When Catholic Health Initiatives (the parent organization to St. Joseph Regional Health Network) established its charity care policy it was determined that establishing a household income scale based on the HUD very low income guidelines more accurately reflects the socioeconomic dispersions among the 69 urban and rural communities in 19 states served by CHI hospitals and health care facilities. In comparing HUD guidelines to the Federal Poverty Guidelines ("FPG"), we find that on average HUD guidelines compute to approximately 200% to 250% (and sometimes 300%) of FPG. St. Joseph Regional Health Network ("SJRHN") bases its charity care (Free Care) eligibility on HUD's 130% of Very Low Income Guidelines based on geography, and additionally affords the uninsured and underinsured who are above the 130% threshold the ability to obtain discounted care, based on a sliding scale, ranging from 55% - 100% of charges. An individual's income under the HUD guidelines is a significant factor in determining eligibility for charity care. However, in determining whether to extend discounted or free care to a patient, the patient's assets may also be taken into consideration. For example, a patient suffering a catastrophic illness may have a reasonable level of income, but a low level of liquid assets such that the payment of medical bills would be seriously detrimental to the patient's basic financial (and ultimately physical) well-being and survival. Such a patient may be extended discounted or free care based upon the facts and circumstances.

This independent review is delivered by Hay Group to the HR Committee of the CHI Board of Stew ardship Trustees annually at their September meeting and minutes are shared with the full board at the December meeting. The last review was September, 2010. In addition, in December 2009, Hay Group completed a comprehensive review of all CHI positions at the level of Vice President and above to determine and validate appropriate compensation levels.

When discounts are extended to self-pay patients, these patient discounts are recorded as a reduction in revenue, not as bad debt expense St Joseph Regional Health Network ("SJRHN") does not believe that any portion of bad debt expense could reasonably be attributed to patients who qualify for financial assistance since amounts due from those individual's accounts will be reclassified from bad debt expense to charity care within 30 days following the date that the patient is determined to qualify for charity care SJRHN does not issue separate company audited financial statements, thus there is no separate footnote, however, st. joseph regional health network is included in the consolidated audited financial statements of catholic health initiatives (chi) the chi footnote reads as follows "the provision for bad debts is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in health care coverage, and other collection indicators management periodically assesses the adequacy of the allowances for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category, the results of these reviews are used to modify, as necessary, the provision for bad debts and to establish appropriate allowances for uncollectible net patient accounts receivable after satisfaction of amounts due from insurance, chi follows established quidelines for placing certain patient balances with collection agencies, subject to the terms of certain restrictiions on collection efforts as determined by each facility "

Describe the costing methodology used to determine the Medicare allowable costs reported in the organization's Medicare Cost Report, as reflected in the amount reported in Part III, line 6 Describe, if applicable, the extent to which any shortfall reported in Part III, line 7 should be treated as a community benefit, and the rationale for the organization's position. Medicare allowable costs were computed using essentially the same Medicare cost report principles as to the allocation of general service costs and "apportionment" methods. The "CHI Template" calculates the payers' gross allowable costs by service to facilitate a corresponding comparison between gross allowable costs and payments received. The payments include any coinsurances or deductibles that were collected in addition to Medicare's payment Where Medicare is the secondary insurer, both the cost and payments were excluded because the amounts are typically immaterial Further, although not presented on the Medicare cost report, services that are paid via a set fee-schedule such as outpatient clinical laboratory have been included in the total gross allowable Medicare costs. SJRHN believes that excluding Medicare losses makes the overall community benefit report more credible for the following reasons. Unlike subsidized areas such as burn units or behavioral health services, Medicare is not a differentiating feature of tax-exempt health care organizations. In fact, for-profit hospitals focus on attracting patients with Medicare coverage, especially in the case of well-paid services that include cardiac and orthopedics. Significant effort and resources are devoted to ensuring that hospitals are reimbursed appropriately by the Medicare program. The Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC), an independent Congressional agency, carefully studies Medicare payment and the access to care that Medicare beneficiaries receive. The commission recommends payment adjustments to Congress accordingly. Though Medicare losses are not included by Catholic hospitals as community benefit, the Catholic Health Association guidelines allow hospitals to count as community benefit some programs that specifically serve the Medicare population. For instance, if hospitals operate programs for patients with Medicare benefits that respond to identified community needs, generate losses for the hospital, and meet other criteria, these programs can be included in the CHA framework in Category C as "subsidized health services" Medicare losses are different from Medicaid losses, which are counted in the CHA community benefit framework, because Medicaid reimbursements generally do not receive the level of attention paid to Medicare reimbursement. Medicaid payment is largely driven by what states can afford to pay

