NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Waterbury Development Corporation (the Corporation) is a not-for-profit corporation founded as a partnership of the public and private sectors to help the City of Waterbury (the City) conduct long-range planning for economic development and housing activity. The purpose of the Corporation is to stimulate and support economic and housing development in the City and, where appropriate, the Greater Waterbury region. In furtherance of the foregoing purpose, the activities of the Corporation shall include the planning, promotion and coordination of economic and housing development for the City, the retention of existing businesses, the creation of new businesses, the creation of jobs, the marketing of the City and the region, and the fostering of a strong business climate.

Basis of Presentation - The accompanying financial statements of the Corporation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, the net assets of the Corporation and changes therein are classified as follows:

Unrestricted Net Assets - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of the Corporation and/or passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Permanently Restricted Net Assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Corporation. Generally, the donors of these assets permit the Corporation to use all or part of the income earned on any related investment for general or specific purposes.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - The Corporation considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents, exclusive of restricted cash. The Corporation maintains deposits in financial institutions that may, at times, exceed federal depository insurance limits. Management believes that the Corporation's deposits are not subject to significant credit risk.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) Funded Loans - City of Waterbury - The City, by ordinance, has seceded its rights, title and interests in the assets and liabilities relative to the City's Office of Housing and Neighborhood Development, including federal loan programs funded by grants from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to the Corporation. Under the current sub-recipient agreement with the City, the Corporation administers the City's housing and rehabilitation loan program funded by HUD grants passed through the City to the Corporation. The Corporation is required to remit all loan repayments to the City. Loan repayments are considered program income to the City and available for distribution back to the Corporation as part of the City's HUD sub-recipient grant provided to the Corporation to fund community development including housing and rehabilitation loans.

The balances of HUD-funded loans administered by the Corporation are presented on the statements of financial position as loans - held in agent capacity. The balance of loan receivables and loan repayments not remitted to the City are recorded as loans receivable - due to the City of Waterbury. The Corporation records sub-recipient grant income for loans issued by the Corporation on behalf of the City.

State Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) - Funded Loans - The Naugatuck Valley Development Corporation (NVDC) has assigned its rights, duties and obligations under three assistance agreements with DECD to the Corporation per a Financial Assistance Assumption Agreement approved by the Commissioner of DECD on May 6, 2005. Per the agreement, NVDC transferred loan receivable balances and related program cash balances to the Corporation to continue the administration of programs for regional business investment, downtown incentive and information technology incentive purposes. Funding for the loan programs was initially provided by grants from DECD to NVDC under program assistance agreements now assigned to the Corporation. The balances of DECD-funded loans administered by the Corporation are presented on the statements of financial position as business loans, with a corresponding liability of the same amount.

Property and Equipment - Property and equipment are carried at cost or, if donated, at the approximate fair value of the date of donation. It is the Corporation's policy to capitalize all equipment with an original carrying value over \$1,000. Depreciation is provided over an estimated five-year useful life of the equipment using the straight-line method.

Grants and Contracts - Governmental grants and contracts are generally considered to be exchange transactions rather than contributions. Revenue from cost-reimbursement grants and contracts is recognized to the extent of costs incurred. Revenue from performance-based grants and contracts are recognized to the extent of performance achieved. Grant and contract receipts in excess of revenue recognized are presented as deferred revenue.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

City of Waterbury - Community Development Block Grant Sub-Recipient Agreement - The City, by ordinance, has designated the Corporation, among other designations, as the City's economic development agency, housing site development agency and community development agency. Under a sub-recipient agreement between the City and the Corporation, the Corporation has assumed certain City responsibilities and obligations to administer grants and programs on behalf of the City. As such, eligible program expenditures incurred by the Corporation are reported to the City for reimbursement in the form of pass-through grant funding to the Corporation. The City provides pass-through grant reimbursement to the Corporation from the City's Community Development Block Grant, HOME Program Grant, Neighborhood Stabilization Program Grant and ESG Program Grant.

Contributions - Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized when pledged or received as applicable. All contributions are available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Conditional promises to give are recognized when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

Functional Allocation of Expenses - The costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on the statements of functional expenses. These costs include direct and indirect costs that have been allocated on a consistent basis.

Advertising Costs - The Corporation's policy is to expense advertising costs as incurred. Advertising and program-related marketing costs for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, were \$17,773 and \$29,444, respectively.

