#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 1 - NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **NATURE OF ACTIVITIES**

WCTC Foundation, Inc. (Foundation) is a not-for-profit corporation whose purpose is to solicit, hold, manage, invest, and expend endowment funds and other gifts, grants, and bequests exclusively for the maintenance and benefit of the Waukesha County Technical College (WCTC).

The Foundation's financial statements are not included in the basic financial statements of WCTC. The criteria used to determine the composition of the financial reporting entity are based on oversight responsibilities exercised by WCTC's Board of Trustees. The manifestations of oversight include financial interdependency, selection of governing authority, designation of management, ability to significantly influence operations, and accountability for fiscal matters. The Foundation is a separate legal entity and operates with an independent governing body that is not under the control of the WCTC Board of Trustees. The WCTC Board of Trustees does not have the ability to influence the operations or approve the budgets of the Foundation.

#### BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

For financial statement purposes, the Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less, when purchased, to be cash equivalents.

#### INVESTMENTS

Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at fair value with realized and unrealized gains and losses included in the Statement of Activities.

Investments are reported at fair value. The market values of investments are generally determined based on quoted market prices or estimated fair values provided by external investment managers or other sources. Investment transactions are recorded on the trade date. Realized gains and losses on the sale of investments are calculated based on the specific identification of the securities sold.

The Foundation's Board of Directors has adopted a policy whereby funds will only be invested as individual investments or as mutual funds in common stock, preferred stock, U.S. government and agency securities, certificates of deposit, commercial paper of prime quality, convertible securities, corporate bonds, or money market funds.

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 1 - NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Property and equipment are stated at cost if purchased or fair market value at date of the gift if donated. All acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$200 and all expenditures for improvements and betterments that materially prolong the useful lives of assets are capitalized. Maintenance, repairs, and minor improvements are expensed as incurred. When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, their costs and related accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and resulting gains or losses are included in income.

Donated property and equipment are recorded as increases in unrestricted net assets at their estimated fair market value as of the date received. Contributions of cash that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as temporarily restricted contributions. The Foundation reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired assets are placed in service as instructed by the donor. The Foundation reclassifies temporarily restricted net assets to unrestricted net assets at that time.

Property and equipment are depreciated using the straight-line method over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation expense was \$72,618 for the year ended June 30, 2010, and \$72,273 for the year ended June 30, 2009.

#### **NET ASSETS**

Net assets, revenues, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation are classified and reported as follows:

**Unrestricted Net Assets** 

Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that either expire by passage of time or can be fulfilled and removed by actions of the Foundation pursuant to those stipulations

Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Foundation. Generally, the donors of these assets permit the Foundation to use all or part of the income earned on relative investments for general or specific purposes.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 1 - NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenues are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets, unless use of the related assets is limited by donor-imposed restrictions. Expenses are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Gains and losses on investments are reported as increases or decreases in unrestricted or temporarily restricted net assets unless their use is restricted by explicit donor stipulations or by law. It is the Foundation's policy to show temporarily restricted revenues for which the restriction has been met within the same year of the receipt as unrestricted revenue. Expirations of temporary restrictions recognized on net assets (i.e., the donor-stipulated purpose has been fulfilled and/or the stipulated time period has elapsed) are reported as reclassifications from temporarily restricted net assets to unrestricted net assets, when receipt and expiration of restriction occur in different years.

#### **ESTIMATES**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **CONTRIBUTIONS**

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized as revenues in the period received. Conditional promises are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value at the date of gift. Contributions to be received after one year are discounted at a rate commensurate with the risk involved. Amortization of the discount is recorded as additional contribution revenue and used in accordance with donor-imposed restrictions, if any, on the contributions. Allowance is made for uncollectible contributions based upon management's judgment and analysis of the creditworthiness of the donors, past collection experience and other relevant factors. The allowance for uncollectible contributions was \$-0- as of June 30, 2010 and 2009. All contributions are expected to be collected within one year. There were no pledges collateralized or limited in use.

#### FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The carrying amounts of cash and cash equivalents, accounts receivable, other receivables and accounts payable approximate fair value because of the short term maturity of these financial instruments. The carrying amounts of contributions receivable are recorded using the applicable discount rates in effect at the date of the gifts.

The carrying amount of long-term debt approximates fair value because these financial instruments bear interest at rates which approximate current market rates for notes with similar maturities and credit quality.

Contributions of assets other than cash are recorded at their estimated fair value at the date of the gift. Estimates of fair value involve assumptions and estimation methods that are uncertain and, therefore, the estimates could differ from actual results.

The fair values for investments and other financial instruments recorded at fair value on a recurring basis are included in Note 3.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 2 - CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents as disclosed on the accompanying financial statements are comprised of the following:

The Foundation's carrying value for demand deposits in interest-bearing accounts was \$172,986. The entire bank balance of \$172,986 was covered by federal depository insurance.

#### NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Effective July 1, 2008, the WCTC Foundation adopted the provisions of FASB Statement No. 157, Fair Value Measurements (SFAS 157), which defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. SFAS 157 establishes a three-level hierarchy for fair value measurements based upon the transparency of inputs to the valuation of the asset or liability as of the measurement date. SFAS 157 expands disclosures about instruments measured at fair value. SFAS 157 applies to other accounting pronouncements that require or permit fair value measurements and, accordingly, SFAS 157 does not require any new fair value measurements

Subsequent to the issuance of SFAS 157, the FASB issued additional Financial Staff Positions (FSP) which provide implementation guidance related to fair value measurements. The Foundation has adopted the applicable FSPs as appropriate during fiscal year 2009.

Effective July 1, 2008, the Foundation adopted FASB Statement No. 159, The Fair Value Option for Financial Assets and Liabilities, including an amendment of FASB Statement No. 115, which among other things, provides an option to elect fair value as an alternative measurement for selected financial assets and liabilities not previously recorded at fair value. The Foundation did not elect fair value accounting for any asset or liability that is not currently required to be measured at fair value.

As noted above, SFAS 157 establishes a three-level valuation hierarchy for disclosure of fair value measurements. The valuation hierarchy is based upon the transparency of inputs to the valuation of an asset or liability as of the measurement date. The three levels are defined as follows.

- Level 1 Inputs are quoted unadjusted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. This includes quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data.

# NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

Level 3 - Inputs are unobservable for the asset or liability. Unobservable inputs reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available in the circumstances.

A financial instrument's categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

#### NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

The following methods and assumptions were used to estimate the fair value for each class of financial instrument measured at fair value:

**Short-term investments** - The fair value of short-term investments, consisting primarily of money market funds, is classified as Level 1.

Equity securities - Investments in equity securities are measured at fair value using quoted market prices. They are classified as Level 1 as they are traded in an active market for which closing stock prices are readily available.

Fixed income securities - Investments in fixed income securities are comprised of U.S. Treasury notes, mortgage backed securities, municipal bonds and corporate bonds and notes. U.S. Treasury notes are classified as Level 1 if they trade with sufficient frequency and volume to enable the Foundation to obtain pricing information on an ongoing basis. The remaining fixed income securities are classified as Level 2 based on multiple sources of information, which may include market data and/or quoted market prices from either markets that are not active or are for the same or similar assets in active markets

Mutual funds - Mutual funds are classified as Level 1 if they are traded in an active market for which closing prices are readily available. Certain mutual funds are classified as Level 2 as the fair value is based on multiple sources of information, which may include market data and/or quoted market prices from either markets that are not active or are for the same or similar assets in active markets.

While the Foundation believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different estimate of fair value at the reporting date.

#### NOTE 4 - MORTGAGE NOTES PAYABLE

#### NOTE 5 - COMPENSATED ABSENCES

#### **Vacation**

WCTC Foundation employees are granted vacation in varying amounts, based on position and length of service. Vacation pay is accrued when earned. The liability also includes salary-related payments, including social security taxes and Medicare taxes. The accrued vacation pay liability at June 30, 2010 and 2009 amounted to \$42,822 and \$28,909, respectively. This amount can be carried over to the subsequent year and is considered short-term.

#### Sick

Employees who have been employed by the Foundation for a minimum of fifteen years and who retire, resign, or die, shall be paid for accrued sick leave compensated in the amount of sixty percent of their current salary rate for the number of days for which they qualify. Sick pay is accrued when earned. The liability also includes salary-related payments, including social security taxes and Medicare taxes. The accrued sick pay liability at June 30, 2010 and 2009 amounted to \$10,595 and \$12,799, respectively. This amount can be carried over to subsequent years and is considered long-term.

#### NOTE 6 - INCOME TAXES

The Foundation has received a tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service indicating that it is a tax-exempt organization as provided for in Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation. Therefore, it is exempt from federal and state income taxes, except for taxes pertaining to unrelated business income. No provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements because the Foundation has no significant unrelated business income. In accordance with a change in its bylaws, effective February 27, 2009 the Foundation received designation as a Type I supporting organization as approved by the State of Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2010 and 2009

#### NOTE 7 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Foundation was formed to solicit, hold, and invest contributions for the benefit of WCTC. The Foundation is governed by a 22 member Board of Directors that includes four members who are employees and officers of WCTC. The Foundation leases space in its Morris Street Building and Workforce Development Center to WCTC (see note 9).

