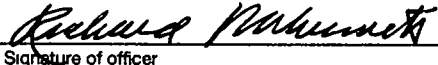

Bandroom Renovations and Repairs - With limited funds available from the Hawaii State Department of Education, this Band Association has assisted the school by repairing the walls and ceilings and installing needed instrument cabinets in the bandroom. The students now have better environment to practice their music along with place to store their instruments. Over 200 students benefit from this improved environment. \$10,158

Lunches and Drinks - Special lunches and drinks are provided to students when certain parades or performances do not allow them to leave the area for lunch. \$3,539

Pearl City High School Activities - The band supported the annual school songfest and graduation ceremony with music. These functions are attended by hundreds and thousands (graduation ceremony). \$673

Marching Band Uniforms - Marching band uniforms are purchased annually for incoming students and students requiring larger sizes. The 2009-2010 school year was the first full year for the band association, thus, required us to purchase additional uniforms to create an adequate supply of uniforms for last-minute or mid-year enrollment of students into the marching band. \$29,647
