When Catholic Health Initiatives (the ultimate parent organization to Good Samaritan Hospital) established its charity care policy it was determined that establishing a household income scale based on the HUD very low income guidelines more accurately reflects the socioeconomic dispersions among the 69 urban and rural communities in 19 states served by CHI hospitals and health care facilities. In comparing HUD guidelines to the Federal Poverty Guidelines ("FPG"), we find that on average HUD guidelines compute to approximately 200% to 250% (and sometimes 300%) of FPG. Eligibility for charity care discounts shall be determined based on 130% of the annually updated HUD Geographic Very-Low Income Guidelines for the applicant's county of residence, referenced later in this document, available assets and any extenuating circumstances. Thus, the standards of eligibility for the application of charity discounts must consider assets, as well as income. In addition, the need for future services requiring financial assistance shall be assessed. Separate determinations of eligibility for charity care discounts shall be made for each date of service. Confirmation of continued eligibility shall be updated every 90 days for patients who require ongoing health care services. An individual's occupation may be indicative of eligibility for a charity care discount. Examples of low-paying jobs might include Day laborer, Farm worker, Migrant worker and Food service associate.

The provision for bad debts is based upon management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering historical business and economic conditions, trends in healthcare coverage, and other collection indicators. Management periodically assesses the adequacy of the allowances for uncollectible accounts based upon historical write-off experience by payor category. The results of these reviews are used to modify as necessary the provision for bad debts and to establish appropriate allowances for uncollectible net patient accounts receivable. Good Samaritan Hospital believes that excluding Medicare losses from community benefit makes the overall community benefit report more credible for these reasons. Unlike subsidized areas such as burn units or behavioral-health services. Medicare is not a differentiating feature of tax-exempt health care organizations. In fact, for-profit hospitals focus on attracting patients with Medicare coverage, especially in the case of well-paid services that include cardiac and orthopedics. Significant effort and resources are devoted to ensuring that hospitals are reimbursed appropriately by the Medicare program. The Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC), an independent Congressional agency, carefully studies Medicare payment and the access to care that Medicare beneficiaries receive. The commission recommends payment adjustments to Congress accordingly Though Medicare losses are not included by Catholic hospitals as community benefit, the Catholic Health Association quidelines allow hospitals to count as community benefit some programs that specifically serve the Medicare population For instance, if hospitals operate programs for patients with Medicare benefits that respond to identified community needs, generate losses for the hospital, and meet other criteria, these programs can be included in the CHA framework in Category C as "subsidized health services " Medicare losses are different from Medicaid losses, which are counted in the CHA community benefit framework, because Medicaid reimbursements generally do not receive the level of attention paid to Medicare reimbursement. Medicaid payment is largely driven by what states can afford to pay, and is typically substantially less than what Medicare pays

Generally, a bill must be generated and recorded and the patient must meet the organization's criteria for charity care and demonstrate an inability to pay. Charity care is reported in terms of costs, not charges. Charity care does not include bad debt. Good Samaritan Hospital provides a significant level of free care each year. In Fiscal Year 2010, the cost of charity care provided was \$6.1 million. Government-Spons ored Health Care Government-sponsored health care community benefit includes unpaid costs of public programs, the "shortfall" created when a

facility receives payments that are less than costs for caring for public program benefic iaries. This "payment shortfall" is not the same as a contractual allowance, which is the full difference between charges and government payments. It does not include any shortfall that results from inefficiency or poor management. Good Samaritan Hospital incurred \$8.1 million in unreimbursed costs for services provided to Medicaid patients and \$2.2.3 million in unreimbursed costs for services provided to Medicare patients. Medicaid patients represented approximately 15.3 percent of the patients served by Good Samaritan Hospital in Fis cal Year 2010 and Medicare patients represented approximately 45.1 percent of the patients served. Frequently, the cost of providing services to Medicare and Medicaid patients is greater than the payment Good Samaritan Hospital receives from the government.

