When Catholic Health Initiatives ("CHI") (the ultimate parent organization to Saint Francis Medical Center Grand Island ("Saint Francis")) established its charity care policy it was determined that establishing a household income scale based on the HUD very low income guidelines more accurately reflects the socioeconomic dispersions among the 69 urban and rural communities in 19 states served by CHI hospitals and health care facilities. In comparing HUD guidelines to the Federal Poverty Guidelines ("FPG"), we find that on average HUD guidelines compute to approximately 200% to 250% (and sometimes 300%) of FPG. Saint Francis bases its charity care eligibility on 130% of the HUD Geographic Very-Low Income Guidelines. A sliding scale is used to determine the discount percentage up to a full discount of charges. An individual's income under the HUD guidelines is a significant factor in determining eligibility for charity care. However, in determining whether to extend discounted or free care to a patient, the patient's assets may also be taken into consideration. For example, a patient suffering a catastrophic illness may have a reasonable level of income, but a low level of liquid assets such that the payment of medical bills would be seriously detrimental to the patient's basic financial (and ultimately physical) well-being and survival. Such a patient may be extended discounted or free care based upon the facts and circumstances.

Saint Francis does not believe that any portion of bad debt expense could reasonably be attributed to patients who qualify for financial assistance since amounts due from those individuals' accounts will be reclassified from bad debt expense to charity care within 30 days following the date that the patient is determined to qualify for charity care Saint Francis does not issue separate company audited financial statements. However, the organization is included in the consolidated financial statements of Catholic Health Initiatives. The consolidated footnote reads as follows "The provision for bad debts is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in health care coverage, and other collection indicators. Management periodically assesses the adequacy of the allowances for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category. The results of these reviews are used to modify, as necessary, the provision for bad debts and to establish appropriate allowances for uncollectible net patient accounts receivable. After satisfaction of amounts due from insurance, CHI follows established guidelines for placing certain patient balances with collection agencies, subject to the terms of certain restrictions on collection efforts as determined by each facility "

Saint Francis Medical Center's debt collection policy provides that Saint Francis will perform a reasonable review of each inpatient account prior to turning an account over to a third-party collection agent and prior to instituting any legal action for non-payment, to assure that the patient and patient guarantor are not eligible for any assistance program (e.g. Medicaid) and do not qualify for coverage through Saint Francis' community assistance policy. After having been turned over to a third-party collection agent, any patient account that is subsequently determined to meet the Saint Francis community assistance policy is required to be returned immediately by the third-party collection agent to Saint Francis for appropriate follow-up. Saint Francis requires its third-party collection agents to include a message on all statements indicating that if a patient or patient guarantor meets certain stipulated income requirements, the patient or patient guarantor may be eligible for financial assistance. All of Catholic Health Initiatives' hospitals' contracts with third party collection agencies include the following standards. Neither CHI hospitals nor their collection agencies will seek liens that would require the sale or foreclosure of a primary residence, and - No Catholic Health Initiatives' collection agency may seek court action without hospital approval. Finally, collection agencies are trained on the Catholic Health Initiatives' Initiatives.

German, Norwegi an, Swedish and French, offering hope and healing to all, especially the poor Today, Sain t Francis Medical Center has grown into a regional healthcare facility providing specialty medical services and high-tech health treatment. At the same time, Saint Francis is faith fully committed to its mission of caring for all people in need, and working to improve the health of the people it serves and the community it calls home. The organization is still founded in a Catholic tradition, led by volunteer representatives of our local community and continues to provide care to all in need Saint Francis Medical Center operates a 24- hour emergency room, 365 days a year. That emergency room is open to all individuals regar dless of ability to pay Saint Francis Medical Center has an open medical staff, participa tes in Medicare and Medicaid, and has an active charity care program. Saint Francis proudly carries on a tradition of serving our community. Each year, our organization commits funding and the time and talent of our workforce to promote a healthy community. The programs and services described throughout this report not only serve the community, but also reduce the burdens on the government. For example, if Saint Francis Medical Center did not ser ve all people in need and provide charity care, the burden would likely fall on tax supported institutions. Saint Francis Medical Center is included in the Official Catholic Direct ory as a tax-exempt hospital COMMUNITY BENEFIT APPROACH Saint Francis Medical Center's Co mmunity Benefit Plan is based on our understanding of unique community needs derived from collaborative needs assessments, focus groups, and surveys conducted with our community partners. Representatives from Saint Francis work collaboratively on several community-based organizations to support local initiatives and partnerships while reducing duplication and making the best use of limited resources Additionally, Saint Francis defines health in the broadest sense and believes that everyone, from government, business and industry to sichools, churches and community organization have a role to play in improving community health. We believe that when everyone works together, everyone benefits from a healthy community PROCESS In 1995, Saint Francis Medical Center sponsored a Community Health Needs Asse ssment with the hospital's parent organization at the time, Sisters of Charity Health Care System, and in conjunction with several Hall County community partners representing city and county government, law enforcement, the justice system, Chamber of Commerce, education, healthcare, social services, and community action agencies. The specific goal of the project was to determine the health status of the community, to identify community needs and to bring together community organizations to develop programs to improve the collective community health. To develop a better understanding of the current health status of Hall County, state and county health statistics from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human S ervices were compiled and evaluated. In addition, 11 focused interviews were conducted with various groups of community leaders and citizens to specifically identify the following - Health and welfare needs in the community that have not been met, - Inadequate local he alth services, - Barriers to obtaining healthcare in the community, and - Population group s that may have difficulty accessing services. Saint Francis Medical Center has continued its involvement with community partners in assessing the health needs of the community and determining ways to continue to make healthy, positive changes for the betterment of Gran d Island and Hall County In 2000, working in conjunction with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, SFMC facilitated the co

