

TO ACHIEVE THESE GOALS THE UNIVERSITY PROVIDES RESIDENCE HALLS WHICH CONTAIN LIVING QUARTERS TO ACCOMMODATE 1-4 PEOPLE AND HAVE LOUNGES, COMPUTER LABS AND ON-SITE LAUNDRY FACILITIES. 45% OF TRADITIONAL AGES STUDENTS LIVED IN CAMPUS HOUSING IN 2009-2010.

IN SUPPORT OF THE WELL BEING OF THE STUDENTS LIVING ON CAMPUS AND THOSE COMMUTING TO CLASSES, THE UNIVERSITY PROVIDES SEVERAL MEAL AND DINING OPTIONS. THE UNIVERSITY BELIEVES THAT TO SUPPORT ITS MISSION, IT IS IMPORTANT FOR STUDENTS TO MAINTAIN GOOD HEALTH WITH PROPER NOURISHMENT.
