**CHAPTER I
CONSTITUTION**

Preamble

Children are our most enduring and vulnerable legacy. For nations as well as for individual families, they represent the link between past and future, between experience and promise. The nurturing of future generations is a basic and most important human activity.

The Iowa Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics is dedicated to the principle of a meaningful and healthy life for every child. As an organization of physicians who care for infants, children, adolescents, and young adults, the Chapter seeks to promote this goal by encouraging and assisting its members in their efforts to meet the overall health needs of children and youth, by providing support and counsel to others concerned with the well-being of children, their growth and development, and by serving as an advocate for children and their families within the community at large.

The Chapter believes in the attainment by all infants, children, adolescents, and young adults of their full potential for physical, mental, emotional, and social health. Together with those who share this purpose, the Chapter pledges its efforts and expertise to a fundamental goal—that all children and youth have the opportunity to grow up safe and strong, with faith in the future and in themselves.

Article I

Name and Office

Section 1. Name. The name of the organization shall be the Iowa Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Section 2. Office. The principal office of the Chapter shall be at such location within or without the State of Iowa as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Chapter may have such other offices as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

Article II

Incorporation

Section 1. State of Incorporation. The Chapter is incorporated under the laws of the State of Iowa. It shall have the structure, powers, and functions of a not-for-profit corporation as delineated under these laws.

Section 2. Management. The general management of the Chapter shall be vested in its Board of Directors.

Article III

Rules

The following rules shall conclusively bind the Chapter and all persons acting for or in behalf of it:

1. No part of the net earnings of the Chapter shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Chapter shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payment and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein. No substantial part of the activities of the Chapter shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Chapter shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these bylaws, the Chapter shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Chapter exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a Chapter, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
2. Upon the dissolution of the Chapter, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the Chapter, dispose of all the assets of the Chapter exclusively for the purposes of the Chapter in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the appropriate court of the county in which the principal office of the Chapter is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
3. The Chapter shall conduct business adhering to the highest ethical standards, without personal bias.

Article IV

Goals and Purposes

The Chapter shall pursue specific scientific, charitable and educational objectives through the conduct of activities directed toward establishing and maintaining the highest quality in the delivery of health care to infants, children, adolescents, and young adults, and toward the stimulation of advances in the preventive aspects of health care in such areas as control of disease and disability, environmental hazards, accident prevention, nutrition, mental and emotional health, and child abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

CHAPTER II BYLAWS

Article I *Membership*

Section 1. Duties of Membership. It shall be the duty of each member of the Chapter to keep on file with the Chapter Office an official address to which all notices required by the bylaws and other communications of the Chapter may be sent. The mailing of a notice to this address shall be the extent of the Chapter's responsibility.

Section 2. Fees, Dues, and Assessments. All members of the Chapter shall pay initiation fees, annual dues, and special assessments as may be determined by the Board of Directors. Dues become payable on the first day of the fiscal year.

Section 3. Voting Rights.

All members designated by the AAP as Fellowship, Candidate, or Specialty members may offer a single vote on any issue brought to the membership for a vote. All members in other membership categories shall not have voting rights.

Section 4. Membership Categories.

A. Members of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Any existing member of the American Academy of Pediatrics (the "Academy") who resides in the state of Iowa, may become a member of the Chapter upon submission of an application to the Chapter in the form and containing the information required by the Chapter and payment of the requisite Chapter initiation fees and/or dues.

B. Categories of Membership. The Chapter shall have the following categories of membership:

Fellow: Currently active Fellows of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Candidate: Candidate fellows in the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Specialty: Those physicians who are certified by their proper Specialty Board and who devote the majority of their practice to the care of children and are Specialty Fellows of the AAP.

Affiliate: Physicians who are not currently members of the American Academy of Pediatrics. They must be engaged in private practice, teaching, research or public health relating to children. Affiliate membership also includes pediatric nurse practitioners, neonatal nurse practitioners, physician assistants and pediatric dentists who are certified by their specialty boards and are engaged primarily in patient care, teaching, research or public health relating to children.

Honorary: Honorary membership may be extended to those physicians who have distinguished themselves in the field of pediatrics and have contributed substantially to the care of children in Iowa, but who have retired from active membership in this organization.

Resident: Resident fellows of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Student: Medical students interested in the field of pediatrics.

