Charity Care is calculated by determining the total amount from patient billing that is written off to charity care charge codes or allowances. This amount matches the number that is reported on our fiscal year ending 2010 audited financial statements. The total charity care dollar amount is then reduced to cost by applying the Hospital's cost to charge ratio as calculated on IRS schedule H - worksheet 2

The hospital does not have sufficient information at this time to determine if subsidized services exist based on the definition and calculations required by the IRS and is working to provide such information in next year's return

Our Charity Care at cost is 1 51% of total hospital expenses. The unreimbursed portion of Medicaid accounts for 4 83% of hospital expenses.

The hospital strongly believes that its charity care and the related community benefit obtained from such care, is understated because of those patients that potentially qualify for charity care but do not wish to apply for it. In addition, some care is not classified as charity due to missing documentation on patient resources. Thus, the hospital's bad debt includes a portion that could be classified as charity care if application for such care was sought and/or completed. Currently, the hospital is implementing processes, procedures and systems to more effectively determine charity care that will reduce a patient's documentation requirements and ease the patient's emotional burden in applying for charity care. This will provide a more accurate reporting of charity care services provided by the hospital. The bad debt expense on the financial statements includes write-offs from the patient billing system less bad debt recoveries and adjustments to the bad debt allowance account. The adjustments to the allowance account are necessary to ensure that the allowance for bad debts on the balance sheet accurately reflects estimated future bad debt write-offs (net of recoveries) for the current A/R. The reported total bad debt amount matches our fiscal year ending 2010 audited financial statement. The bad debt number is then reduced to cost by applying the Hospital's cost to charge ratio as calculated on the IRS schedule H - worksheet 2.

The hospital continually strives to provide excellent patient care in the most cost effective fashion. Nonetheless, the Medicare program, in many cases, does not provide payment that covers the full cost of the care provided. Since it is the mission of the hospital to respond to community need, hospital management continually advocates for improved Medicare payment so that the cost of quality care to those patients that are not able to afford it is not compromised and is fairly subsidized by all payers. While this shortfall in Medicare payments is not classified as community benefit by the IRS, we nonetheless believe it is an important contribution made by the hospital to the health and well being of the community. Our mission calls us to serve all patients with the highest possible quality and efficiency, even if we are not paid fully for doing so

Applications or requests for Community Care will be accepted from any patient without discrimination against race, ethnicity, sex, color, religion, origin or ancestry, age, marital status, disabilities or ability to pay. Every effort will be made by the hospital to assist patients in utilizing Government & Third party insurance plans or financial aid programs prior to providing Community Care. Patients will be required to apply for plans or programs for which they may be eligible. If the patient and or responsible party has collaborated with the hospital in seeking reimbursement from appropriate Government & Third party plans or charitable programs & agencies, relief from financial obligation is granted based on Community Care eligibility criteria.

The hospital does not have any health care facilities that are not registered as a health care facility under state law

We employ a number of methods to assess health care needs 1) we have a community advisory committee broadly representative of the community. This committee meets regularly to discuss hospital services and advise us on how well we are meeting community needs. As terms expire, committee members assist in identifying new members who can continue to assist us in this way. We make an effort to include members from the neighboring communities we serve, as well as some potentially underserved groups-such as Hmong or Native American leaders. 2) Hospital leadership meets with each committee member individually to learn more about their opinions about community needs. 3) We examine the reasons that self-pay and Medical Assistance patients come to our emergency department for care. 4) Hospital leadership serve on local social service agency boards, such as the N.E.W. Community Clinic (a "free clinic"), and meet with representatives of the Catholic Diocese to discuss community needs. 5) Our Hispanic Health Educator/Cultural Liaisons assist us in identifying needs of special subgroups of patients. During FY2011, St. Vincent leadership assisted with and participated in the Brown County Health Department's Community Health Improvement Process, a community needs assessment that reviews how Brown County compares to the rest of the state on indicators contained in "Healthy Wisconsin 2020." A group widely representative of the community has been convened to review the data and determine the high priority issues for Brown County. St. Vincent will examine the results of this study to determine how best address the high priority needs.

Our hospital posts our charity care policy and application on our website. In addition, charity care applications are available and prominently displayed in our registration areas. Our financial counselors are available to meet with patients on site before or at the time of service to assist them in identifying whether they are eligible for government aid or financial assistance, and to assist them in applying for programs for which they may be eligible. After patients receive service, our customer service representatives are also trained to assist them to apply for various government programs or for our charity care program. Our collectors are trained to provide this assistance as well. Last but not least, we have contracted with an outside firm to do active outreach with patients who may need additional assistance or advocacy to apply for benefits, appeal denials, or who need transportation to government agencies to apply for benefits.

