The proceedures also contain clauses to prevent conflicts for any individual committee member and all grants are given based upon a majority vote of committee members. The students applying for the travel grants are required to show academic correlation to the conference subject matter. The small number of awards that are given are determined by committees with proceedures to insure the proper evaluation of the nominees. The Association makes a very small number of grants to organizations in the U.S. These organizations share common goals and objectives with ACM. ACM will occasionally support other organizations in areas where ACM feels there is a benefit to computing and the computing field. These grants are requested at the board or committee level and are approved by the ACM. Council or the Executive Committee.