C. Application Procedures for Other Categories of Membership. Requests for affiliate, honorary, specialty, resident or student membership may be made by or for a qualified individual and shall be directed to the Executive Committee for their review and approval. If approved by the Executive Committee, their names will be submitted for vote to the Chapter membership at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Chapter. A simple majority vote of the membership in attendance is required for approval. Successful candidates in any membership category shall be notified immediately after their election. Official recognition of all new members shall be made at each regularly scheduled Chapter meeting.

D. Membership Privileges. All members of the Chapter may attend Chapter meetings, have the right to be listed as members in the membership directory, may serve on committees, and may have voting privileges as decided by the committee chair.

Fellows may vote and hold offices in the Chapter.

Affiliate members may not vote or hold office.

Candidate members may vote and hold office except for those of President and Vice President.

Honorary members may not vote or hold office.

Specialty members may vote and hold office.

Resident members may not vote or hold office, except for appointment to the Board of Directors in a non-voting capacity by the Chapter President.

Student members may not vote or hold office.

Section 5. Termination of Membership.

A. Resignation. Any member may resign by filing a written resignation with the Secretary of the Chapter.

B. Termination after Notice and Hearing. The Board of Directors may terminate a member for good cause shown after providing the member with notice of the proposed action and an opportunity to appear in person and be heard by the Board of Directors, with representation by legal counsel if the member desires. The notice shall delineate the cause for the termination.

C. Delinquency. A member who fails to pay dues or any other assessment or fees owing the Chapter shall be considered delinquent and shall be denied the privileges of the membership if payment of the past dues amount is not made within six months following the

date on which the amount was required to be paid. The privileges of membership shall be restored upon payment in full of the past due amount.

Section 6. Annual Meeting. An annual meeting of the members shall be held during the month of October or at such other time as the Board of Directors may determine, for the purpose of transacting such business as may come before the meeting. At the annual meeting, the President shall make a report of the Chapter of the preceding year and the Treasurer shall make a report of the financial condition of the Chapter.

Section 7. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the members may be called either by the President, the Board of Directors or by at least five percent of the members having voting rights.

Section 8. Place of Meetings. The Board of Directors may designate any place, either within or without the state of Iowa, as the place of meeting for any annual or special meeting of members.

Section 9. Notice of Meetings. Unless otherwise required by statute, written or printed notice stating the place, day and hour of any meeting of members shall be delivered, either personally, by mail, fax, e-mail or any other standard communication medium, to each member entitled to vote at such meeting, not less than five nor more than sixty days before the date of such meeting, or by at the direction of the President, or the Secretary, or the other persons calling the meeting. In the case of a special meeting or when required by statute or by these bylaws, the purpose for which the meeting is called shall be stated in the notice. If mailed, the notice of a meeting shall be deemed delivered on the day after the date on which it is deposited in the United States mail addressed to the member at his or her address as it appears on the records of the Chapter, with postage thereon paid.

Section 10. Quorum and Manner of Acting. A quorum will be declared by the presiding officer at the time of meeting commencement without regard to the number of members present if due notification has been given. The affirmative vote of the majority of votes present and voted, either in person or by proxy, shall be the act of the members, unless the vote of a greater number is required by law, the articles of incorporation, or these bylaws. All meetings of the Chapter shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order, Revised.

Section 11. Proxies. At any meeting of members, a member entitled to vote may vote either in person or by proxy executed in writing by the member or by his or her duly authorized attorney-in-fact. No proxy shall be valid after eleven months from the date of its execution unless otherwise provided in the proxy.

Article II

Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Chapter shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. Officers shall serve for a term of two years, except for Treasurer who will serve for a term of 3 years, and until their successors shall have been elected and have qualified.

