The annual report is made available to the public via the website at www.essentiahealth.org Essentia Health, headquartered in Duluth, Minn, is an integrated health system serving patients in Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota and Idaho and is St. Mary's Regional Health Center's parent corporation

Bad debt expense that was subtracted from total expense to obtain the % of community benefit to total expense amounted to \$2,913,368

The costing methodology used to report bad debt expense at cost was the cost to charge ratio from Worksheet 2, Ratio of Patient Care Cost-to-Charges. The rationale for using the Cost-to-Charge ratio is that it is the most efficient way to calculate bad debt at cost. We believe this method materially represents the cost of bad debt. Discounts and charity care are accounted for as reductions to revenue where bad debts are accounted for as operating expenses. Bad debt expense on patient accounts would be identified as any balance on the account, less any previous payments and discounts, that has aged and is absent of any payments. If, during the collection process, it becomes known that the patient qualifies for charity care, the amounts included within bad debt expense would be reclassified to charity care (reduction of revenue). Because this is our practice, we believe there is no known charity care within bad debt expense. (Excerpt from the parent company's audit). The provision for uncollectible accounts is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in health care coverage, and other collection indicators. Periodically throughout the year, management assesses the adequacy of the allowance for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category. The results of this review are then used to make any modifications to the provision for uncollectible accounts. After satisfaction of amounts due from insurance, Essentia Health follows established guidelines for placing certain past-due patient balances with collection agencies, subject to the terms of certain restrictions on collection efforts as determined by Essentia.

The costing methodology used in determining the Medicare Allowable Cost reported in the organization's Medicare Cost Report is to take total Medicare costs from the general ledger system and then follow the instructions provided by Centers for Medicare Services (CMS) to back off all costs not allowable. From the Medicare allowable costs, any costs attributable to subsidized health services and costs attributable to GME were subtracted, if applicable. St. Mary's Regional Health Center is a part of a larger organization, Essentia Health Essentia Health and its member organizations incorporate the full value of the Medicare shortfall as a community benefit. The rationale for the organization's opinion is similar to the rationale used by the American Hospital Association. Providing care for the elderly and serving Medicare patients is an essential part of the community benefit standard. Medicare, like Medicaid, does not pay the full cost of care and it is likely to get worse. Many Medicare beneficiaries are poor and are eligible for Medicaid in addition to Medicare. Medicare underpayment must be shouldered by the hospital in order to continue treating the community's elderly and poor. These underpayments represent a real cost of serving the community. One is the United Way's community needs assessment. We have leaders within our organization who sit on the United Way's board of directors and who have input as to the composition of the survey. As an organization and as the community's largest employer, we promote the survey with our employees and encourage their participation. We also receive the final results of the survey and use that information in our planning process. There is a lot of cross pollination regarding our relationship with the United Way. We also hold focus groups with community members to assess the care they (or a family member) received while in our facility. St Mary's Regional Health Center has Financial Counselors who are available to patients with questions regarding payment of their medical bills. All staff have been trained to refer patients to the Financial Counselors and we have literature throughout the hospital and medical office buildings in regards to our Community Benefit Programs. Financial Counselors educate patients on different options of government programs, charity care, as well as referrals to public health for additional services that St Mary's Regional Health Center may not be able to provide.

Describe the community the organization serves, taking into account the geographic area and demographic constituents it serves. St Mary's Regional Health Center is located in Detroit Lakes, MN-St-Mary's is a part of the larger Essentia Health System, which is defined in Part VI. Line 7 St. Mary's Regional Health Center consists of 1 hospital, 4 clinics, nursing center, home health, and assisted and independent living apartments. Defined as a rural community, St. Mary's Regional Health Center serves Becker County and has a presence in the cities of Detroit Lakes, Lake Park, Mahnomen, Frazee and Pelican Rapids Becker County is the sixth poorest county in the State of Minnesota for children under age 5 living in poverty and eighth poorest for all children birth through 18 years of age. Under "normal circumstances" St Mary's Regional Health Center sees many folks who have a need for assistance with their medical care costs. St Mary's has an established fund designated to assist those who cannot afford their medical expenses. St. Mary's and its related clinics cover a population of over 29,000 people. The service region consists of an MUA (Medically Underserved Area) which is defined as an area having too few primary care providers, high infant mortality, high poverty and /or elderly population. Our service area is also designated as a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) for mental health HPSAs are defined as a county or service area having shortages of primary medical care, dental or mental health providers. The average income of the service area is slightly above \$54,000. Approximately 8.8% of the population falls below federal poverty quidelines St. Mary's Regional Health Center, along with the rest of Essentia Health, is committed to serve patients regardless of their ability to pay 14 5% of patients seen by St. Mary's or their corresponding facilities were uninsured patients. In addition, almost 26% of their patients were Medicaid recipients. As mentioned above, St Mary's Regional Health Center is part of a larger system, Essentia Health Essentia Health staffs hospitals and clinics in federally-recognized underserved areas and supports the health of its communities through an active outreach program that brings specialists like oncologists, cardiologists, neurologists and others into smaller communities. This eliminates barriers to care for many patients, particularly those who are elderly, living on low incomes, or are faced with other challenges that make it difficult to travel long distances for care. There are no other hospitals outside of the Essentia Health umbrella that service the community

