chair at least two weeks prior to the voting meeting and shall be added to the Nominating Committee's slate

Section 5 Election and Term for Officers

Officers shall be elected by ballot at a General Membership Meeting of the League for a term of one year. The President-Elect, upon expiration of her term of office, shall automatically become President. The Assistant Treasurer, upon expiration of her term of office, shall automatically become Treasurer. An officer may not serve in the same capacity for more than two consecutive years. This is in addition to any portion of an unexpired term that she may be serving by election or by automatic process. The elected officers shall assume their duties at the beginning of the new fiscal year.

Section 6 Duties of Officers

- A President The President shall be the chief executive officer of the League, shall maintain an overview of League operations and projects, shall preside at meetings of the League, Board of Directors and Executive committee, and shall be the community ambassador and spokesperson of the Junior League of Asheville. The President shall, with the approval of the Executive Committee, appoint other committees not otherwise provided for. She shall sign with the Recording Secretary all contracts and obligations authorized by the Board of Directors.
- B President-Elect The President-Elect shall be the chief operating officer of the League and prepare to serve as President. She shall oversee internal operations with the President, future planning and be the Area III liaison. She shall assume the duties of the President in her absence.
- C Vice-President for Personnel The Vice-President for Personnel shall serve as Chair of the Personnel Council and shall be responsible for evaluating the League's present and future staff and volunteer resources. She shall conduct an appraisal of the League yearly. This appraisal shall be placed on file for the incoming President-Elect and Placement Chair.
- D Vice-President for Communications The Vice-President for Communications shall be the Chair of the Communications Council, and shall be responsible for overseeing the branding and promotion of the League. In this role, she shall oversee all internal and external public relations and marketing activities. She shall be the recipient and implementation coordinator of all marketing materials received from the Association of Junior Leagues International.

- E Vice-President for the Community The Vice-President for the Community shall be the Chair of the Community Council, and the liaison between the League and the Community Advisory Board She shall evaluate the League's total community involvement and include it in her annual report She shall be the liaison between the Board and the Community Projects
- F Recording Secretary The Recording Secretary shall be the official League secretary She shall keep the minutes of each General Membership Meeting of the League as well as all minutes of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and any joint council meetings She shall sign all contracts and official documents of the League together with the President and keeps the corporate seal
- G Corresponding Secretary The Corresponding Secretary shall keep a current classified list of names, addresses, e-mail addresses, phone numbers and status of all members She shall conduct the general correspondence of the Junior League of Asheville She shall notify the Association of any changes in membership status She shall take the minutes in the absence of the Recording Secretary
- H Vice-President for Funding The Vice President for Funding shall serve as chair of the Funding Council She will be responsible for oversight of all fundraisers
- I Treasurer The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer She shall oversee all the financial affairs of the Junior League of Asheville She shall be responsible for forecasting the future financial needs of the League and for preparing the budget for the following year She shall also serve as an authorized signer of checks and other financial instruments

Section 7 Vacancies

- A A vacancy in any elected position shall be filled by the Nominating Committee with the approval of the Board except in the offices of the President, Treasurer and Nominating Committee
- B In the event of a vacancy in the President's term, the President-Elect shall complete the unexpired term and then shall serve a full term as President In the event of a vacancy in the Treasurer's term, the Treasurer-Elect shall complete the unexpired term and then shall serve a full term as Treasurer
- C The Nominating Committee shall be responsible for filling a vacancy for the President-Elect and/or the Treasurer-Elect with the approval of the Board In the event of a vacancy in the President-Elect position, the nomination shall be presented to the members for vote

Article V — Board of Directors

Section 1 Personnel

The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers of the Junior League of Asheville, a Member-at-Large, and designated committee chairs The Sustaining Advisor appointed by the incoming President shall be a voting member of the Board

Section 2 Member-at-Large

There shall be one Member-at-Large who shall represent the members to the Board There will be one Member-at-Large per one hundred active members, and at no time will there be less than one Member-at-Large (two members-at-large 2009-2010 and one member-at-large effective 2010-2011)

Section 3 Duties

The Board of Directors shall have general charge and control of the affairs, funds and property of the League. It has final authority over the admission of candidates for membership.

Section 4 Vacancies

All vacancies arising among chairs shall be filled by appointment of the Executive Committee. Such persons serve until the expiration of the original term.

Section 5 Meetings

The Board of Directors shall hold regular monthly meetings from August through May. Special meetings may be called by the President, if necessary.

Section 6 Quorum

A majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum. For a vote to be taken, a quorum must be present.

Article VI — Executive Committee

There shall be an Executive Committee composed of the President, President-Elect, Vice-President for Personnel, Vice-President for Communications, Vice-President for Community, Vice-President for Funding, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary which shall have all the powers of the Board of Directors between meetings. All actions of the Executive Committee shall be reported to the Board at its next meeting.