The Foundation leases the grounds on which the Workforce Development Center is located from WCTC for \$1 per year plus \$4 per square foot, adjusted annually for the change in the Consumer Price Index, for facility operating and maintenance costs. These costs totaled \$177,518 and \$174,497 for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively. The original lease term expiration date was December 31, 2004. In July 2004 the lease was renewed for a five year term commencing January 1, 2005 and expiring December 31, 2009. In August 2009, the Foundation renewed the lease for an additional five year term commencing January 1, 2010 and an expiration date of December 31, 2014. The present value of the difference between the fair value to rent the land and the amount paid by the Foundation over the life of the lease has been reflected as land on the balance sheet, resulting in an increase to temporarily restricted net assets. The asset is being amortized to rent expense over the life of the lease. WCTC recognized \$2,456 and \$2,624 as rent expense for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively, and will do so for each subsequent year over the term of the lease.

WCTC paid \$164,049 and \$159,271 to the Foundation for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009 respectively, for services received by WCTC from the Foundation.

#### NOTE 9 - LEASE REVENUE

The Foundation leases space in its Workforce Development Center building to WCTC, Waukesha County, and the State of Wisconsin. In August, 2009 the lease with the State of Wisconsin was renewed for a period of five years as of January 1, 2010. The monthly rentals totaled \$3,442 and \$3,453 for the fiscal years 2010 and 2009 respectively. In August, 2004 leases with Waukesha County and WCTC were renewed for a period of six years as of January 1, 2005. The monthly rentals totaled \$15,917 and \$15,965 for the fiscal years 2010 and 2009 respectively. These monthly rentals include certain operating and capital maintenance costs which are annually adjusted by the consumer price index. Rental income of \$232,661 and \$228,995 are included in revenue for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively.

The Foundation also leases space in its apartment building to WCTC for \$10,457 per month through November, 2010.

#### **NOTE 10 - SIGNIFICANT TRANSACTIONS**

For the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009, the Foundation released \$ -0- and \$182,647, respectively, of temporarily restricted net assets for the completion of the PATC (Printing Applied Technology Center) The entire amounts consisted of cash directly transferred from the Foundation to WCTC.

#### **NOTE 11 - ENDOWMENT**

Effective July 1, 2008, the Foundation adopted the provisions of FASB Staff Position FSP 117-1, Endowments of Not-for-Profit Organizations: Net Asset Classifications of Funds Subject to an Enacted Version of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, and Enhanced Disclosures for all Endowment Funds. The FSP provides guidance on classifying net assets associated with donor-restricted endowment funds held by organizations that are subject to an enacted version of Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA). A key component of the FSP is a requirement to classify the portion of a donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified as permanently restricted net assets as temporarily restricted net assets until appropriated for expenditure. Another key component of the FSP is a requirement for expanded disclosures about all endowment funds. The State of Wisconsin adopted a version of UPMIFA effective July 20, 2009.

The Foundation's endowment consists of approximately 47 individual funds established for a variety of purposes. Its endowment includes donor-restricted endowment funds. As required by GAAP, net assets associated with endowment funds are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

Interpretation of Relevant Law - The Foundation's governing board has interpreted the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) enacted in the State of Wisconsin as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of the gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund.

The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified as permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Foundation in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA. In accordance with UPMIFA, the Foundation considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- 1 The duration and preservation of the fund
- 2 The purposes of the Foundation and the donor-restricted endowment fund
- 3. General economic conditions
- 4. The possible effect of inflation and deflation
- 5. The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments
- 6. Other resources of the Foundation
- 7. The investment policies of the Foundation

#### NOTE 11 - ENDOWMENT (CONTINUED)

Funds with Deficiencies - From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or UPMIFA requires the Foundation to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with GAAP, deficiencies of this nature that are reported in unrestricted net assets were \$ -0- and \$ -0- as of June 30, 2010 and 2009, respectively. These deficiencies resulted from unfavorable market fluctuations that occurred shortly after the investment of new permanently restricted contributions and continued appropriation for certain programs that was deemed prudent by the governing board. Subsequent gains that restore the fair value of the assets of the endowment fund to the required level will be classified as an increase in unrestricted net assets.

Return Objectives and Risk Parameters - The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Endowment assets include those assets of donor-restricted funds that the Foundation must hold in perpetuity or for donor-specified periods. Under this policy, as approved by the governing board, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to produce results that exceed prevailing money market interest rates while assuming a moderate level of investment risk. The Foundation expects its endowment funds, over time, to provide an average annual rate of approximately 5% annually. Actual returns in any year may vary from this amount.

Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives - To satisfy its long-term rate-of-return objectives, the Foundation relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends). The Foundation targets a diversified asset allocation that places a greater emphasis on equity-based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints.

Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy - The Foundation has a policy of appropriating for distribution each year 5% of its endowment fund's average fair value over the prior 12 quarters through the calendar year-end preceding the fiscal year in which the distribution is planned. In establishing this policy, the Foundation considered the long-term expected return on its endowment. Accordingly, over the long term, the Foundation expects the current spending policy to allow its endowment to grow at a level that meets or exceeds increases in the Consumer Price Index. This is consistent with the Foundation's objective to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets held in perpetuity or for a specified term as well as to provide additional real growth through new gifts and investment return.
