Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

Line 28. Public Education and Social Action, continued:

community organizing to students in Jesuit universities and deepen their understanding and practice of social change within the context of Catholic Social Teaching and Ignatian Spirituality. The training was designed by a ten-member steering committee made up of staff from the ISN, the San Francisco Organizing Project, and LANE Center for Catholic Social Thought at USF. On November 20-21, 2009, the organization conducted a two-day national conference in Columbus, Georgia for students and staff from Jesuit Universities, colleges, high schools, and parishes. The event was called the Ignatian Family Teach-In for Justice. This program is an annual educational event which focuses on global social justice issues and commemorates the deaths of the four churchwomen and the six Jesuit martyrs, whose deaths came to symbolize an oppressive regime that killed or 'disappeared' thousands of innocent men, women, and children in El Salvador throughout the 1980's. In the most recent 2009 event, over 3000 participants gathered to dialogue and strategize about ways to confront issues of injustice, poverty, and oppression in all parts of the world on a variety of social justice issues. Throughout the weekend, nationally and internationally-known experts on topics ranging from international fair trade to the death penalty and other social issues conducted talks and workshops for students and other attendees. The Ignatian Solidarity Network conducted a national conference on Environmental Justice & Sustainability. The conference was held at Wheeling Jesuit University, March 13-15, 2010. This conference marked the first time students from Jesuit universities, high schools, and other Catholic schools collaborated at a national level to address concerns about the environment, climate change, and sustainability. The program hosted a total of 300 participants, drawing students from 25 schools across the U.S. The conference led to several new school initiatives calling for increased investment in "green" campuses and sustainable communities. The Ignatian Solidarity Network sponsored a Justice Leadership Conference at Loyola University in Chicago, from July 17-19, 2009. Although the conference took place during this fiscal year, much of the staff time and resources dedicated to organizing this conference occurred the previous fiscal year (July 1, 2008 – June 30th 2009). The specific theme of the conference was economic justice and leadership. The purpose of the gathering was to convene social justice leaders from the Jesuit Provinces of the Mid-west to discuss the impacts of the economic recession and strategies for responding. The program hosted 65 participants and led to increased communication, collaboration, and networking between Jesuit affiliated social justice leaders in the mid-west region.
