Points are then deducted based on the dollar amount of medical bills a patient owes. From there, the total points are calculated and used to determine the percentage of financial assistance that gets deducted from the patient's medical bill within our health center. If a patient falls below the FPG, it generates a 100% write-off under the charity care policy.
