Partners play significant roles in activities with the school system as professional development, teaching the arts in schools, advocacy and fundraising. Arts Every Day intends to create more benefits for its partners through the development of its website.

Arts Every Day Schools Program - The Arts Every Day Schools Program identifies schools ready to integrate the arts into their curriculum and whole school culture. In addition to professional development opportunities for educators, the program also includes an Arts Every Day subsidized arts and cultural experiences component such as visits to museums, concerts, in-school arts programs and artist residencies for every student. Arts Every Day currently serves 25 Baltimore City Public Schools, reaching an estimated 11,180 children and 800 educators.

Arts Every Day exists to ensure Baltimore City students have access to the arts every day through arts education, arts experiences, and arts integration. Following the belief that a strong cultural education is fundamental to the development of all children, Arts Every Day facilitates partnerships among Baltimore City schools and the artistic, cultural, historical, and scientific institutions of Baltimore City.