Good Samaritan Hospital posts signage in English in admissions areas, the emergency department and other appropriate areas advising patients of the availability of financial assistance. Staff members will communicate the content of the signs to people who appear to be unable to read English. Sharing information about charity care is differentiated into two scenarios - one for an emergency patient and another for a non-emergency patient scheduling an admission or other procedure. Scenario - emergency patient. (i) Patients receiving emergency services shall be treated in accordance with Good Samaritan Hospital's emergency services policies, developed in accordance with EMTALA and other requirements (II) Good Samaritan Hospital engages in reasonable registration processes for individuals requiring examination or treatment -Reasonable registration processes shall include asking whether an individual is insured and, if so, the name of the insurance program utilized, if such inquiry does not delay screening or treatment - Reasonable registration processes shall not unduly discourage patients from remaining for further evaluation. Therefore, discussions regarding financial issues shall be deferred until after the patient has been screened and necessary stabilizing treatment has been initiated. Once EMTALA requirements are met, patients identified through the registration process as being without Medicare/Medicaid, other local health care financial assistance or adequate health insurance, will receive a packet of information that addresses the financial assistance policy and procedures, including an application. In the event that a patient does not receive the packet of information at the time of service, the packet will be mailed to the patient within ten days of the date of service to ensure that all self-pay patients are informed of financial assistance availability in a timely manner. Compliance is monitored through a Meditech NPR report Scenario – non-emergency patient scheduling an admission or other procedure (i) Patients without Medicare/Medicaid, other local health care financial assistance or adequate health insurance shall be mailed a packet of information that addresses the financial assistance policy and procedures, including an application within ten days of the date of service. This will ensure that all self-pay patients are informed of financial assistance availability in a timely manner. Compliance is monitored through a Meditech NPR report. Under either scenario, the Financial Assistance Application and accompanying instructions clearly indicate that Good Samaritan Hospital provides care, without regard to ability to pay, to individuals with limited financial resources, and explains how patients can apply for financial assistance. Community Health Access Team (CHAT) The Community Health Access Team is a team of individuals representing 14 different organizations and agencies whose mission is Everyone with a point of entry to service in Buffalo County will have access to, regularly use, and be satisfied with comprehensive, cost effective, high quality, primary health services that support optimal quality of life CHAT's goal is to reach 100 percent access to primary healthcare services for all with zero racial and ethnic disparity. Differences between people, such as culture, class, educational attainment, employment status and ability to pay, will no longer be associated with differential health outcomes CHAT's primary target group is the uninsured and underinsured and their desired outcome is to create a new model to reach 100 percent health access and zero health disparities. Medication Access Program Sentinel Health Care's Medication Access Program assists patients in obtaining low-cost or no-cost medications from pharmaceutical companies. For the 2010 fiscal year, the program saved participating patients over \$2 4 million in prescription drug costs by providing aid in obtaining more than 1,900 new prescriptions and 2,900 refills. The program provided assistance to approximately 2,500 patients. Project Snowflake As a mission outreach initiative, Good Samaritan Hospital coordinates a special Christmas giving activity each year. In fiscal year 2010 employees donated money, food, clothing, toys, and other items to needy families at an estimated value of \$4,800. Healthier Community" initiative began in 1995, when Good Samaritan Hospital convened a group of 25 organizations to conduct a county-wide health assessment Today, Good Samaritan Hospital is one of 25 organizations represented on the Partners Board of Directors The vision of the Partners is that "everyone from all corners of Buffalo County work together to improve the quality of life of those who live in and work in this community." In so doing, our community focuses its time and resources on the things we value as a community, including 1) A Strong Sense of Community, 2) Nature and the Environment, 3) Well Body, Mind and Spirit and 4) The Economy In 2000 and 2001, the Partners conducted a county-wide health re-assessment. From that assessment, 10 new priority health goals were released to the community at the fifth Healthier Buffalo County Summit in April 2002. The new priority health goals for attainment by 2010 relate to Lead Levels in Children, Air Ouality (environmental tobacco smoke), Access to Health Care, Safety (Vehicle restraint use and fall prevention- older adults). Stress on the Family Unit, Reduce Obesity and Overweight, Health and Spirituality, Infant Mortality, Affordable Housing and Transportation As of December 2009, the Partners have awarded \$516,000 to the community in the form of simple and project grant awards to assist in priority health goal attainment and collaboration building During FY 2009/2010 Community Partners launched a re-assessment process to determine the number of 2010 goals attained and work to release 2020 goals in the spring of 2011 Building a Healthy Community Celebration 2010 Good Samaritan Hospital, in conjunction with the Kearney Park and Recreation department, organized the 15th Annual Community Olympic Games, in which approximately 650 people participated. The games are designed to promote a healthy lifestyle, community spirit, teamwork, socialization and fun. An MBO is a direct provider of care or services within a defined market area that may be an integrated health system and/or a stand-alone hospital or other facility or service provider. CHI serves as the parent corporation of its MBOs which are comprised of 73 hospitals, 40 long-term care, assisted- and residential-living facilities, and two community healthservices organizations. Together, these facilities provided \$590 million in charity care and community benefit in the 2010 fiscal year, including services for the poor, free clinics, education and research. CHI provides strategic planning and management services as well as centralized "shared services" for the MBOs. The provision of centralized management and shared services – including areas such as accounting, human resources, payroll and supply chain -- provides economies of scale and purchasing power to the MBOs Cost savings associated with centralized services for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010 include more than \$105 million in supply chain expense, approximately \$30 million for insurance costs and more than \$10 million as the result of a system-wide effort to coordinate and negotiate technology and equipment purchases. The cost sayings achieved through CHI's centralization enable MBOs to dedicate additional resources to high-quality health care and community outreach services to the most vulnerable members of our society. Good Samaritan Hospital operates with its wholly owned affiliates and community partners, along with its fundraising arm, the Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation, to serve the health care needs of the Kearney, NE communities
