Art Shop - The Gift Gallery offers a wide selection of paintings, sculpture, pottery, art books, and catalogues, all of which relate to the permanent art collections. The Gift Gallery also carries lovely note cards, calendars and journals, postcards, holiday ornaments and greeting cards, children's educational toys and books, silk scarves, and a large selection of unique jewelry. For more than 50 years the Institute has hosted an exceedingly popular six-day/night outdoor Arts. Festival, including the Sidewalk Art Show, Classic and Antique car shows, entertaining activities for children, and live entertainment In addition the Institute operates an art reference & music library which serves the Institute's staff, students, faculty, and members, the general public, and, outside researchers. In 2010, the Library served 6,017 users and circulated 5,792 items. The Library provides reference and research services, circulation, database access, and interlibrary loans. Its collections include 25,790 books, 50 periodical subscriptions and 1,900 volumes of back issues, 2,633 compact discs, 1,723 DVD and VHS films, 25,000 slides, and 1,550 artists' files. Through its affiliation with the Pratt Institute Libraries, on-site users have access to 40 online article and image databases. The Library also manages the Institute's archives, which contains approximately 200 linear feet of institutional records.