Our hospital has a long standing commitment to being environmentally sensitive, as part of our Franciscan heritage. There are many examples of how this is demonstrated, one of which is our participation in the Brown County Sharps programs. The hospital serves as a drop-off site for sharps, such as needles used to inject insulin. Community members drop these items and the hospital pays to have them disposed of properly. We support our community's environmental efforts to avoid adding to landfills because we actively contribute to the Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach program, whereby surplus or otherwise unused hospital supplies are collected and distributed to missions in the US and elsewhere. In addition, we participate in the Wisconsin Hospital Emergency Preparedness Plan (WHEPP). The purpose of the Wisconsin Hospital Emergency Plan (WHEPP) is to develop processes to help participating institutions in Wisconsin meet community needs in a collaborative and organized manner during an incident emergency. The State of Wisconsin recognized that a mass casualty incident due to a biological, chemical, radiological or natural disaster can easily overwhelm or damage the ability of local healthcare resources to meet community needs, so developed the Wisconsin Hospital Emergency Preparedness Plan (WHEPP), a mutual aid plan, to address this concern. We have actively participated in the organization and development of this group and led efforts in our region. As leaders in this group, we have helped to initiate the preparedness efforts by WHEPP that assist hospitals in our state to maintain the minimum levels of readiness that are expected by the federal and state governments. A nother significant portion of the community building dollars is dedicated to workforce assistance and growth through support of the Green Bay Area Chamber of Commerce Youth Apprenticeship Program (on-the-job training) and Partners in Education, a local program which recognizes exceptional teachers and provides students with a variety of career exploration and experience programs. We support those who are related to the acute health care industry by maintaining regular communication and updating on trends and issues in the industry and fostering collaborative relationships This is done through regular luncheon meetings with nursing home administrators and clergy, as well as through health care career talks to local students. St. Vincent Hospital has been a leader in cancer care for over 50 years. As part of this leadership, we have actively supported the efforts of the American Cancer Society (ACS) projects to eliminate cancer, save lives and diminish suffering A portion of the community building dollars are dedicated to supporting various ACS efforts

Our hospital has an open medical staff and a board comprised of community members. Funds over and above what is needed for operations are reinvested in the facility and program services, using generally accepted accounting principles and market assessment to ensure that the funds are being used wisely. Our hospital was founded over 100 years ago by a group of Catholic sisters whose purpose was to extend Christ's healing love throughout our area Because of that, we comply with the Ethical and Religious Directives for Health Care issued by the US Council of Catholic Bishops. We actively contribute to the Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach program, whereby surplus or otherwise unused hospital supplies are collected and distributed to missions in the US and many other countries. We also actively offer a variety of no-charge community and health education programs locally to assist community members in learning more about their health condition or possible health issues St. Vincent Hospital devotes significant resources to access for patients who cannot afford care, along with other community benefits. In fiscal year 2010, St. Vincent provided nearly \$25.6 million in community benefit services, including charity care at cost, unpaid costs of Medicaid and other public programs, and a range of diverse programs designed to enhance access and improve community health. Additionally, during this period, St. Vincent provided \$3.6 million (at cost) in uncompensated care to patients that did not qualify for charity care or public assistance and over \$35 6 million (at cost) in excess of Medicare payment for health care services. An example of our community benefit initiatives is the support we provide to patients that pass each year through the doors of the NEW Community Clinic, a 39-year-old free health center for the uninsured and underinsured St Vincent covers the cost of a school nurse employed by the NEW Community Clinic to serve high risk children. We also supply the clinic with free and discounted laboratory and radiology services. More than 70% of patients say the clinic's care prevented a trip to the Emergency Department. Our health care ministry calls on us to fos ter healing, serve with compassion, and promote wellness for all persons, with special attention to our neighbors who are sick, poor, underserved, and most vulnerable. These principles have made it possible for HSHS to provide high quality, cost-effective and compassion ate health care for millions of people in Illinois and Wisconsin Our health care ministry consists of 13 hospitals and numerous physician partners committed to continuing the heal ing ministry of Jesus Christ Beyond functioning as a primary source for health care in the 12 primary communities we serve, HSHS also provides a wide array of Community Benefits t hat expand residents' access to health care, enhance their overall health status, and furt her medical education. In the Fiscal Year that ended June 30, 2010, HSHS hospitals provide d \$152.2 million in Community Benefits (or 8 5% of total expenses), an increase of \$28 mil lion from FY 2009 Of this amount, \$32 3 million was provided for charity care and \$89 2 m illion was the amount of unreimbursed care provided under the Medicaid program. In addition, HSHS hospitals provided \$159.3 million in health care services primarily to the elderly beneficiaries of the Medicare program in excess of governmental and managed care contract payments HSHS hospitals also recorded \$95 million in uncollectible accounts. HSHS is committed to sustaining and strengthening the health of our communities by continually reinve sting any surplus revenue from operations and investments into new medical technology, facility infrastructure and health care services. These ongoing enhancements ensure that our hospitals can continue to provide high quality, compassionate care to our patients. During Fiscal Year 2010, HSHS continued to pursue a Care Integration strategy designed to contin uously enhance quality and improve coordination of care both inside the hospital and with a growing number of physician partners. Hospitals have created a simple two page form for those wishing to apply for Charity Care and assign counselors to visit with inpatients who are uninsure d to let them know about our charity care policies and provide assistance filling out applications for financial assistance or enrollment in publicly funded health care programs. The gratitude of the people who have benefitted from our Charity Care program (sometimes referred to as Christian Care) is reflected in some of the thank you letters sent to St. Ant hony's Memorial Hospital in Effingham, IL. Comments included. For example, St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Belleville, IL hosts a FOHC primary care clinic adjacent to its Emergency Department and St. John's Hospital in Springfield, IL coordinates specialty physician referrals with the local FQHC and provides free health care to its clients. Meanwhile, access to clinical trials provides opportunities for patients in rural areas to have access to drugs and treatments available only through PHII "The result of this unique commitment is that regardless of where a patient lives, they will have access to care designed to detect heart disease earlier. We can also offer previously unavailable life- saving techniques and drugs and ensure a return to a quality of life," explains Jim Zito, PHII CEO.