- A. President. The President must be a Fellow or Specialty Fellow of the Academy, shall be the principal executive officer of the Chapter, shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board of Directors, shall be the Chairman of the Board and shall be an ex-officio, nonvoting member of all the Chapter committees. The President may sign, with the Secretary or any other proper officer of the Chapter authorized by the Board of Directors, any deeds, mortgages, contracts, or other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these bylaws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the Chapter. The President shall have the following specific duties:
1. To uphold the Constitution and Bylaws of the Academy at the Chapter level;
 2. To promote Chapter activities and to organize and conduct appropriate meetings and committee projects;
 3. To represent the Chapter at District and National Academy meetings, including the Annual Chapter Forum;
 4. To be responsible for good communication and liaison between the Chapter constituency and the Academy's Board of Directors;
 5. To file an annual report with the District Chairperson, Alternate District Chairperson, and the Academy Central Office by July 1st of each year;
 6. To submit a report to the Chapter at its annual meeting;
 7. To have and keep up-to-date functional bylaws;
 8. To perform such other duties as may be described elsewhere in the Academy bylaws or as may be determined by the Academy's Board of Directors; and;
 9. To perform all other activities incident to the office of President that are consistent with the Academy's Bylaws, constitution, or policies and that are not prohibited by the state or federal law.
- B. Vice President. The Vice President must be a Fellow or Specialty Fellow of the Academy. In absence of the President or in the event of the President's inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall assist the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The Vice President shall assist the President in performance of the President's duties and shall perform such other duties and functions as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President, the Chapter Board of Directors or the National Academy Board of Directors.
- C. Secretary. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose, shall see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by law, shall be custodian of the corporate records, and shall in general perform all duties incident to the office of the secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President, by the Chapter Board of Directors or by the Academy Board of Directors.
- D. Treasurer. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his or her duties in such a sum and with such surety or sureties as the

Board of Directors shall determine. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Chapter, shall receive and give receipts for monies due and payable to the Chapter from any sources whatsoever, shall deposit all such monies in the name of the Chapter in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws, and shall in general perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President, by the Chapter Board of Directors or by the Academy Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall render a financial report at each meeting of the Executive Committee and to the members at the annual meeting.

Section 2. Nominations. Candidates for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, Trustees and any other Chapter officers to be elected by the members shall be nominated by the Chapter Nominating Committee or by petition. Notice of the election and request for nominations will be published in the Chapter Newsletter at least 60 days prior to mailing of the ballot.

A. Nominating Committee. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of four voting members of the Chapter. The members of the Nominating Committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors at any annual meeting of the Board in any year in which there are vacancies on the Nominating Committee occurring by reason of the expiration of a term or the resignation or their inability to serve as a Nominating Committee member. Members of the Nominating Committee may hold other Chapter offices while they are serving on the nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall screen and evaluate candidates and their qualifications at least 45 days in advance of the date on which the election ballots are mailed to the members. The Nominating Committee shall nominate at least one candidate for each office to be filled, except for the Vice Presidency, where two candidates shall be nominated.

B. Petitions. Petitions nominating candidates for the Chapter offices must have the signatures of at least five percent of voting members of the Chapter. Petitions must be received by the Chapter President and verified by the Nominating Committee at least 30 days prior to the date on which the election ballots are mailed to the members.

Section 3. Elections. The election of the officers and trustees shall be by ballot of the voting members of the Chapter by the end of the fiscal year a term of office expires. The Board of Directors shall designate the specific time for the elections and the Nominating Committee shall supervise the election process. Ballots shall be certified by the Secretary. If the Secretary is up for election, the Nominating Committee will assume that role. The candidate receiving a majority of the valid votes received by the Chapter Secretary within 30 days after the mailing of ballots shall be elected. If there are more than two candidates for a position and no candidate receives a majority of the valid votes, a runoff election between the two candidates receiving the most votes shall be conducted. Notice of the results of the elections shall be transmitted to the District officers of the Academy District in which the Chapter is located, to the Executive Director of the Academy, and to all voting members of the Chapter within 30 days after the results have been tabulated.

Section 3. Term of Office; Vacancies. Each officer shall serve for a term of two years, with the exception of the Treasurer who shall serve three years, and until his or her successor has been elected and qualified. In the event that a vacancy occurs in the office of President during the term, the Vice President shall serve as the President and a new Vice President shall be elected to fill the vacancy in the office of Vice President for the remainder of the term. Any vacancy in the offices of Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer or Trustee that occurs during a term shall also be filled by an election. Elections to fill vacancies occurring during the same term shall be conducted in the same manner as the regular annual elections and may be determined by the Nominating Committee. Nominations of one or more candidates to fill a vacancy shall be made by the Nominating Committee and may be made by petition in the manner set forth in Section 2 of this Article II. All officers may be elected to consecutive terms, although the Vice-President succeeds the President after the President has served the two-year term. Newly elected officers shall assume their duties at the beginning of the fiscal year immediately following the election.

Article III *Board of Directors*

Section 1. Membership. The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, three Trustees and the past President, as ex officio. The terms of the members of the Board of Directors shall be coterminous with their respective terms of office as President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Trustee.

Additionally, the Chapter President may appoint up to two (2) Resident or Fellow-in-Training members of the Chapter to a one-year term as a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. These appointments may be renewed at the discretion of the Chapter President.