After having been turned over to a third-party collection agency, any patient account that is subsequently determined to meet the SJRHN financial assistance policy is required to be returned immediately by the third-party collection agency to SJRHN for appropriate follow-up. All of Catholic Health Initiatives' hospitals contracts with third-party collection agencies include the following standards. Neither CHI hospitals nor their collection agencies will request bench or arrest warrants as a result of non-payment, - Neither CHI hospitals nor their collection agencies will seek liens that would require the sale or foreclosure of a primary residence, and - No Catholic Health Initiatives' collection agency may seek court action with hospital approval. Finally, collection agencies are trained on the Catholic Health Initiatives Mission, Core Values and Standard of Conduct to make sure all patients are treated with dignity and respect.

This Initiative provides care to those in need through community partnerships and collaborations. Community Benefit Approach St. Joseph reduces the burdens of the govern ment to meet the community's growing and diverse health needs by reaching out through its two campuses and multiple outpatient facilities. St. Joseph is governed by a volunteer board of directors made up of a broad cross-section of local community and business leaders. The hospital participates in the widest range of private and government insurances of any hospital in the region and, according to the Pennsylvania Health Care Cost Containment Council, continues to provide care for the highest percentage of Medicaid and nonpaying pati ents compared to net patient revenue in a region that covers Berks, Lehigh, Northampton, S chuylkill, Northumberland and Carbon Counties (see www.phc4 org) St Joseph Regional Heal th Network provides quality and compassionate care to everyone who walks through our doors. We also reach deep into the community to participate in numerous activities with other non-profit, educational and social services agencies St Joseph's Community Benefit activities are designed to - Identify and increase awareness of health needs in Reading and Beriks County - Provide resources to meet those needs - Create collaboration among community organizations that focus on health and well-being. St. Joseph Regional Health Network pro vides health services in three counties. Berks, Schuylkill, and Chester through a two-camp us system with 15 outpatient facilities. The downtown Reading campus is a primary care cen ter that records more than 220,000 patient encounters annually (serving about 63,000 patients), with the primary focus on helping patients to develop relationships with a family do ctor. The full-service family practice clinic is supported by a compendium of on-site and convenient ancillary services tied to the full service hospital in Bern Township. The hosp ital regularly collaborates with the United Way, the Berks County Community Foundation and the Berks County Medical Society in assessing the community's health needs and is working collaboratively to continually develop the services to meet those needs. Access to Care and Financial Assistance St. Joseph participates in the widest number of insurance programs of the hospitals in the region. We believe that receiving healthcare is a basic human right. Our Catholic healing tradition teaches that access to necessary healthcare should never be based on the ability to pay. We realize that many people either cannot afford health insurance or do not have enough insurance to cover their bills. Those are the reasons for our Payment Options and Financial Assistance Program, which took another step this year whien the hospital began to publicly post its prices on the hospital website www.thefutureofh.ealthcare.org. A price estimator also was added in order to further create price and cost transparency. We understand that the need for health care and hospital services is often unplanned, and some patients may not have sufficient insurance, or may be unable to pay the ir entire bill right away. We assure patients that admission to St. Joseph Medical Center is a medical, not a financial, decision. And, for those who need to take advantage of our financial assistance programs, we provide the necessary assistance in completing applications that help to determine eligibility for federal, state or county government health care assistance. We also offer St Joseph Regional Health Network's own assistance plan that c an pay all or a significant portion of hospital bills. Uncompensated Care St Joseph Regio nal Health Network provides a significant level of free care each year. In fiscal 2010, the cost of charity care provided was \$2.4 million

