

Instructions Regarding Completion of Applications For
Medical School Student Research Applications

The Committee on Student Medical Research has as its goal the development of satisfying research experiences for all interested students. Many of the research experiences are supported by the individual prospective faculty advisor's own research or training grants. When the prospective faculty advisor does not have funds available for student research, the student may apply for a stipend of approximately \$546.00 per month for a minimum of two (2) months (8 weeks) and a maximum of three (3) months (12 weeks). The final payment will not be paid until a report, abstract and survey form are received from the student, and a letter of evaluation from the preceptor. If the faculty advisor has limited funds, we will fund part of the stipend.

The student may consult with several staff members in order to select the setting in which he/she would like to work. Before completing the application form, the student and prospective faculty research advisor must agree on a mutually acceptable project. The student must become well acquainted with the research project before completing the application form. Usually this requires considerable consultation with the prospective faculty research advisor and reading relevant medical literature. The student is expected to complete the first pages of the application form. The entire application should be edited and approved by the faculty research advisor who must also complete the last page of the application. Each student may submit only one proposal.

Selection of an appropriate project and its careful presentation in the application form are all-important in securing approval of the fellowship. Each application is studied and graded by members of the Committee on Student Medical Research. Average grades of the applications are rank-ordered. In the past, funds have not been available to support all applicants, and selection has been based on the results of this grading procedure. Since judgment regarding the approval of an application is based almost entirely on what is written on the application form, it behooves the student to do a thoughtful job. A careful and concise statement of the specific aims, the research plan, previous work in the field, and the significance of the project are essential. This presentation should be an exact statement of what the student plans to do. A description of how this problem fits into the broader research that is being conducted in the advisor's laboratory (if it does) is also helpful. It is important that the proposed project is one that can realistically be accomplished by the student during this research period. The proposed project must be one in which the student enters into the intellectual aspects of problem solving. The student must clearly be more than "a pair of hands".

Students in academic difficulty do not qualify for research fellowships. Also students who will be entering their 3rd or 4th year of medical school next fall are ineligible for financial support from the program as are students who are enrolled in a program leading to a Ph.D. in the biomedical sciences or related areas. All undergrads must provide one (1) certified transcript of their current grade standing. Deadline for receipt of applications in the Office of Student Medical Research is February 1, 1988.

SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS
(Please follow carefully)

1. The student is responsible for assuring that all portions of the application are received before the deadline of 4:00 p.m. February 1, 1988.
2. The student should prepare the first pages of the application and the proposal. This material should be presented to the advisor for signature. The last page should be given to the advisor for completion and confidential transmission to the Committee. The two portions may be submitted separately or together.
3. The actual proposal must be typed on 8 1/2" by 11" paper using adequate margins. Only two sheets of paper maximum may be used, with typing on one side only. References only may be typed on a third sheet if additional space is needed. The Committee staff will obliterate ANY text (other than references) appearing on the third sheet. Since such action may render your proposal illogical, DON'T EXCEED THE TWO PAGE LIMIT FOR TEXT.

Double-spaced proposals are preferred but obviously it is possible to present more material with single spacing. However, in previous years shorter proposals that are good have succeeded while longer proposals often suffered from extraneous material and failed. It is not necessary for the student to have done the actual typing. The use of a secretary's services (discuss with your advisor) is permitted. The applicant's name should appear in the upper right-hand corner of each page.

4. The proposal must be agreeable to your advisor. The following outline should be used:
 - A. Specific aims.
 - B. Research plan (include methods in your discussion).
 - C. Previous work related to this problem by others and by yourself (cite references).
 - D. Significance of proposed research.
5. This year we will assess to what extent the advisor wrote the proposal. This data will be used in future years to aid the Committee in developing various regulations. Some credit generally is given by reviewers to students who prepare the proposal essentially independently. However, it is much more important to have a well-written proposal.
6. One original and 7 high quality copies of all materials must be received in the Committee Office by the deadline. Exceptions are granted in extreme cases only (such as documented hospitalization for a substantive time in January). Undergraduates must include one certified transcript of their current grade standing when turning in all materials. Make an additional copy for yourself to keep. Allow adequate time if the U.S. or campus mails are used.