Article VII — Committees

Section 1 Standing Committees

Standing Committees are the Nominating Committee and those committees whose activities are continuing in the program of this League. With the exception of those required by the Association, they may be created or dissolved as needed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 2 Other Committees

There shall be other committees as are necessary to perform the work of JLA

Article VIII — Meetings

Section 1 General Membership Meetings

General Membership meetings of the Junior League of Asheville shall be held regularly

Section 2 All meetings and functions of the Junior League of Asheville shall be held at facilities which do not discriminate against women or on the basis of race, religion or national origin

Section 3 Annual Meeting

There will be an Annual Meeting of the Junior League of Asheville

Section 4 Quorum

For a vote to be taken, a quorum must be present

Article IX — Fiscal Policies

Section 1 General Fiscal Policies

- A The Junior League of Asheville, Inc shall not act for others as a fundraising agent except as allowed by its policies and procedures
- B The Junior League of Asheville, Inc shall not give financial support to individuals or other organizations or agencies, except as allowed by its policies and procedures

Section 2 Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the JLA shall be June 1 through May 31

Section 3 Account and Audit

- A The books and accounts of the Junior League of Asheville, Inc shall be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall be

audited or reviewed annually by a Certified Public Accountant or the international equivalent at the end of the fiscal year

- B The Junior League of Asheville shall immediately send to the Association offices evidence of any change in its status as a tax-exempt organization under section 501 (C) (3) of the US Internal Revenue Code

Section 4 Indemnification

- A Any woman who at any time serves or has served as a director or officer of the Junior League of Asheville, Inc . or any woman who may have served at its request as a director or officer of another corporation, whether for profit or not for profit, shall have a right to be indemnified by the League to the fullest extent permitted by North Carolina General Statutes, Section 55A, Section 17 1, 17 2 and 17 3
- B The Junior League of Asheville, Inc shall obtain an errors and omissions liability insurance program for its directors and officers Specific needs of the League and provisions of the policy are to be reviewed annually by the Finance Council, the Board of Directors and its Sustaining Advisors

Section 5 Retained Operating Funds

The Junior League of Asheville, Inc shall maintain an operating fund of not less than three months operating expenses to be reviewed annually by the Board of Directors

Section 6 Annual Budget

The Treasurer, as the elected financial officer of JLA, shall submit the proposed JLA budget to the Board of Directors annually for approval

Section 7 Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of the Junior League of Asheville, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision

for payment of, all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to such corporations which are organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which have established their tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as the Board of Directors shall determine

Article X — Delegates

Section 1 Annual Conference

There shall be representation at the Annual Conference of the Association

Section 2 Technical Meetings

Delegates to Association-wide meetings shall be appointed by the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Nominating Committee

Article XI — Parliamentary Authority

Section 1 Rules of Order

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority of all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the bylaws or by special rules of procedure adopted by this League

Section 2 Amendments to bylaws and policies and procedures

- A Amendments to Bylaws If any of these bylaws are required to be changed by the Association of Junior Leagues International, the Board of Directors is empowered to the extent otherwise permitted to make such changes without prior notice to the membership. Bylaws may be amended, after approval of the Board of Directors (with a two-thirds majority vote of the votes cast), at any regular General Membership Meeting of the Junior League of Asheville by a two-thirds majority vote of the votes cast, provided the proposed amendment was presented at the previous

General Membership Meeting or distributed to each voting member at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting. A quorum must be present.

Changes, for the sake of clarity, and which in no way alter the intent of Junior League of Asheville bylaws, may be made by the Board of Directors.

B Amendments to Policies. Policies and procedures that affect the members' rights (membership requirements and/or financial requirements) may be amended or adopted as follows:

1 After approval of the Board of Directors (with a two-thirds majority vote of the votes cast).

2 At any regular General Membership Meeting of the Junior League of Asheville by a two-thirds majority vote of the votes cast, provided the proposed amendment was presented at the previous General Membership Meeting or was distributed to each voting member at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting. A quorum must be present at the voting meeting.

Policies and procedures that do not affect the member's rights may be adopted or amended at any meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority of the votes cast. A quorum must be present.

Section 3 Voting Procedures at General Membership Meetings

A Ordinary Business. All ordinary business requires a majority vote. This is defined as over one-half of the votes cast.

B Members' Rights. When the members' rights are suspended or affected, then a two-thirds vote is required.

C Tie Votes. The President may vote only to make or break a tie. (However, she may refrain if she so

chooses) If a vote is EXACTLY even, the vote is "lost" unless she chooses to vote yes and adopt the motion

Section 4 Special Voting Requirements

- A Projects Any money raising activity or major project must receive a two-thirds majority vote of active members
- B Public Action Action taken in the name of the Junior League of Asheville on a local, state, national or international issue requires an affirmative vote of two-thirds of active members

Section 5 Quorums

For any vote to be official, a quorum must be present

- A Board of Directors A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum
- B Executive Committee A majority of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum
- C Membership One-half of the voting members shall constitute a quorum