SJRHN also incurred \$11.4 million in unreimbursed costs for services provided to Medicaid patients, which represented approximately 26% of the patients served by SJRHN Qualitative Description of Community Benefit The heart of our mission is to touch and improve the li ves-in body, mind and spirit-of as many people as possible who live in our community. We are making a difference with our numerous outreach efforts for which our staff gives unself ishly of their time. For example, our parish nurses are following Christ's example as they walk among the people in their congregations. And, throughout the year, our staff opens t heir hearts and their wallets to support numerous organizations and individuals. A caring spirit is built on our core values of reverence, integrity, compassion and excellence in what we do It provides the guiding principles of our actions in this ministry of healthcar e both within our facilities and our communities. Family & Women's Care and Family Practic e Clinic in Center City St. Joseph Family & Women's Care provides comprehensive outpatient primary care that includes services in family practice, pediatrics, and OB/GYN. The Center serves as an entry point into the continuum of care offered by St. Joseph Regional Health Network Physicians, Physician Assistants, Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners, Certified Nurse Midwives, Social Workers, Nurses and Medical Assistants collaborate to provide an interdisciplinary approach to meet the individual healthcare needs of our patients. We offer age-appropriate health, psychological care, that is culturally sensitive and cater's to spirituality in a safe environment. Health maintenance education and wellness program's are also offered. This clinic serves as an outreach health program for an underserved pa tient population in the City of Reading and participates in all of the local health insura nce plans including all of the Medical Assistance Plans Access to primary healthcare is a significant issue for residents of Berks County While it is true that residents all across Pennsylvania have to face the consequences of having too few primary care physicians in their communities, in a recent survey by the Berks County Community Foundation, County re sidents report not having a personal health care provider at a rate that is higher than the state average and higher than the surrounding counties. The Latino respondents were more than three times as likely to report not having a primary health care provider as the Cau casian respondents, and African American respondents were about twice as likely. Further, many Latinos face the significant socioeconomic barriers of poverty, language, lack of hea Ith insurance and cultural issues, including social support and attitudes about healthcare. Combating Youth Violence Organizations throughout Berks County have been brought togethe rithrough a planning grant from St. Joseph's parent organization, Catholic Health Initiatives, to develop a blueprint for preventing youth violence in the City of Reading. Understainding that cities with the greatest coordination and collaboration have the lowest rates of violence, St. Joseph has built a strong coalition of more than 75 community leaders and has developed a framework for moving forward. In the first year of the grant, the coalition has assessed existing community issues and initiatives. While there are a wealth of rele vant programs and processes in place, too many have been conducted in isolation, and with a greater emphasis on intervention. There is not, and has never been, a comprehensive yout hiviolence prevention effort in the City of Reading During its first year, the coalition embarked upon a true community engagement, needs/strengths assessment, and consensus building process. A proposed Violence Prevention Framework for Reading, based on community risk and resilience factors. was developed and affirmed. The Coalition has begun to prioritize sectors and strategies for further deve

Describe how the organization informs and educates patients and persons who may be billed for patient care about their eligibility for assistance under federal, state, or local government programs or under the organization's charity care policy. St. Joseph Regional Health Network prominently displays its charity care policy in both English and Spanish in obvious locations throughout the hospital, including the emergency room, other patient intake areas, as well as in our outpatient satellite facilities. In addition, the registration clerks are trained to provide consultation to those who have no insurance or potentially inadequate insurance concerning their financial options including applying for Medicaid and for financial assistance under SJRHN's charity care policy. Upon registration (and once all EMTALA requirements are met), patients who are identified as uninsured (and not covered by Medicare or Medicaid) are asked if they would like a packet of information that addresses the charity care policy and procedures including an application for assistance. SJRHN provides translators for non English-speaking individuals and will assist with completing the financial assistance application. SJRHN also uses an outside service to assist the patients/guarantor with completing the Medicaid application.

If the organization is part of an affiliated health care system, describe the respective roles of the organization and its affiliates in promoting the health of the communities served St Joseph Regional Health Network, which includes St Joseph Medical Center - Bern Township Campus, and St. Joseph Medical Center - Community Campus, along with its affiliated outpatient facilities are part of Catholic Health Initiatives Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI) is a national faith-based nonprofit health care organization with headquarters in Englewood, Colorado CHI's exempt purpose is to serve as an integral part of its national system of hospitals and other charitable entities, which are described as market-based organizations, or MBOs An MBO is a direct provider of care or services within a defined market area that may be an integrated health system and/or a stand-alone hospital or other facility or service provider. CHI serves as the parent corporation of its MBOs which are comprised of 73 hospitals, 40 long-term care, assisted- and residential-living facilities, and two community healthservices organizations. Together, these facilities provided \$590 million in charity care and community benefit in the 2010 fiscal year, including services for the poor, free clinics, education and research. CHI provides strategic planning and management services as well as centralized "shared services" for the MBOs. The provision of centralized management and shared services – including areas such as accounting, human resources, payroll and supply chain -- provides economies of scale and purchasing power to the MBOs Cost savings associated with centralized services for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010 include more than \$105 million in supply chain expense, approximately \$30 million for insurance costs and more than \$3.9 million as the result of a system-wide effort to coordinate and negotiate technology and equipment purchases. The cost savings achieved through CHI's centralization enable MBOs to dedicate additional resources to high-guality health care and community outreach services to the most vulnerable members of our society
