THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND OF ALEXANDRIA PROVIDES FINANCIAL AID ADVISING TO ALEXANDRIA STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES AND ASSISTS THEM IN ACCESSING FEDERAL, STATE, INSTITUTIONAL AND PRIVATE FINANCIAL AID FOR HIGHER EDUCATION. THE FUND AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS AND RENEWAL AWARDS TO QUALIFIED GRADUATES OF ALEXANDRIA CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO ATTEND ACCREDITED COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND CAREER SCHOOLS. OVER THE PAST 25 YEARS THE FUND HAS AWARDED MORE THAN \$6.9 MILLION IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO MORE THAN 3,250 ALEXANDRIA STUDENTS. IN FY 2010 THE FUND AWARDED FIRST-YEAR SCHOLARSHIPS TO 177 STUDENTS AND RENEWAL AWARDS TO 188 STUDENTS. IN ADDITION, THE FUND ADMINISTERED 10 FIRST-YEAR SCHOLARSHIPS AND 30 RENEWAL AWARDS FROM THE SAMUEL L. POWELL TRUST. THE FUND HOSTS FINANCIAL AID WORKSHOPS, FAFSA SUPER SATURDAYS AND PROMOTES EARLY AWARENESS FOR ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES.