mpletion of the Minority Behavioral Risk Factor Survey. This process consisted of 125 face -to-face interviews to complete a 100question survey, followed by Spanish-language focus groups with an additional 180 Hispanic residents. In December of 2004, Saint Francis Medic al Center began an effort to engage the community in a discussion on the issue of access to healthcare for all residents in Hall County One of the main benefits of this project has been to reaffirm our commitment to improving the health of our community through ensuring the most basic need - the ability to access needed healthcare services. In an effort to ensure that community benefit programs are meeting the needs as they were intended and are being managed in a cost-effective manner. Saint Francis Medical Center has been reviewing its sponsored programs through a discernment process. This process has involved review of the purpose of the programs, the people served, and performance metrics as well as a fres h look at the resources available in the community. The overarching goal has been to ensure limited resources are spent wisely, that partnerships are used instead of duplication of efforts, and that programs serve the people they were intended with measurable improvement in health. Saint Francis and Catholic Health Initiatives are currently planning for a new community needs assessment which is scheduled to be completed in FY 2011 Summary of Ass essment Findings Nine key health issues have been identified. The cost of healthcare and the lack of affordable healthcare resources in the community for those with low incomes. - Need for expansion of healthcare services for young mothers and children, especially sin gle mothers with limited means of support. - Development of more effective, more available and more affordable substance abuse programs with follow-up care, - Increased access to healthcare, especially for minorities and those of low income, - Expanded information and c ommunication about health and social services currently available, - Development of expand ed, local mental health treatment services, including inpatient care, - Development of sup ervised living facility for low- to moderate-income elderly citizens, - Expanded education and information on health, wellness and disease prevention, and - Development of cardiac treatment and rehabilitation services in the community Based on information from baseline data, focus group interviews and personal perspective, the partners prioritized the top t hree healthcare needs for Hall County to be substance abuse, access to healthcare services and intentional injury. The community partners also announced the findings and priorities to the general public, then divided up into three groups each focusing attention and dev eloping action plans for a specific area of emphasis. Assessment findings and organization al priorities are shared within Saint Francis with the Board of Directors, the Continuing Medical Education Committee of the Saint Francis Medical Staff, and the Saint Francis mana gement team for use in developing goals and objectives in the organization's strategic pla nning process. Specifically, Action planning and implementation have continued to produce healthy community initiatives such as the Student Wellness Center, and the Parish Nurse Pr ogram. An emphasis on addressing access issues has led to collaboration with the Third City Community Clinic, a free clinic. Saint Francis supports this clinic with equipment donat ions and collaborated to provide dental services QUALITATIVE DESCRIPTION OF COMMUNITY BEN EFIT Subsidized Health Services Saint Francis funds health services that provide an import ant community need yet cannot sustain themselves financially. In fiscal year 2010, Saint Francis Medical Center's subsidized programs included a student wellness clinic, a primary care clinic, psychiatric care at the Grand Island Specialty Clinic, and prenatal educational classes. If the organization is part of an affiliated health care system, describe the respective roles of the organization and its affiliates in promoting the health of the communities served Saint Francis Medical Center, along with its affiliated outpatient facilities are part of Catholic Health Initiatives Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI) is a national faith-based nonprofit health care organization with headquarters in Englewood, Colorado CHI's exempt purpose is to serve as an integral part of its national system of hospitals and other charitable entities, which are described as market-based organizations, or MBOs. An MBO is a direct provider of care or services within a defined market area that may be an integrated health system and/or a stand-alone hospital or other facility or service provider. CHI serves as the parent corporation of its MBOs which are comprised of 73 hospitals, 40 long-term care, assisted- and residential-living facilities, and two community healthservices organizations. Together, these facilities provided \$590 million in charity care and community benefit in the 2010 fiscal year, including services for the poor, free clinics, education and research. CHI provides strategic planning and management services as well as centralized "shared services" for the MBOs. The provision of centralized management and shared services – including areas such as accounting, human resources, payroll and supply chain -- provides economies of scale and purchasing power to the MBOs Cost savings associated with centralized services for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010 include more than \$105 million in supply chain expense, approximately \$30 million for insurance costs and more than \$3.9 million as the result of a system-wide effort to coordinate and negotiate technology and equipment purchases. The cost sayings achieved through CHI's centralization enable MBOs to dedicate additional resources to high-quality health care and community outreach services to the most vulnerable members of our society. SFMC received a Mission & Ministry grant from CHI With these funds, SFMC was able to help establish a free dental clinic, the violence initiative, and Palliative Care for the community Saint Francis Medical Center operates with its wholly owned affiliates and community partners, along with its fundraising arm, the Saint Francis Medical Center Foundation, to serve the health care needs of the Grand Island, NE communities
