Our Success By 6® efforts aim to increase affordable, quality child care so that all children (ages 0-6) are well cared for and ready to learn. To reach this outcome, we provide over 700 scholarships to infants, toddlers, and pre-school children through 16 childcare centers. The Child Care Scholarship Program gives families access not only to affordable child care, but access to quality care that surpasses national expectations. Success By 6® also supports childcare centers in capacity building. We work with member child care centers on Board development, fundraising opportunities, long-term planning, and more, in an effort to improve the functionality and quality of care provided to young children and their families. Furthermore, we provide education and support to Morris County parents through our member child care centers and through education outreach activities. (Continue on Schedule O)

Part III- 4A-Education Continued, Our Keeping Kids on Track initiatives focuses on helping children succeed from first grade through high school. We do this through a variety of efforts. -We provide over 500 scholarships to school-age children from low-income families. This allows them the opportunity to attend a variety of before and after school programs and enriching summer camp programs. -Our Youth Empowerment Alliance (YEA) is faciliating change at the grassroots level through its Community Empowerment Toolkit project. Through a collaboration with the Developing Safe and Civil Schools (DSACS) project at Rutgers Unitversity's School of Applied Psychology, and with help from YEA volunteers, communities will assess their strengths and identify key challenges to determine community-wide issues related to the health and well-being of our middle school-aged youth. Once this assessment is complete volunteers, community member and middle school students will explore methods to solve these challenges in an effort to foster a stronger community where children are safe, secure, and set up to reach their fullest potential. -The I CAN Middle School Mentoring Project changes lives by partnering mentors with at-risk youth. The mentored youth build confidence, develop stronger interpersonal skills, and achieve higher standards. The Youth Empowerment Alliance (YEA) is working with Morristown Neighborhood House, Frelinghuysen Middle School, and Empowerment Solutions on a four-tiered mentoring project for Morris County middle schools called I CAN, Transforming communities by mentoring across generations. This pilot project will link our young teens with positive adult peer role models. -The Cyber Connections Web project is a website designed by middle school students for middle school students. As part of the project, students from local middle schools will work with a Web designer and volunteers to design a website that appeals to the students' interests and help connect them with the wider community. The Cyber Connections website will link Morris County middle school students with community information, including local happenings, school information, including sports schedules, after-school activities, sports and recreational information, volunteer opportunities and more. -The Youth Empowerment Alliance (YEA) partners with the Morris County Child Abuse Prevention Collaboration and Deirdre's House to host Teen Assistance Game (TAG) at middle schools throughout the county. As part of this unique program, students are given descriptions of real life problems related to domestic violence, substance abuse, pregnancy, eating disorders, depression and more. Each student has one class period to solve or address the problem by visiting and learning from the various service providers represented at the school that day. TAG gives students the opportunity to apply problem-solving skills to help them

address specific social issues, while providing invaluable information about the services and resources available to them through their school, town, and the larger community. -Youth Summit Day is an annual event that brings together middle schools students from across Morris County to participate in teambuilding and problem-solving exercises that develop leadership skills. As part of the daylong summit, middle school students gather to meet other kids from Morris County; discuss and identify the key issues facing them-drugs, alcohol, peer pressure, bullying and more -and hear motivating tales from a keynote speaker. Part III-4b-Income continued, Its mission is to create a well-informed public to the need and issues related to housing, create opportunities for public and private organizations to work together to address Morris County's housing challenges, and to advocate for the adoption of public policy and legislation that fosters affordable housing solutions. We do this via the following: -The Housing Alliance and its various subcommittees meet regularly to organize education and advocacy around creating affordable housing solutions. -We host an annual Affordable Housing Showcase Bus Tour in which local public officials, community developers, and community members board the bus to visit different affordable housing project in Morris County. The bus tour highlights the collaborative efforts and innovative funding methods used to make affordable housing projects possible and demonstrates the positive contributions that affordable housing can provide to our communities. Additionally, each year, Morris County residents miss out on millions of dollars by not claiming the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) on their federal and New Jersey state tax returns. The EITC is a Federal and State tax credit available to many low-to-moderate-income working families and individuals. This credit is not based on taxes withheld from a person's paycheck but instead on how much total income a taxpayer earned over the course of a year. These dollars can be turned into savings or invested in the local economy and can help build the financial assets of a family and move them forward on their path to self-sufficiency. Additionally, low-income residents are also spending money they don't have to get their tax returns prepared for them by professionals. While the EITC has been around for many years many simply do not know that they qualify for the credit or where to turn for reliable and affordable help with their tax returns. United Way of Morris County works with the NJ 2-1-1 Partnership, NORWESCAP, AARP Foundation, and local community-based organziations and businesses to help spread the message about the importance of this tax credit and where to go for free tax preparation services in Morris County. Our goal was to raise awareness in the general public (those who are not currently receiving social services) about EITC and the free tax preparation sites. We utilize a variety of media tools in both English and Spanish to help us do this (7 platform posters at local train stations, numerous bus

ads, 15,000 take-away cards, and 1,000 posters, multiple press releases and PSA's). As a result, a total of 3,681 tax returns were prepared free-of-charge by our partner volunteers of VIA (NORWESCAP) and AARP. This included 405 EITC returns prepared in which the clients received a cumulative total of \$463,206. Part III 4c HEALTH (cont'd): The mission of the Caregivers Coalition of Morris County is to promote knowledge of, sensitivity to and action around caregiving issues. The Caregivers Coalition of Morris County has mobilized over 575 constituents from for-profit and the non-profit sector, government agencies, corporations, faith-based communities, private practitioners and family caregivers to improve the lives of Morris County caregivers. At the heart of the Coalition is a Caregiver Advisory Panel (CAP), a group of caregivers who help direct the group's goals and plans. In 2005, the panel was made up of 18 caregviers. Today, over 220 caregivers actively participate. While many attend Coalition meetings, others who are unable to attend are kept "in the loop" via email and phone. Pathways for Caregivers is a 180 page guide full of valuable information, ideas and support for those who care for loved ones of all ages with issues of aging, disability or mental illness. Content includes local information, as well as state, national and general information. Over 4,700 guides have been distributed to caregivers at no cost. Each year the Coalition hosts a variety of conferences and resource fairs for caregivers. Professional educators in the group offer a series of free "Lunch & Learn" workshops on a wide variety of caregiving issues. The Coalition also offers a free bereavement support group to caregivers who have lost the person for whom they provided care. The Caregivers Coalition of Morris County, in partnership with INTERREGNUM, offers a free, 8-week bereavement information and support group for bereaved caregivers. While many bereavement support groups exist, this group specifically addresses the loss of the caregiver role in addition to the grief associated with the loss of the loved one. Additionally, we partner with community organizations to promote safetly and build positive mental health in our children: * We support a Preschool Mental Health Initiative. This program's two-part approach provides early childhood educators at United Way partner child care centers with an unprecedented level of support and instruction to help them better meet the needs of children with challenging behaviors in their care. The first part provides intensive staff training and skill building in early childhood development and mental health for 25 select child care staff. The second part provides on-site mental health intervention support at child care centers for children with disruptive behaviors.

In the past, topics have included youth-on-youth violence, children and gangs and the prevention of sexual exploitation of children. Through these public workshops, United Way promotes strategies that service providers, schools, law enforcement and concerned community members can use to ensure our children grow and thrive in emotionally healthy and supported environments. * We also work with the Lead Poisoning Prevention Coalition to ensure the community knows about the dangers of lead poisoning in children. Outreach to parents, physicians and other organizations have been conducted through this partnership to provide valuable information about lead screening and lead poisoning prevention.