Federal Income Taxes - The Corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, has made no provision for federal income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

Subsequent Events - In preparing these financial statements, management has evaluated subsequent events through December 4, 2010, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - RESTRICTED CASH

The Corporation administers revolving loan programs derived from assistance agreement funding provided by the DECD. The Corporation has determined that both interest income on the cash held for future loans and interest and administration fees paid by loan recipients is available to the Corporation for reimbursement of reasonable loan administration costs. Restricted cash from the above-referenced sources is \$697,632 at June 30, 2010. Additionally, cash on deposit from the repayment of principal loans in the amount of \$2,609,087 at June 30, 2010 is restricted for future loan issuances as part of the DECD revolving loan program administered by the Corporation.

NOTE 4 - DECD - ASSETS HELD BY CORPORATION

The Corporation, per a Financial Assistance Assumption Agreement dated May 6, 2005 (the Agreement), received cash and loan receivable assets from NVDC. In accordance with the Agreement, the Corporation has assumed all liabilities and obligations under the terms of the original Assistance Agreements between NVDC and the DECD. Additionally, the Corporation began administering a \$2,000,000 DECD Assistance Agreement for Waterbury Downtown Incentive Phase II (Waterbury Fund) during 2006. The following assets are held by the Corporation for the program purposes as outlined in the DECD Assistance Agreements. NOTE 5 - CAPITAL FUNDING CERTIFICATE - MICRO-LOAN PROGRAM (CITIZENS BANK OF CONNECTICUT)

The Corporation, per an agreement dated October 3, 2006 with Citizens Bank of Connecticut, has received capital funding in the amount of \$500,000 to administer a micro-loan program. The capital funding provided by Citizens Bank will be used to extend individual loans up to \$50,000 to qualified borrowers in the Waterbury area in support of the Citizens' Community Reinvestment Act Assessment area in the City of Waterbury. During 2010, no loans were issued to qualified recipients under the Micro-Loan Program.

The capital funding is subject to repayment in full to Citizens Bank on October 3, 2011. Interest of 1% is payable annually on the principal balance. Due to the nature of the high-risk loans that will be issued, provisions exist to provide for negotiating the repayment of the capital funding in consideration of the actual loan repayments to the Corporation.

NOTE 6 - PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

NOTE 7 - NOTE PAYABLE

The Corporation purchased land located at 16 Cherry Avenue, Waterbury, Connecticut, from Camelot Limited Partnership for a purchase price of \$200,000, of which \$50,000 was paid in cash at closing and \$150,000 was financed using a noninterest-bearing promissory note with an original maturity date of June 28, 2010. Interest is to be accrued at an annual rate of ten percent per annum after the maturity date. Note payable was liquidated in a lump-sum payment made on November 4, 2010.

NOTE 8 - LEASE COMMITMENTS

In November 2008, the Corporation entered into a lease for office space that expires in November 2011. The Corporation's rent expenses were \$55,962 and \$55,000 for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively.

In January 2008, the Corporation entered into a three-year vehicle lease. Vehicle lease payments were \$9,218 and \$8,580 for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively.

NOTE 9 - EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT PLAN

The Corporation has established an employee profit-sharing plan as defined under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code. All salaried employees are eligible upon their hiring date. The Corporation contributes 5% of employees' salary annually. The Corporation's contributions for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, were \$45,236 and \$37,848, respectively.

NOTE 10 - COMMITMENTS

The Corporation, per the agreement with NVDC, has assumed all the rights, duties and obligations for the \$1,500,000 Downtown Incentive/ITZ Project and \$3,500,000 Revolving Loan Fund Project funding provided through Assistance Agreements with the DECD. The Corporation has specifically acknowledged that any assumption or alteration of the structure of Waterbury Development Corporation in violation of the Assistance Documents shall entitle the State to require repayment of the financial assistance and such other remedies as are available under the Assistance Agreements.

In accordance with grant funds awarded to Waterbury Partnership for Growth, Inc., the Corporation's predecessor organization, the Corporation must comply with various terms and conditions, including the following:

- The Corporation may not be dissolved or terminated and may not transfer, sell or assign all or a material portion of its property or assets or enter into a merger or consolidation without the consent of the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development.
- Operations must remain in Connecticut for a period of no less than ten years from the date of the final grant payment.
- Financial reports must be submitted to the Department of Economic and Community Development annually or as requested by the Commissioner.

NOTE 11 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Various members of the Board of Directors in their capacity with outside businesses and other organizations are involved in business transactions with the Corporation. Each of the Board members receives a copy of the Corporation's conflict of interest policy and agrees to its terms. Additionally, as an agent for the City of Waterbury, each of the Board members agrees to abide by Chapter 40 (Ethics and Conflicts of Interest) of the ordinances of the City of Waterbury.