Provide any other information important to describing how the organization's hospitals or other health care facilities further its exempt purpose by promoting the health of the community St. Mary's Regional Health Center's board of directors is composed of volunteer representatives from the community it serves. St. Mary's Regional Health Center has an open Medical Staff, so any qualified physician of the community is allowed to apply. All applicants that apply must meet the credentialing standards and be approved by our governing board in order to come and provide services in our system. We participate in an annual Blood screening drive at the facility, and also take that service out to certain large businesses in town. We provide for numerous community education events through our speaker's bureau on various health topics. We reinvest in the organization by acquiring the latest state of the art equipment and by investing in programs that are needed in our community including same-day walk-in clinic, Hospitalist program, chemotherapy, a new Urology service, mental health services, and a pain clinic service. St. Mary's Regional Health Center community health improvement services provide support and education in the community. Some examples are. Breastfeeding support group facilitation/planning, childbirth education classes, health fair, infant massage, nursing student clinicals and student interns. In addition, we support a community kid's summer bike ride. We partner with our local community center and encourage exercise thru biking by inviting kids to bike a designated path/distance. Our funding of this keeps the cost minimal for those participating. We also partner with the local community center to provide a diabetes camp for teens. The camp not only provides fun and education for teens, it also educates parents on their child's diabetes. This past year, we participated in a Women's Expo where we offered a bone scan for free to participants. If the results warranted, attendees were encouraged to follow up with their primary care provider for further testing. St. Mary's Regional Health Center is part of a larger system, Essentia Health. As a non-profit organization, Essentia Health is focused on reinvesting surplus revenues into programs and technology that improve patient care. One of the most significant investments has been in the area of electronic health records, which are being rolled out across the health system's network of hospitals and clinics. The majority of Essentia hospitals and clinics will be linked via one central EHR by the end of 2011, thanks in part to significant investments made in 2010. We also continue to replace and upgrade technology, ranging from CT scanners to robotic surgery devices that ensure patients in our predominantly rural communities have access to these needed services in their home communities. We are also investing in the development of medical homes, which are designed to improve health outcomes for patients, particularly those with chronic diseases. Much of this work is currently not reimbursed by state or federal programs, so Essentia Health assumes responsibility for medical home costs. Essentia also supports the health of our communities through active research and clinical trials through the Essentia Institute of Rural Health Various Essentia Health organizations contributed almost \$1 5 million in support to the Institute over the past year. The Institute conducts clinical, translational and health services research with a primary focus on the needs of rural Americans

If the organization is part of an affiliated health care system, describe the respective roles of the organization and its affiliates in promoting the health of the communities served St. Mary's Regional Health Center is part of Essentia Health, an integrated health system of 17 hospitals, over 60 clinics and several long-term care facilities in four states Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota and Idaho The health system serves a predominantly rural population whose median incomes generally fall below averages of the states where they live. The presence of our clinics and hospitals ensures that people with few economic resources don't have to drive an hour or more to receive basic (and in some cases live-saving) medical care. In addition to staffing hospitals and clinics in federally-recognized underserved areas, we support the health of our communities through an active outreach program that brings specialists like oncologists, cardiologists, neurologists and others into our smaller communities. This eliminates barriers to care for many patients, particularly those who are elderly, living on low incomes, or are faced with other challenges that make it difficult to travel long distances for care. Our size and integrated structure allow us to offer patients services often found only in larger urban settings. Services ranging from chemotherapy and cancer clinical trials to congestive heart failure management and hospice are available to patients in many of the rural communities we serve Essentia Health also supports the health of our communities through active research and clinical trials, through the Essentia Institute of Rural Health The Institute conducts clinical, translational and health services research with a primary focus on the needs of rural Americans Essentia Health is also serving patients through the aggressive implementation of the Epic electronic health record (EHR) A Iready in use in a number of Essentia Health's rural clinics and some hospitals, a fully-integrated EHR is scheduled to connect patients across the Essentia service region by 2012 A common electronic health record allows health professionals to share test results and consult with colleagues in real time across great distances. Medical information is no longer lost in the shuffle of paper records - an important consideration in a region where patients must often be transferred to a larger Essentia facility for complex surgeries or medical care Essentia is also actively working with government agencies and insurers to develop innovative, cost-effective approaches to care that will improve health outcomes while reducing overall costs to patients and insurers. This innovation can be found in our use of remote home monitors for patients with congestive heart failure to a focus on using a team-based approach to helping patients manage chronic diseases Essentia Health is committed to helping patients and their families lead active and fulfilling lives in the small and large communities where they live. We hope to become a model of health care delivery, particularly in rural areas, in the years to come