Furthermore, the Chapter President may appoint up to two (2) Fellows, Candidate Fellows, or Specialty Fellows who are members of the Chapter to a one-year term as a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. These appointments shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the voting members of the Board of Directors. These appointments may be renewed at the discretion of the Chapter President, with re-confirmation by the Board of Directors for each new term of service.

Section 2. Duties and Responsibilities. The duties and responsibilities of the Board of Directors shall be those ordinarily performed by a board of directors of a nonprofit Chapter. These shall include but not be limited to the following:

1. To transact all business of the Chapter that is required to uphold the Constitution and carry out the mission of the organization;
2. To manage, control and conserve the real properties and monies of the Chapter;
3. To fix dues and assessments for members;
4. To adopt rules and regulations for membership in the Chapter in accordance with the bylaws and to act on membership applications;
5. To be responsible for and develop mechanisms to carry out planning and policy development for the Chapter;

6. To establish, monitor, and terminate, if indicated, Chapter organizational entities, including committees and editorial boards of publications, and to make appointments to such entities in accordance with these Bylaws;
7. To reflect and present official Chapter policy in public;
8. To have the authority to transact all business not otherwise provided for in these bylaws that may pertain to the Chapter;
9. To receive and study reports of committees and liaison representatives and implement necessary recommendations
10. To act for the Chapter between meetings;
11. To submit to the Chapter plans and policies for accomplishing its objectives and reports on its actions, and;
12. To promulgate such rules and regulations as the Board deems necessary to carry out the duties and intentions of these bylaws.

Section 3. Meetings of the Board of Directors. The President of the Chapter shall designate the time and place of the regular meetings of the Board of Directors. Notice of such meetings shall be given by the Chapter President at least fifteen days in advance of the meeting. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or upon written request of at least two other members of the Board. The purpose of a special meeting shall be stated in the notice. Notice of any special meeting to the Board of Directors shall be given at least 5 days prior thereto. Notice of regular and special meetings shall be in writing and shall be delivered either personally, by FAX, or by mail to each director. If sent by mail, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered on the day following the day, on which such notice is deposited in the United States mail addressed to the appropriate director, postage thereon prepaid. Any director may waive notice of any meeting.

Section 4. Quorum. A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum of the Board of Directors for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board; provided, that if less than a majority of directors is present at a meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting without further notice.

Section 5. Majority of Acting. The act of a majority of the members of the Board of Directors in attendance at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except where otherwise provided by law or these bylaws.

Section 6. Informal Action by Directors. Any action required to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors or any action which may be taken at a meeting of directors or a committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors and all of any non-director committee members entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof, or by all members of such committee, as the case may be.

Section 7. Compensation. Directors as such shall not receive any salaries for their services, but by resolution of the Board of Directors, a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the Board; provided,

that nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the Chapter in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.

Section 8. Attendance by Communications Equipment. Members of the Board of Directors or of any committee of the Board of Directors may participate in and act at any meeting of such Board or committee through the use of a conference telephone or other communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other. Such meetings shall constitute attendance and presence in person at the meeting of the person or persons so participating.

Article IV

Contracts, Checks, Deposits and Funds

Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize an officer or agent of the Chapter, in addition to the officers so authorized by these bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Chapter and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Chapter, shall be signed by such officers or agents of the Chapter and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence of a determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President or Vice President of the Chapter.

Section 3. Deposits. All funds of the Chapter shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Chapter in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

Section 4. Gifts. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the Chapter any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purpose or for any special purpose of the Chapter.

Article V

Books and Records

The Chapter shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall keep minutes of the proceedings of its members, Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors. The Chapter shall also keep a record of the names and addresses of its members entitled to vote.

Article VI

Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors. It is currently July 1 through June 30.

Article VII

Waiver of Notice

Whenever any notice whatsoever is required to be given under the provisions of the Chapter 504A Iowa Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1990 as amended, or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or these bylaws, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Article VIII

Amendments to Bylaws

These bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new bylaws may be adopted by a majority of the directors present at any regular meeting or at any special meeting at which a quorum is present; provided, that at least fifteen days written notice shall be given of any intention to alter, amend or repeal and adopt new bylaws at a meeting.

Article IX

Indemnification

The Chapter shall have the power to indemnify all officers and directors of the Chapter to the full extent permitted by the Chapter 504A Iowa Nonprofit Corporation Act of 1990 as amended, and shall be entitled to purchase insurance for such indemnification of officers and directors to the full extent as determined from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Chapter.
